AN ACT DECLARING THE BULUSAN VOLCANO LOCATED IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF BARCELONA, BULUSAN, CASIGURAN, IROSIN AND JUBAN, PROVINCE OF SORSOGON AS A PROTECTED AREA UNDER THE CATEGORY OF NATURAL PARK, PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	TITLE, POLICIES AND SCOPE
3	SECTION 1. Title This Act shall be known as the "Bulusan Volcano
4	Natural Park Act".
5	SEC. 2. Statement of Policy Cognizant of the profound impact of
6	human activities on all components of the natural environment, particularly the
7	effect of increasing population, intensive resource exploitation and industria
8	advancement; recognizing the critical importance of protecting and
9	maintaining the natural and physical diversities of the environment, notably
10	areas of unique biological significance in order to sustain life; taking into

account the sociocultural, economic, aesthetic and environmental values of the ecosystem of the Bulusan Volcano and its surrounding areas to the Province of Sorsogon particularly its crucial watershed function with the presence of hot and cold springs and lakes, and the diversity of its flora and fauna with some endemic species; and finally, in pursuit of the duty of the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to secure for the Filipino people the protection and conservation of the Bulusan Volcano and its surrounding areas in accordance with Republic Act No. 7586 or the National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992 (NIPAS Act) and international conventions to which the Philippines is a signatory.

SEC. 3. Declaration of Protected Area. – Pursuant to the above policy and the NIPAS Act, the Bulusan Volcano and its surrounding vicinities with boundaries as described below is hereby declared a protected area under the category of a natural park, to be known as the Bulusan Volcano Natural Park (BVNP).

SEC. 4. Scope and Coverage. – The BVNP shall cover parcels of land-located in the municipalities of Barcelona, Bulusan, Casiguran, Irosin and Juban, all within the Province of Sorsogon, containing an area of three thousand six hundred seventy-two (3,672) hectares, with the following technical description, subject to ground survey:

SEC. 5. Land Classification. – All lands of the public domain within the coverage and scope of this Act described in Section 4 shall fall under the classification of national park pursuant to the 1987 Philippine Constitution.

SEC. 6. Definition of Terms. -

- (a) "BVNP" refers to the Bulusan Volcano Natural Park.
- (b) "Genetically modified organism (GMO)" refers to any living organism that possesses a novel combination of genetic material obtained through the use of modern biotechnology through *in vitro* nucleic acid techniques, including recombinant deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) and direct injection of nucleic acid into cells or organelles, or fusion of cells beyond the taxonomic family, that overcome natural physiological reproductive or recombination barriers that are not techniques used in traditional breeding and selection.
- (c) "LGU" refers to any of the local government units within theBVNP.
  - (d) "PAMB" refers to the BVNP Protected Area Management Board.
  - (e) "PASu" refers to the Protected Area Superintendent.
  - (f) "Protected species" refers to any plant or animal declared protected under Philippine laws and international conventions, including species listed under the Convention on International Trade of Endangered Species (CITES) and all its Annexes, the Bonn Convention on Migratory Species, the Red-list of Categories of the World Conservation Union (IUCN), or any plant or animal which the PAMB may deem critical for the conservation and preservation of the BVNP.
  - (g) "Natural park" refers to a relatively large area not materially altered by human activity where extractive resource uses are not allowed and maintained to protect outstanding natural and scenic areas of national or international significance for scientific, educational and recreational use.

i	(n) "Secretary" refers to the Secretary of the Department of
2	Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).
3	ARTICLE II
4	MANAGEMENT, MANAGEMENT PLAN AND ZONING
5	SEC. 7. Management of the BVNP The BVNP shall be under the
6	administrative jurisdiction of the DENR and shall be administered in
7	accordance with the provisions of this Act: Provided, That the identification
8	and management of zones to be established within the BVNP shall be
9	consultative and participatory.
10	The PAMB shall be responsible for the planning, resource protection
11	and general administration of the BVNP in accordance with the approved
12	management plan,
13	SEC. 8. Management Plan A management plan shall be adopted
14	which shall serve as the long-term basic framework for the management of the
15	BVNP, govern all activities within the BVNP and guide the preparation of the
16	annual operations plan and budget. The management plan shall be consistent
17	with this Act and the nature of the BVNP as a protected area under the
18	category of a natural park. A management manual containing the management
19	plan and other supporting data shall be prepared in accordance with the
20	implementing rules of the NIPAS Act.
21	Within one (1) year from the effectivity of this Act, the PASu office
22	shall prepare the management plan in accordance with the General
23	Management Planning Strategy as provided for in the implementing rules of
24	the NIPAS Act. It shall contain, among others, the following:
25	(a) A period of applicability for ten (10) years subject to review every
26	five (5) years;
27	(b) Key management issues;
28	(c) Goals and objectives of management in support of Section 2;

(d) Zoning in accordance with Section 9;

- (e) Management programs to include enforcement of laws, habitat and wildlife management, ecotourism, sustainable use, management, infrastructure development and maintenance, fire prevention and pest control;
  - (f) Sustainable and non-destructive livelihood activities;
- (g) Regulations in furtherance of the preservation and conservation aims of the BVNP such as allowable activities, resource-use restrictions, among others; and
  - (h) Other relevant conservation matters.

The management plan shall be reviewed and adopted by the PAMB and certified to by the DENR Secretary. It shall not be revised nor modified without prior consultation with the PAMB. The PAMB shall review and update the management plan every five (5) years.

Within two (2) years prior to the expiration of the management plan, the PASu shall cause the publication of notices for comments and suggestions on the successor management plan in a newspaper of general circulation and the posting thereof in the provincial, municipal and barangay halls of the LGUs comprising the BVNP, and in three (3) other conspicuous areas frequented by the public. The successor plan shall be made available for public perusal at the PASu office.

The management plan and all its successor plans shall be prepared in English, Filipino and Bicol, plainly written and made accessible to the public at the PASu office.

SEC. 9. Zoning. – Management zones shall be established within the BVNP, giving primary consideration to its protection and conservation. Zoning shall also take into account tenurial and livelihood concerns of communities to ensure the efficient protection of habitats, fragile ecosystems and unique areas.

1	The establishment and management of zones shall involve the
2	communities concerned by undertaking such steps as dialogues, consultations
3	and land- and resource-use mapping. Zones shall be demarcated on the ground
4	and indicated on maps with the participation of communities, LGUs and other
5	stakeholders.
6	Multiple-use zones shall be established within the peripheral areas of the
7	BVNP in accordance with the management plan to serve as a social fence,
8	where tenurial and sustainable resource-use rights may be granted to qualified
9	groups and individuals.
10	ARTICLE III
11	INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS, ROLES AND FUNCTIONS
12	SEC. 10. The Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) There is
13	hereby created a PAMB, which shall serve as the highest policy-making body
14	of the BVNP. It shall be composed of the following:
15	(a) The DENR Regional Executive Director (RED) for Region V, as
16	PAMB chairperson;
17	(b) The Provincial Governor of Sorsogon as co-chairperson;
18	(c) The provincial planning and development officer of Sorsogon;
19	(d) The environment and natural resources officer of the Province of
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- Sorsogon;
- (e) The respective mayors of the municipalities of Barcelona, Bulusan, Casiguran, Irosin and Juban;
  - (f) The Representative of the First District of the Province of Sorsogon to the Philippine Congress or his/her designated representative;
  - (g) The Representative of the Second District of the Province of Sorsogon to the Philippine Congress or his/her designated representative;
- (h) One (1) regular representative from each barangay with territory within the BVNP;

l	(i) One (1) regular representative each from the nongovernment
2	organizations (NGOs), people's organizations, church or civil organizations but
3	not to exceed five (5), all of whom must be based in or near the BVNP, to be
1	chosen by their respective organizations in an election duly called for the
5	purpose;

- (j) One (1) representative from the Department of Tourism (DOT),Region V;
- 8 (k) One (1) representative from the Department of Agriculture (DA),
  9 Region V;

- (I) One (1) representative from other government agencies with direct interest or involvement in BVNP management, to be appointed by the Secretary upon the recommendation of the respective heads of offices; and
- (m) One (1) representative from academic institutions with direct interest or involvement in protected area management, to be appointed by the Secretary from among the respective nominees of these institutions.

Every member of the PAMB shall serve for a term of five (5) years, which is renewable for another five (5) years for as long as such member remains connected with the office or sector being represented: *Provided*, That LGU representatives must present the necessary endorsements from their respective legislative councils. Whenever a vacancy occurs during the term of a nongovernment PAMB member, a new member shall be chosen in the same manner as the original selection process and only for the remaining term.

- SEC. 11. Powers and Functions of the PAMB. The PAMB shall decide by majority vote and shall have the following powers and functions:
- (a) Issue rules and regulations to control, prohibit and regulate all acts that may be prejudicial to the BVNP pursuant to the policy declarations set forth, including the imposition of fines to a maximum of Twenty thousand

pesos (P20,000.00) and the issuance of cease and desist orders, whenever justified;

- (b) Regulate, control and issue permits in accordance with the management plan and pertinent environmental laws and regulations particularly with regard to infrastructure activities, public utilities, waste management, business enterprises and research activities within the BVNP, including the power to prescribe appropriate fees and charges;
- (c) Cause the preparation of and review, approve and adopt a management plan for the BVNP;
- (d) Adopt and enforce a land-use scheme and zoning plan in adjoining areas for the preservation and control of activities that may threaten the ecological balance in the BVNP;
- (e) Conduct studies on various characteristics, features and conditions of the BVNP and prescribe permissible or prohibited human activities in the area;
- (f) Recommend individuals or groups to the Secretary who may be deputized to augment the protection of personnel of the BVNP for the enforcement of laws, rules and regulations, and prescribe qualifications thereof;
- (g) Enter into contracts and agreements with private entities or other government agencies as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act;
- (h) Fix and prescribe reasonable fees to be collected from government agencies or any person, firm or corporation deriving benefits from the BVNP;
- (i) Exact administrative fees and fines as authorized in Section 18 for violation of guidelines, rules and regulations issued pursuant to this Act as would endanger the viability of the BVNP;

(i) Determine the specification of the class, type and style of building 1 2 and other structures to be constructed in the BVNP and the materials to be 3 used thereon: (k) Control the construction, operation and maintenance of roads, trails, 4 waterworks, sewerage, fire protection and sanitation systems and other public 5 6 utilities within the BVNP; (1) To accept, in the name of the Philippine government funds, 7 donations, gifts or bequests of money for immediate disbursement or other 8 property in the interest of the BVNP, its activities or its services; 9 (m) Review and approve proposals for funding, financial and work 10 plans and exercise accountability over all funds that may accrue to the BVNP; 11 (n) Promulgate rules and regulations for the conduct of its business; 12 13 (o) Monitor and evaluate the performance of all PASu office personnel; (p) Call on any agency or instrumentality of the Philippine government 14 as well as academic institutions. NGOs and the private sector as may be 15 16 necessary to accomplish the objectives and activities of the BVNP; 17 (q) Retain legal counsel to defend cases against the PAMB, the staff of the PASu office and deputized individuals whenever they are sued in 18 connection with the performance of their duties and functions under this Act, 19 and to assist in resolving other PAMB legal matters; and 20 21 (r) Initiate and file suits against persons or entities whose businesses or 22 activities are detrimental to the BVNP. 23 SEC. 12. The Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office. - There is

hereby established a PASu office in charge of the management, protection and

administration of the BVNP. The PASu office shall be supported by the

existing personnel of the DENR. The head of office shall be the chief

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1	operating officer of the BVNP and shall be accountable to the RED of the
2	DENR-Region V and the PAMB.
3	SEC. 13. Local Government Units (LGUs) LGUs shall be represented
4	in the PAMB and shall have the following functions:
5	(a) Apprise their respective constituents, office and sector on activities
6	and programs for the BVNP;
7	(b) Ensure consistency in the implementation of all activities in the
8	BVNP;
9	(c) Retain their ordinance-making powers over the BVNP: Provided,
10	That on matters relating to biodiversity conservation, protection and
11	sustainable development, local government ordinances shall be consistent with
12	the management plan;
13	(d) Consider the BVNP Management Plan in the formulation of their
14	respective development plans;
15	(e) Assist the PAMB in the implementation of the overall park
16	programs including, but not limited to, the imposition, collection and
17 .	utilization of park fees, enforcement of policies, rules and regulations, and
18	other similar park activities;
19	(f) Accredit people's organizations, NGOs and other entities and
20	groups involved in activities within the BVNP; and
21	(g) Provide the PAMB with relevant information and data for the
22	effective management of the BVNP.
23	ARTICLE IV
24	UTILIZATION OF RESOURCES
25	SEC. 14. Tenured Migrants Tenured migrants are members of
26	households who have actually and continuously occupied a portion of the
27	BVNP on or before June 1, 1987 and are substantially dependent thereon for
28	subsistence. The PAMB shall certify the occupants who shall qualify as

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tenured migrants. On the basis of this certification, the DENR shall issue the appropriate tenurial instruments over such areas as have been occupied or cultivated by them but not to exceed three (3) hectares per household. Despite consideration to current practices, in areas occupied by tenured migrants that are designated as zones in which no occupation or other human activities shall be allowed, the occupants in these areas shall be transferred to suitable zones, to be accomplished through just and humane means.

Any transfer, sale, donation, disposition, lease, encumbrance or use as collateral, security or capital of the tenurial instrument or the rights and interests arising over the instrument shall be void. Said rights can only be transferred by way of succession to compulsory heirs who are also actual occupants of the BVNP. Any violation of the terms and conditions of a tenurial instrument or any provision of this Act or abandonment by the tenured migrants shall constitute sufficient ground for the revocation of the tenurial instrument.

Upon termination of an occupant's tenurial rights for cause or by voluntary surrender of rights, the PASu shall take immediate steps to rehabilitate the area in order to return it to its approximate natural state prior to the cultivation or improvement by the tenured migrant.

The PAMB shall provide appropriate measures for those who do not qualify as tenured migrants or those living outside the BVNP but who depend substantially on the resources of the BVNP for their subsistence to ensure that their livelihood activities are in accordance with the objectives of this law and consistent with the management plan.

SEC. 15. Existing Facilities within the BVNP. – Within one (1) year from the approval of this Act, all existing commercial facilities within the BVNP with capitalization of not less that One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00), or which relies heavily from resources within the BVNP, shall

- submit to the PASu office a sworn statement containing the following information:
  - (a) Potential for disturbances of protected species and their habitats;
    - (b) Emissions and effluents at all stages of the operation;
      - (c) Energy requirements and sources of energy;
      - (d) Water supply requirements and sources of water;
- 7 (e) Volume of resources extracted from the BVNP;
- 8 (f) Future plans for the next five (5) years; and

(g) Other data that may be deemed relevant to the conservation objectives of the BVNP.

Based on these submissions, the PAMB shall determine whether the continued operation and future plans of these facilities are detrimental to the BVNP or require their operations to undergo the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) System. The PAMB may prescribe conditions or charge reasonable fees for the continued operation of facilities that rely heavily on resources within the BVNP to ensure that it does not impair the conservation objectives of the BVNP. Without prejudice to the filing of the necessary criminal charges, in case of violation of the PAMB conditions or nonpayment of charges, the PAMB may impose an administrative fine of Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00). Whenever necessary, through the PASu and other government entities, the PAMB shall cause the cessation and demolition of the said facility at the owner's cost. The failure to submit the required information shall constitute a violation of this Act and be subject to the penalties imposed under Section 18(b).

SEC. 16. *Utilization of Resources*. – Except upon prior approval of the PAMB and consistent with the management plan, the use of natural resources within the BVNP shall not be allowed. However, the sustainable use of resources by tenured migrants for their domestic needs or for subsistence shall

not be restricted unless involving protected species or such use is deemed 1 2 highly detrimental to the ecosystem. 3 SEC. 17. Public Agricultural Lands. - Upon the passage of this Act, no 4 land within the BVNP shall be released from the public domain as agricultural lands and any sale, transfer, alienation or disposition thereof shall be null and 5 6 void. 7 ARTICLE V 8 PROHIBITED ACTS SEC. 18. Prohibited Acts. - The following are prohibited acts within the 9 10 BVNP with their respective penalties: 11 (a) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) but not 12 more than Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) and imprisonment of 13 not less than six (6) years and one (1) day to not more than twelve (12) years shall be imposed upon any person who: 14 (1) Hunts, collects, takes, destroys, traps, disturbs or otherwise 15 16 possesses any wild plant, animals or product, including genetic resources, derived from the BVNP without prior PAMB permit: Provided, That such 17 permit can only be given for scientific purposes and necessary for the BVNP 18 19 management; 20 (2) Cuts, gathers, collects, removes or otherwise possesses timber or 21 other forest products within the BVNP without prior PAMB permit: Provided, 22 That such permit can only be given for scientific purposes and necessary for the BVNP management: Provided, further, That no permit shall be issued for 23 24 timber or other forest products within strict protection zones: 25 (3) Engages in slash-and-burn farming or kaingin, or otherwise 26 intentionally or negligently causes a forest fire inside the BVNP;

(4) Engages in mineral or energy exploration activities within the

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BVNP:

(5) Engages in treasure-hunting within the BVNP;

- (6) Introduces exotic species or genetically modified organisms within the BVNP; and
- (7) Discharges, leaves or dumps any waste product or substance deleterious to the BVNP ecosystem or to any of the flora and fauna;
- (b) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) but not more than Two hundred fifty thousand pesos (P250,000.00) and imprisonment of not less than six (6) months and one (1) day to not more than six (6) years shall be imposed upon any person who:
- (1) Occupies, settles or possesses any portion of land inside the BVNP without the necessary permit. Any act of clearing, construction of residence or introduction of improvements shall constitute *prima facie* evidence of such occupation or settlement;
- (2) Vandalizes, mutilates, destroys, excavates, defaces or otherwise intentionally damages any natural formation or object of natural beauty inside the BVNP;
- (3) Uses or possesses motorized equipment, explosives or any noxious substance anywhere within the strict protection zones of the BVNP as delineated by the PAMB;
- (4) Constructs or maintains any kind of road, structure, fence or enclosure without prior PAMB permit; and
- (5) Obstructs or hinders the enforcement of this Act, the management plan and its pertinent rules and regulations;
- (c) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) but not more than Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than one (1) month and one (1) day to not more than six (6) months, or both, shall be imposed upon any person who:

(1) Except as otherwise provided, violates the management plan or any
 of the rules or resolutions promulgated by the PAMB;

- (2) Alters, removes, destroys or deface boundaries, marks or signs;
- (3) Enters the BVNP without prior PAMB permit for purposes of trekking, mountain climbing, spelunking and other recreational activities; and
- (4) Dumps, litters or otherwise leaves debris, refuse or garbage within the BVNP;
- (d) Any provision to the contrary notwithstanding, the commission of any unlawful act under Section 18(a) shall carry the penalty of imprisonment of not less than twelve (12) years and one (1) day to not more than twenty (20) years and a fine of not less than Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) to not more than One million pesos (P1,000,000.00), whenever the species involved is a protected species. Any citizen may institute the necessary charge against an offender for the commission of the acts enumerated under this section;
- (e) A conviction under this section shall carry the accessory penalties of eviction from the BVNP, payment of damages for rehabilitation and restoration, and the forfeiture of all conveyances, equipment, device, instrument, tool or weapon used in the commission of the offense as well as flora, fauna and resources caught in the possession of the accused. If the offender is an association, partnership or corporation, the president or manager of the said corporation shall be held liable for the act of his/her employees or workers;
- (f) The DENR, through the PASu, may impose administrative sanctions against the offender for violations committed under this Act. The PASu may confiscate all conveyances, equipment, device, instrument, tool or weapon used in the commission of the offense caught *en flagrante*, including

the animals, plants and other resources from the BVNP found in the possession of the offender; and

(g) In case of conviction, the penalty consisting of fines and damages shall directly accrue to the Bulusan Volcano Natural Park Fund (BVNPF).

5 ARTICLE VI

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## 6 PROCEEDS AND FEES

SEC. 19. The Bulusan Volcano Natural Park Fund. — There is hereby established a trust fund to be known as the Bulusan Volcano Natural Park Fund (BVNPF) for purposes of financing projects of the BVNP. All income generated from the operation of the BVNP or the management of its wild flora and fauna shall accrue to the BVNPF. These income shall be derived from fees from permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the BVNP, proceeds from the lease of multiple-use areas, contributions from industries and facilities directly benefiting from the BVNP, and such other fees and income derived from the operation of the BVNP.

The BVNPF may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various sources, domestic or foreign: *Provided*, That the BVNPF shall be deposited as a special account in the National Treasury and disbursements therefrom shall be made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the BVNP, and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with existing accounting and budgeting rules and regulations: *Provided*, *further*, That the BVNPF shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits, property tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities. Furthermore, LGUs may charge add-ons to fees imposed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That such add-ons

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ł	shall be determined based on the contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance
2	and protection of the protected area.
3	All donations, grants and endowments accruing to the BVNPF shall be
4	exempted from income or gift taxes and all other taxes, charges or fees
5	imposed by the government or any political subdivision or instrumentality
6	thereof.
7	Current sources of revenue of LGUs such as business permits and real
8	property taxes shall be excluded from the BVNPF.
9	SEC. 20. Appropriations The Secretary of the DENR shall
10	immediately include in the Department's program the implementation of this
11	Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General
12	Appropriations Act.
13	ARTICLE VII
14	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
15	SEC. 21. Separability Clause If any part or section of this Act is
16	declared unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect in any manner the
17	other parts or sections hereof.
