## Introduced by Senator Aquilino "Koko" Pimentel III

## RESOLUTION

## DIRECTING THE APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEE(S) TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORTED IMPORTATION OF PLASTIC WASTE FROM SOUTH KOREA

WHEREAS, a shipment from South Korea declared as "plastic
synthetic flakes" arrived at the Mindanao Container Terminal (MCT) in
Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental on board MV Affluent Ocean in July 2018<sup>1</sup>;

5 **WHEREAS**, after a request for an alert order was issued on October 6 25, 2018 by the Bureau of Customs Region 10's Intelligence and 7 Investigation Service, it was discovered only this November 2018 that the 8 shipment actually contained tons of plastic wastes, wood, and other 9 materials (the "South Korea trash") instead of the declared plastic flakes<sup>2</sup>; 10

11 WHEREAS, Section 1400 of Republic Act No. 10863 or the 12 Customs Modernization and Tariff Act heavily punishes misdeclaration or 13 misclassification of goods with 250% of the duty and tax due and when the 14 same is intentional or fraudulent, a 500% surcharge shall be due, with the 15 goods subject to seizure and without prejudice to fines or penalties being 16 imposed on the importer or person(s) who willfully participated in the 17 fraudulent act;

WHEREAS, the consignee of the South Korea trash is reportedly
Verde Soko Philippines Industrial Corporation ("Verde Soko"), a company
with a recycling plant inside the PHIVIDEC Industrial Estate (PIE) located

in Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental, which is managed by PHIVIDEC
Industrial Authority (PIA),<sup>3</sup> a government-owned and controlled
corporation;

5 WHEREAS, Verde Soko apparently has an existing memorandum 6 of agreement (MOU) with PIA for the "sorting and processing of plastics 7 for briquettes and plastic resin for production of plastic pallets"<sup>4</sup>; 8

9 **WHEREAS**, the South Korea trash were reportedly "approved by 10 the Philippine Embassy in South Korea before it was shipped to the 11 country"<sup>5</sup>; 12

WHEREAS, we are confronted with this South Korea trash issue amidst the still unresolved Canada trash issue, for which the undersigned filed *Proposed Senate Resolution No. 553* on December 4, 2017;

WHEREAS, the Philippines appears to be well in the path of the socalled "global waste trade" and Congress has to act swiftly to prevent the country from being a dumping site of the more advanced economies; and

WHEREAS, protecting and advancing the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology is a Constitutional duty and an intergenerational responsibility;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, that the Senate of the Philippines direct its appropriate committee(s) to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the reported importation of plastic waste from South Korea, considering the earlier case of the Canada trash per *Proposed Senate Resolution No. 553*, with the end in view of preventing the Philippines from being a dumping site of the more advanced economies in this so-called "global waste trade".
