INTRODUCED BY SENATOR ANGARA

AN ACT TO MAXIMIZE THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE ELDERLY TO NATION BUILDING, GRANT BENEFITS AND SPECIAL PRIVILEGES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Declaration of Policies and Objectives. - Pursuant 2 to Article XV, Section 4 of the Constitution, it is the duty of the family 3 to take care of its elderly members while the State may design programs 4 of social security for them. In addition to this, Section 10 in the 5 Declaration of Principles and State Policies provides: "The State shall 6 provide social justice in all phases of national development". 7 Further, Article XIII, Section 11 provides: "The State shall adopt an 8 integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which 9 shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services 10 available to all the people at affordable cost. There shall be priority 11 for the needs of the underprivileged, sick, elderly, disabled, women 12 and children." Consonant with these Constitutional principles the 13 following are the declared policies of this Act:

1	a) to motivate and encourage the elderly to contribute to nation
2	building;
3	b) to encourage their families and the communities they live with
4	to reaffirm the valued Filipino tradition of caring for the elderly;
5	In accordance with these policies, this Act aims to:
6	1) establish mechanisms whereby the contribution of the elderly
7	are maximized;
8	adopt measures whereby our elderly are assisted and appreci-
9	ated by the community as a whole;
10	3) establish a program beneficial to the elderly, their families
11	and the rest of the community that they serve.
12	SEC. 2. Definition of Terms As used in this Act, the term
13	"elderly" shall mean any resident citizen of the Philippines at least 60
14	years old, including those who have retired from both government
15	offices and private enterprises.
16	The term "benefactor" shall mean any person whether related to
17	the elderly or not who takes care of him/her as a dependent.
18	The term "head of the family" shall mean any person so defined
19	in the National Internal Revenue Code.
20	SEC. 3. Contribution to the Community Any qualified elderly
21	as determined by the Office for Elderly Affairs (OEA), may render his/
22	her services to the community which shall consist of, but not limited to,
23	any of the following:
24	a) tutorial and/or consultancy services;
25	b) actual teaching and demonstration of hobbies and income-

- 2 c) lectures on specialized fields like agriculture, health, environ-3 mental protection and the like;
- 4 d) the transfer of new skills acquired by virtue of their training 5 mentioned in Section 4, paragraph (e);
- e) undertaking other appropriate services as determined by 6 the Office for Elderly Affairs (OEA) such as school traffic guide, tourist 7 8 aid, pre-school assistant, etc.

In consideration of the services rendered by the qualified elderly, the Office for Elderly Affairs (OEA) may award or grant benefits or privileges to the elderly, in addition to the other privileges provided for under Section 4 hereof.

- 13 SEC. 4. Privileges for the Elderly. - The elderly shall be entitled 14 to the following:
 - a) the grant of fifty percent (50%) discount from government establishments relative to utilization of transportation services, hotels and similar lodging establishments, restaurants and recreation centers and purchase of medicine anywhere in the country;
- 19 b) the grant of thirty percent (30%) discount on the payment of 20 electric, water and telephone bills to the elderly who are heads of the 21 family;
- c) the exemption from the payment of parking fees and their provision of specifically designated spaces in parking areas anywhere in 24 . the country:
 - d) exemption from the payment of individual income taxes,

1 provided that, their annual taxable income does not exceed the poverty 2 level as determined by the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) for that year; 3 4 e) exemption from training fees for socioeconomic programs 5 undertaken by the OEA as part of its work: 6 f) free medical and dental services in government establishments 7 anywhere in the country, subject to guidelines to be issued by the 8 Department of Health, the Government Service Insurance System and 9 the Social Security System: 10 g) the continuance of the same benefits and privileges given 11 by the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), Social Security 12 System (SSS) and PAG-IBIG, as the case may be, as are enjoyed by 13 those in actual service. 14 SEC. 5. Government Assistance. - The Government shall provide 15 the following assistance to those caring for the elderly: 16 a) The elderly shall be treated as dependents as provided for in 17 the National Internal Revenue Code and as such, individual taxpayers caring for them, be they relatives or not shall be accorded the privileges 18 granted by the Code insofar as having dependents are concerned. 19 20 For the purpose of this paragraph, a certification from the barangay 21 captain attesting to the fact that the individual taxpayer is caring for 22 an elderly is necessary, regardless of whether the latter lives with the 23 benefactor or by himself/herself. 24 Individuals or non-governmental institutions establishing

homes, residential communities or retirement villages solely for the

1	elderly shall be accorded the following:
2	1) realty tax holiday for the first five years starting from the
3	first year of operation;
4	2) priority in the building and/or maintenance of provincial or
5	municipal roads leading to the aforesaid home, residential community
6	or retirement village.
_{.3} 7	SEC. 6. Retirement Benefits Retirement benefits from both the
8	government and the private sectors shall be upgraded to be at par with
9	the current scale enjoyed by those in actual service.
10	SEC. 7. The Office for Elderly Affairs (OEA) There shall be
11	established in the Office of the Mayor an OEA to be headed by a
12	Councilor who shall be designated by the Sangguniang Bayan and
13	assisted by the Community Development Officer. The functions of this
14	office are:
15	a) to plan, implement and monitor yearly work programs in
16	pursuance of the aims and objectives of this Act;
17	b) to draw up a list of available and required services which can be
18	provided by the elderly;
19	c) to maintain and regularly update on a quarterly basis the list
20	of elderly citizens and to issue a nationally uniform individual identifi-
21	cation cards which shall be valid anywhere in the country;
22	d) to service as a general information and liaison center to serve
23	the needs of the elderly.
24	SEC. 8. Municipal Responsibility It shall be the responsibility
25	of the municipality through the Mayor to ensure that the provisions of

this Act are	implemented	to its fulles

- SEC. 9. *Penalties*. Violation of any provision of this Act for which no penalty is specifically provided under any other law, shall be punished by imprisonment not exceeding one (1) month or a fine not exceeding one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) or both.
- SEC. 10. Appropriation. The necessary budget for the operation and maintenance of the OEA shall be charged against the funds for development projects under the Internal Revenue Allotment of each municipality, in an amount not lower than five percent (5%) nor higher than ten percent (10%) of the Fund, as determined by the Sangguniang Bayan.
- SEC. 11. Repealing Clause. All provisions of laws, orders, decrees including rules and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 12. Separability Clause. If any part or provision of this
 Act shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions
 hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force
 and effect.
- 19 SEC. 13. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) 20 days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two 21 (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
