

RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING THE PROFOUND SYMPATHY AND SINCERE CONDOLENCES OF THE PHILIPPINE SENATE ON THE DEATH OF FORMER SUPREME COURT ASSOCIATE JUSTICE ABRAHAM F. SARMIENTO, SR.

WHEREAS, Abraham F. Sarmiento, Sr., who served as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court from 1987 to 1991, passed away on 03 October 2010 while visiting in Prague, the Czech Republic.

WHEREAS, as a committed human rights advocate, the Justice cofounded the National Union for Democracy and Freedom, the Philippine organization for Human Rights, and the National Union for Liberation after the death of his son, Ditto, in the 1970s.

WHEREAS, in his stint as an Associate Justice of the highest court of the land, Sarmiento held staunch civil libertarian views as exemplified in a line of cases, foremost of which is *People v. Nazario*¹ where the Court through him acknowledged the void for vagueness rule so as to invalidate penal statutes.

WHEREAS, Sarmiento also served as a delegate from Cavite in the 1971 Constitutional Convention where he was elected Vice-President thereof.

WHEREAS, Justice Sarmiento's life exemplifies a dedicated Filipino servant and advocate of the rule of law, unafraid of abusive governmental powers and adamant on his belief for truth, justice and freedom to always prevail.

WHEREAS, the country is thus grateful for having a Justice Sarmiento whose life serves as an example for the citizens of the Republic to emulate, especially in the protection and preservation of every citizen's rights guaranteed by the Constitution.

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE PHILPPINES, To express, as it hereby expresses, its profound sympathy and condolences on the death of former Supreme Court Associate Justice Abraham F. Sarmiento, Sr..
