AN ACT PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO FILIPINO INVEN-TORS IN THE COUNTRY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. All inventors in the Philippines shall be af-
2	forded the following incentives by the Government, namely:
3	(a) Cash Rewards – Presidential awards for inventions
4	consisting of cash rewards shall be granted to patented inven-
5	tions in the Philippines to be chosen by a screening committee
6	with members consisting of technical representatives from the
7	Department of Science and Technology, the Filipino Inventors
8	Society, the Department of Trade and Industry, the Department

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of Agriculture, and the Department of Environment and Natu ral Resources.

Outstanding inventors shall be divided into four (4) categories with the corresponding cash rewards as follows:
(1) Inventions. (i) First prize, One hundred thousand
pesos (P100,000.00); (ii) Second prize, Fifty thousand
pesos (P50,000.00); and (iii) Third prize, Twenty thousand
pesos (P20,000.00).

9 (2) Utility Models. (i) First prize, Fifty thousand
10 pesos (₱50,000.00); (ii) Second prize, Twenty thousand
11 pesos (₱20,000.00); and (iii) Third prize, Ten thousand pesos
12 (₱10,000.00).

13 (3) Industrial Design. (i) First prize, Fifty thousand
14 pesos (P50,000.00); (ii) Second prize, Twenty thousand
15 pesos (P20,000.00); and (iii) Third prize, Ten thousand pesos
16 (P10,000.00).

17 (4) Creative Research. (i) First prize, Twenty thousand
18 pesos (\$20,000.00); (ii) Second prize, Ten thousand pesos
19 (\$10,000.00); and (iii) Third prize, Five thousand pesos
20 (\$5,000.00).

21 A round trip ticket fare in addition to necessary and rea-

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sonable expenses but not more than Three hundred pesos
 (P300.00) a day shall be provided to all provincial awardees.
 Upon recommendation of the Screening Committee all winners
 may be sent by the Philippine Government to other countries
 where their winning inventions or areas of interest are ad vanced.

Tax Incentives - Inventors, as certified by the 7 (b) Filipino Inventors Society and duly confirmed by the Screen-8 ing Committee, shall be exempt from payment of license 9 fees, permit fees and other business taxes in the development 10 11 of their particular inventions and from income taxes on the 12 invention for the first five (5) years. This is an exception to the taxing power of the local government units. The cer-13 14 tification shall state that the manufacture of the invention 15 is made on a commercial scale.

16 (c) Financial and Loan Assistance – Loan assistance for 17 the commercial production of an invention, either locally or for 18 export and duly certified by the Filipino Inventors Society and 19 by the Screening Committee, shall be mandatorily extended by 20 all government banks: *Provided*, That said invention meets the 21 criteria that would enhance the economy of the country such

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1 as profitability and viability, dollar-earning capacity, and generation of employment opportunities for Filipinos. Said loan shall 2 3 be in the maximum amount of Two hundred thousand pesos (P200,000.00) without need of real estate collateral. 4 An assignment of rights to the invention, however, shall be 5 executed in favor of the bank or financing institution subject 6 to other lending terms, conditions and availability of loan-7 able funds by the bank. 8

No limit to the amount of loan applied for shall be granted 9 to the inventor who can provide fifteen percentum (15%) equity 10 of the loan applied for: *Provided*, That acceptable collaterals 11 can be presented to fully secure his loan. However, when there 12 13 is an existing foreign irrevocable letter of credit issued in favor of the inventor or the duly registered company producing his 14 15 invention for export, all government banks, after verification of the commercial production and availability of such products 16 17 covered by the letter of credit shall grant up to eighty percentum 18 (80%) of the peso value of the foreign letter of credit: Provided, 19 That the inventor or the manufacturing company assigns the 20 letter of credit to the bank where the loan is arranged and 21 whatever goods that the inventor or his company will produce,

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or warehouse receipts, if any, to show evidence that goods have
 been partially produced.

3 SEC. 2. All government agencies concerned are required to 4 extend all possible assistance, such as the use of its facilities in 5 the preparation of project feasibility studies and evaluation of 6 inventions and products to be produced by any inventor, in 7 order to facilitate the granting of loans or financial assistance by 8 any government bank.

SEC. 3. For the effective implementation of this Act, the 9 Invention Guarantee Fund (IGF) created by Republic Act No. 10 11 3850, as amended, in the initial amount of Ten million pesos (P10.000,000.00) and deposited with the Development Bank of 12 13 the Philippines shall be made available to finance and guarantee 14 the loan assistance of any patented Filipino invention duly certified by the Filipino Inventors Society and by the Screening 15 Committee. The interest earnings thereof shall form part of the 16 Fund. A continuing annual appropriation in the amount of Ten 17 18 million pesos (P10,000,000.00) shall be provided for this purpose in the national budget of the Department of Science and 19 20 Technology.

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The Fund shall likewise pay for the cash rewards and

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other incentives to outstanding inventors as provided for in
 Section 1(a) of this Act.

3 SEC. 4. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders,
4 rules or regulations, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent
5 with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
6 SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. Approved,

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
