RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORTS THAT THE ESTIMATED FIVE MILLION FILIPINO CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES ARE THE MOST VULNERABLE TO CALAMITIES OR EMERGENCY INCIDENTS IN THE COUNTRY

WHEREAS, at the recent Emergency Preparedness Forum for Children and Youth with Disabilities Lotta Sylwander, country representative of United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) said that children with disabilities will be the most affected in every calamity that hits the Philippines¹;

WHEREAS, she noted in every emergency 50 to 60 percent of those who are most affected are children because of their many limitations²;

WHEREAS, according to Engr. Bien Mateo, director of SM Cares' Program for Persons with Disabilities, Children with disabilities are often excluded from emergency preparedness planning at all levels of government, leaving children with disabilities especially unprepared for emergencies. DRR people commonly assume that parents will inform, warn and protect children in the event of disaster, even though children are frequently apart from their parents when in school, daycare, or with their friends³;

WHEREAS, Dr. Renato Solidum Jr., Undersecretary for Disaster Risk Reduction of the Department of Science and Technology said many of those who will perish should a 7.2 magnitude earthquake or the "Big One" hit Metro Manila and nearby provinces are children⁴;

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Senate, by policy or by law, to protect the rights and welfare of Filipino children

WHEREAS, Congress, in coordination with concerned agencies, should review existing laws on disaster risk reduction;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the reports that the estimated five million Filipino children with disabilities are the most vulnerable to calamities or emergency incidents in the country.
