RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, AS REGARDS THE STATUS OF INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES FROM MAGUINDANAO, NORTH COTABATO, AND LANAO DEL SUR DISPLACED BY THE ON-GOING ARMED CLASH BETWEEN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES AND THE BANGSAMORO ISLAMIC FREEDOM FIGHTERS

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution provides that, "[th]e State values the dignity of every human person and guarantees full respect for human rights.";

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 5 of the same provides that, "[t]he maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy.";

WHEREAS, the Philippines is State Party to various human rights treaties which form part of the legal bases of the United Nations Guiding Principles on Internal Displacement (UNGPID), and which defines internally displaced as "persons or groups of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence, in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of generalized violence, violations of human rights or natural or human-made disasters, and who have not crossed an internationally recognized State border.";

WHEREAS, the Armed Forces of the Philippines commenced military operations on 17 June 2018 in Lanao del Sur against groups allegedly led by Abu Dar, believed to be rebuilding a group from residual forces who caused the Marawi conflict¹;

WHEREAS, as an outcome of this general violence from the tensions between the military and the group identified as the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters, many of our fellow Filipinos are currently in the throes of massive displacement;

WHEREAS, as of 19 June 2018, there are 23,465 individuals and about 5,136 families coming from different municipalities of Maguindanao and North Cotabato already affected by the ongoing conflict;

WHEREAS, the National Disaster Coordinating Council, in its NDCC Circular No. 05 s-2007, has raised issues relating to security, access to food, shelter and education and livelihood as primary concerns in disaster management²;

WHEREAS, the UNGPID outlines the rights pertaining to Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) to ensure that they are able to exercise fundamental rights and freedoms without discrimination, and that resources necessary for their health, education, and well-being remain available;

WHEREAS, the UNGPID further articulates that the government institutions have the obligation to promote and protect the rights of IDPs, and stipulates that these obligations equally apply to and must be observed by other individuals and groups participating in the context that brought displacement³;

WHEREAS, recommendations to the Philippines by treaty bodies, such as the United Nations Committee on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women⁴ and the United Nations Committee on Economic Social and Cultural Rights,⁵

expressly point to the need to address trafficking of women that can arise when people are forced to leave their homes and residences;

WHEREAS, one of the recommendations in the 2017 cycle of the Universal Period Review for the Philippines is to develop permanent resettlement approach to internal displacement⁶;

WHEREAS, UN Security Council Resolution No. 2122, adopted on 2013, reiterated the concern for the vulnerability of women-IDPs to gender based violence in areas with armed conflicts;

WHEREAS, the UN Special Rapporteur on the human rights of IDPs, in his 2016 Philippine Report, recommended, among other things, for the adoption of a law for the internally displaced⁷;

WHEREAS, the same Mission Report underscored that displacement in Maguindanao remains an ever-present threat and that the State must take action to break the cycle of violence and displacement that has been taking place for decades;

WHEREAS, there is a need to determine the extent of our compliance with our international obligations on protecting the IDPs in our country;

WHEREAS, there is also need to examine our policies and mechanisms to see if they are able to provide practical, rights-based, and sustainable solutions to these recurring concerns in emergency and conflict situations;

WHEREAS, inaction on the part of our government is simply unacceptable with regard to our countrymen IDPs who are among the most vulnerable sector in dire need of the State's protection;

WHEREAS, more importantly, there is need to ensure that the people, whom our international obligations and Constitution seek to protect, are given all possible assistance and protection by our government;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, to direct the appropriate Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the status of the displaced individuals and families in Maguindanao, North Cotabato and Lanao del Sur displaced by the on-going armed clashes between the Armed Forces of the Philippines and the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters.
