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RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE WASTE MANAGEMENT GUIDELINES SET BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 16 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature;

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 2(d) of Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Wastes Management Act of 2000, provides it to be the policy of the State to ensure the proper segregation, collection, transport, storage, treatment, and disposal of solid waste through the formulation and adoption of the best environmental practice in ecological waste management excluding incineration;

WHEREAS, Rule 8.1 of Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Administrative Order No. 2005-10 provides all projects/activities involving collection, transport, treatment and disposal of sewage shall be in accordance with the guidelines on sanitation set by the Department of Health (DOH);

WHEREAS, Chapter XVII, Section 72 of Presidential Decree No. 856 (P.D. No. 856), otherwise known as the Code of Sanitation of the Philippines, provides the approval of the Secretary of Health or his duly authorized representative is required in the following matters:

 (a) Construction of any approved type of toilet for every house including community toilet which may be allowed for a group of small houses of light materials or temporary in nature;

 24 (d) Plans, design data and specification of a new or existing sewerage
 - (d) Plans, design data and specification of a new or existing sewerage system or sewage treatment plant;
 - (e) The discharge of untreated effluent of septic tanks and/or sewage treatment plants to bodies of water;
 - (f) Manufacture of septic tanks; and

(g) Method of disposal of sludge from septic tanks or other treatment plants;

WHEREAS, the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Chapter XVII – "Sewage Collection and Disposal, Excreta Disposal, and Drainage" of P.D. No. 856 mandates the strict compliance of all public and private sewage and excreta collection and disposal system project planned by any government agency or instrumentality including government-owned or controlled corporations, private organizations, firms, individuals or other entities;

WHEREAS, Section 3.2.4 (a) of the IRR of Chapter XVII of P.D. No. 856 provides no person shall discharge or permit or cause to be discharged the effluent from an individual sewage disposal system or other putrescible or offensive wastes from his premises unless an application for an operational permit has been approved by the local health authority;

WHEREAS, Section 3.2.4 (c) of the IRR of Chapter XVII of P.D. No. 856 provides the local health authority at any reasonable time may inspect the sewage disposal system, sample the effluent, or take any other step which he deems necessary to ensure compliance with these rules and regulations. The local health authority may utilize inspection and reports submitted by the local health officer, sanitary engineer or other qualified national or local government personnel to determine operational compliance;

WHEREAS, an article from the Philippine Daily Inquirer, dated February 22, 2018, reported on the environmental problems occurring in Panglao, Bohol as the result of resort owners and investors failing to comply with environmental laws and regulations;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Daily Inquirer article further reported on the waste management procedures of some resorts on Alona Beach where sewage and other wastes are emptied directly into holes on the ground which affects the waters surrounding coral reefs and other sensitive marine habitats;

WHEREAS, the Environment Management Bureau of Region 7 (EMB-7) provided in a report that in the last quarter of 2017, the total coliform levels of water in Panglao, Bohol was below the safe level or 1,000 most probable number (MPN) at 284.15 MPN per 100ml;

WHEREAS, the increase in coliform bacteria is attributed to the waste disposal practices of tourist boats and the lack of wastewater treatment facilities in the resorts of Panglao;

WHEREAS, a Senate inquiry on the matter is necessary in order to ensure compliance to waste management guidelines set by the DOH to prevent further damages to the natural environment and achieve sustainable development;

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to direct the proper Senate Committees to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the waste management guidelines set by the Department of Health.
