RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE STATUS OF WASTE MANAGEMENT IN ISLAND DESTINATIONS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature;

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 2(d) of Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Wastes Management Act of 2000, provides it to be the policy of the State to ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment, and disposal of solid waste through the formulation and adoption of the best environmental practice in ecological waste management excluding incineration;

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 9275, otherwise known as the Clean Water Act of 2004, provides the State shall pursue a policy of economic growth in a manner consistent with the protection, preservation and revival of the quality of our fresh, brackish and marine waters;

WHEREAS, an article from the Philippine Star, dated April 10, 2018, reported that the environmental challenges in El Nido, Palawan and Panglao, Bohol consists of accumulating water pollution and lacking of proper waste disposal facilities;

WHEREAS, a report from the Environment Management Bureau in Region 7 provided that total coliform levels in the last quarter of 2017 was at 284.15 most probable number (MPN) per 100ml which is way below the safe level of 1,000 MPN;

WHEREAS, an article from the Philippine Daily Inquirer, dated January 14, 2018, reported that the total coliform levels in Panglao, Bohol were within standards but the level of fecal coliform continued to spike and breach acceptable levels;

WHEREAS, the article from the Philippine Daily Inquirer further reported that the spike in coliform bacteria is attributed to waste disposal by tourist boats and the lack of wastewater treatment facilities in the resorts of Panglao;

WHEREAS, a Senate inquiry on the matter is necessary in order to update the appropriate Senate committees and to address the lapses in waste management in island destinations across the country to prevent further degradation of the natural environment and achieve sustainable tourism development;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the status of waste management in island destinations across the country.
