

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER AND OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO PHILIPPINE PUBLIC SERVICE OF OMBUDSMAN AND FORMER SUPREME COURT ASSOCIATE JUSTICE

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Philippines recognizes the outstanding record and achievements of distinguished Filipinos in their dedicated service to the Philippine government and their laudable contributions to nation-building;

CONCHITA CARPIO-MORALES

WHEREAS, Conchita Carpio-Morales has an illustrious and impressive record of government service that has spanned almost five (5) decades. She is the Ombudsman of the Philippines from 2011 to 2018, and prior to that, she held the post of Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the Philippines, and served in the lower courts, as well as in the Department of Justice. She has secured appointments from five (5) Philippine presidents: Ferdinand Marcos, Corazon Aquino, Fidel Ramos, Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, and Benigno "Noynoy" Aquino III;

WHEREAS, for almost 12 years beginning in 1971, Conchita Carpio-Morales was at the Department of Justice, where she first served as a Special Assistant to then Justice Secretary Vicente Abad Santos;

WHEREAS, in 1983, she started her work in the judiciary as a Regional Trial Court (RTC) Judge in Pili, Camarines Sur. In 1986, President Corazon Aquino transferred her appointment as RTC Judge to Pasay City, and in 1994, President Fidel

Ramos promoted her as an Associate Justice in the Court of Appeals, where she eventually headed its 7th Division¹;

WHEREAS, in 2002, after three (3) decades of rising from the ranks, she was promoted by President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court and became the first female magistrate to swear in a president-elect in 2010²;

WHEREAS, upon her retirement as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Justice Conchita Carpio-Morales was appointed by President Benigno Aquino III as Ombudsman in July 2011³. When she was appointed Ombudsman, the justice system was perceived to be "extremely sluggish; cases have mostly involved low level officials and employees; and public confidence in government's resolve to root out corruption is practically non-existent." With steely resolve and steadfast determination, she professionalized and upgraded the Office of the Ombudsman's capabilities, revolutionized its anti-corruption program to include the designation of deputy ombudsmen for environmental concerns and for investment-related problems; and improved its responsiveness to calls for public assistance."4;

WHEREAS, under her leadership, the Office of the Ombudsman, has significantly reduced the backlog of cases in its docket and recorded an improved conviction rate of its prosecutors to 75 percent (from 68 percent in 2015 and 2016, and 41 percent in 2011), while ensuring the accountability of several high-ranking officials and government employees for corruption⁵;

 WHEREAS, in recognition of her sterling record in the judiciary and her outstanding work as the Ombudsman, Justice Carpio-Morales has received numerous awards, including the UP Alumni Association's Outstanding Award in Championing Justice/Judiciary on the Occasion of its Centenary, the Quezon City Government's Ten

Most Outstanding Citizens for 2013, and The Philippine Daily Inquirer's Filipino of the Year in 2014⁶;

WHEREAS, in the citation in the award given in 2014 by the Ateneo de Manila University, it was stated that "(t)hroughout her long career in government, Ombudsman Carpio-Morales has tirelessly shown integrity, competence, dedication, and sound judgment, and has implemented foundational policies and programs aligned with the common good and have benefited the greater community?;

WHEREAS, in 2016, Ombudsman Carpio-Morales was recognized by the prestigious Ramon Magsaysay Awards, Asia's Nobel Prize equivalent, for "her moral courage and commitment to justice in taking head-on one of the most intractable problems in the Philippines; promoting by her example of incorruptibility, diligence, vision and leadership, the highest ethical standards in public service"⁸;

WHEREAS, Ombudsman Carpio-Morales has retired as the Ombudsman effective 25 July 2018 after completing a 7-year full term, making her the second Ombudsman to have completed a term since Aniano Desierto retired in October 20029. She has been in government service for the past 47 years;

WHEREAS, Ombudsman Conchita Carpio-Morales's moral courage and commitment to justice should be emulated by all government officials and employees. By her example of incorruptibility, diligence, vision, and leadership, Justice and Ombudsman Carpio-Morales is able to set the highest ethical standards in public service that should inspire the youth and the future generations of Filipinos;
