## RESOLUTION

URGING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, INTO THE RULES OR POLICIES OF THE TRANSPORTATION (DOTR) AND THE LAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FRANCHISING AND REGULATORY BOARD (LTFRB) IN RELATION TO WHICH PROVINCIAL BUSES SHALL HAVE ROUTES TERMINATED AT THE PARAÑAQUE INTEGRATED TERMINAL EXCHANGE (PITX), WITH THE END GOALS OF ENSURING THE VIABILITY AND INTERCONNECTIVITY OF THE PITX, ENSURING THAT THE RIGHT TO BE PASSENGERS, OPERATORS, DRIVERS AND OTHER HEARD OF BE UPHELD AND TO ERADICATE STAKEHOLDERS ANY AND ALL CONFUSION AS TO THE OPERATION OF THE PITX

WHEREAS, "the prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the 1 people"<sup>1</sup> and "the maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and 2 property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment 3 by all the people of the blessings of democracy"<sup>2</sup>; 4

WHEREAS, the Parañague Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX), dubbed as 6 the country's "first landport", was inaugurated by President Duterte last 5 November 7 2018; 8

WHEREAS, PITX is a 4.5-hectare "all-in-one" terminal housing transportation 10 bays, commercial spaces and office buildings; 11

WHEREAS, PITX was designed and built to handle 100,000 passengers daily 13 as it sought to be the ending of all routes originating from Cavite and Batangas and 14 from where passengers would transfer into in-city buses, taxis, jeepneys and UV 15 Express Shuttles<sup>3</sup>, as such, PITX ought to decongest traffic in Metro Manila as 16 around 1,000 provincial buses will no longer enter Metro Manila; 17

WHEREAS, the first floor of PITX houses an information center, bus ticketing 19 counters, and bus boarding gates; its second floor houses 36 loading bays and 23 20

unloading bays for buses; its third floor houses 18 loading bays and 17 unloading 1 bays for UV Express shuttles, as well as a proposed link to the LRT1 Cavite 2 extension; its fourth floor houses 852 parking spaces for motorists<sup>4</sup>; 3

4 WHEREAS, the world class gargantuan PITX, however, generated complaints 5 and controversy from passengers, PUV operators/drivers and prospective 6 concessionaires/lessors due to sudden change in the policies and/or issuances of the 7 Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the Land Transportation Franchising and 8 Regulatory Board (LTFRB); 9

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WHEREAS, on 13 September 2018, LTFRB issued Memorandum Circular 11 (MC) No. 2018-020 mandating that "all Provincial Public Utility Buses (PUBs) UV 12 Express Service and Public Utility Jeepneys (PUJs) originating from provinces 13 southwest of Metro Manila entering via Coastal Road and/or Manila Cavite 14 Expressway...shall end their routes at the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange 15 (PITX) in Coastal Road Parañaque, from the date PITX is fully operational"; 16

- 17 WHEREAS, on 12 October 2018, however, less than a month from the 18 inauguration of the PITX, the DOTr suddenly issued Department Order (DO) No. 19 2018-025 "exempting some 300 provincial buses from ending their routes at PITX"<sup>5</sup>; 20
- 21 WHEREAS, DOTr's DO No. 2018-025 resulted in utter confusion amongst 22 passengers, operators, drivers and law enforcers. Operators/drivers decried the lack 23 of clear and transparent parameters as to the basis of exempting some 300 24 provincial buses;<sup>6</sup> operators/drivers who are to terminate their routes at the PITX 25 lament that passengers would necessarily choose the exempted provincial buses that 26 could go inside Metro Manila straight to their in-city destinations; operators/drivers 27 accuse DOTr of being biased in favor of a few bus lines; PUVs from Cavite and 28 Batangas are bypassing the PITX and continue to go on with their in-city routes 29 and/or destinations; law enforcers have no idea as to which buses are exempted 30 from terminating at the PITX'; 31
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WHEREAS, to further aggravate the controversy surrounding the PITX, 33 LTFRB issued MC No. 2018-022 supposedly to implement and enforce DOTr's DO 34 No. 2018-025, which exempted some provincial buses from terminating at the PITX. 35 Surprisingly, LTFRB's Board Member Aileen Lizada (BM Lizada) claims that said MC 36 No. 2018-022 was "falsified"8; 37

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WHEREAS, BM Lizada maintains the third page of what purports to be MC 39 No. 2018-022 where her "dissenting opinion" appears is legitimate, "but that it is 40 part of a different memorandum circular earlier circulated for LTFRB board members' 41

review and signatures", she further claims that "DOTr might have been misled to
believe that LTFRB MC 2018-022 is a legitimate document. It is not"<sup>9</sup>;

**WHEREAS**, in view of the foregoing, there were reports that the massive PITX only caters to less than 10% of its expected buses/PUVs and passengers in reality because of DOTr's and LTFRB's sudden change of its rules, thus, current and prospective investors, concessionaires of food stands/stalls and the like had reportedly backed out;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved by the 10 Senate of the Philippines, to urge the Senate Committee on Public Services to 11 conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, into the rules or policies of the Department 12 of Transportation (DOTr) and the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory 13 Board (LTFRB) in relation to which provincial buses shall have routes terminated at 14 the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX), with the end goals of ensuring 15 the viability and interconnectivity of the PITX, ensuring that the right to be heard of 16 passengers, operators, drivers and other stakeholders be upheld and to eradicate 17 any and all confusion as to the operation of the PITX; 18
