

## EXPLANATORY

Attach ' bill seeks to declare November five of every year a non-working special public holiday in the Province of Negros Occidental to commemorate the liberation of the province.

Recorded history of the province attests that Negros Occidental gained her independence from Spain when the Filipino revolutionary forces under the leadership of three generals namely, Anecito Lacson, Juan Araneta and Rafael Ramos on November 5, 1898.

On that fateful day the Filipino revolutionaries fought the Spanish troops in the town of Talisay and Bago, causing the death of many patriots. It also brought about the triumph and freedom for the people of the province. It was a significant contribution to the collective national struggle for independence from Spain. And yet the painful fact remains that the three Filipino Generals and the hundreds of Filipino revolutionaries who fought with them so valiantly were never given and who fought with them so valiantly were never given an honor or national recognition. Justice and equity dictates that these heroes struggle for freedom be accorded its rightful place in hostory by declaring November five of each year a non-working special public holiday in Negros Occidental. In so doing, we shall be able to inculcate in our people the values of patriotism and nationalism in concrete terms, by commemorating the glorious heritage of history, from which every living Filipino can draw s sense of hope, pride and triumph.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly recommended.
