WHEREAS, this year, 11 TOYM awardees were acknowledged during an awarding ceremony on December 12, 2016, held in Malacañang Palace;



Resolved, as it is hereby resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, To honor and commend the TOYM 2016 Awardees, namely:


