AN ACT REQUIRING ALL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES. INSTRUMENTALITIES, LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND AND/OR -CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS (GOCCs) TO USE SECURITY PAPER MADE INDIGENOUS MATERIALS OR FROM WATER-MARKED SECURITY PAPER IN THEIR RECEIPTS AND INVOICES, PERMITS, LICENSES, CLEARANCES, OFFICIAL PAPERS OR DOCUMENTS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Use of Security Paper in all Receipts and Invoices, Permits, Licenses, Clearances, Official Papers or Documents Act of 2011".
- SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to:
  - (a) Enhance tax monitoring and collection;

- SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Act, the following terms are hereby adopted:
- (a) Receipt shall refer to a written admission or acknowledgement of the fact of payment in money or other settlement between seller and buyer of goods, debtor and creditor, or person rendering services and client or customer printed in accordance with these regulations.
- (b) Sales invoice or delivery receipts shall refer to a written account of goods or services rendered and the price charged therefore, or a list of goods consigned and the value at which the consignee is to receive them or any other list by whatever name is known which is used in the ordinary course of business evidencing sale and transfer or agreement to sell or transfer goods and services, such as purchase orders, delivery receipts, job orders, provisional and temporary receipts, and others.
- (c) Security paper shall refer to a security paper which is made from indigenous materials or water-marked security paper which bear such authorized security feature duly etched and embedded in the paper during its manufacturing process. It is especially designed for the printing of official receipts, sales invoices, permits, licenses, clearances and other official papers or documents.
- SEC. 4. Covered Institutions/Establishments. All government agencies and instrumentalities, including government-owned and/or -controlled corporations (GOCCs), and all local government units (LGUs) shall use security paper made from indigenous materials or water-marked security paper in all receipts, invoices, forms, permits, licenses, clearances, official papers and documents which they issue to all natural and juridical persons transacting business with them.
- SEC. 5. Procedure for Printing of Security Paper. The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) through its Banknotes and Securities Printing Department (BSPD), in coordination with said government agencies and instrumentalities, GOCCs and LGUs, shall develop the procedures such that

receipts, invoices, forms, permits, licenses, clearances and other official documents whenever applicable and possible shall be printed on security paper made from indigenous materials or water-marked security paper, the sizes and forms of which shall be uniform.

SEC. 6. Size and Form of Security Paper. — The Department of Finance (DOF), in coordination with the National Printing Office (NPO), shall prescribe and formulate within a period of two (2) months from the effectivity of this Act the appropriate uniform size and forms of the security paper to be used for all transactions of all government agencies and instrumentalities, including GOCCs and LGUs.

SEC. 7. Covered Forms. — All receipts, invoices, permits, licenses, clearances and other official documents of all government agencies and instrumentalities, GOCCs and LGUs shall, after a period of six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act, be printed in security paper made from indigenous materials or water-marked security paper: Provided, That such receipts, invoices, commercial documents, permits, licenses, clearances and all other official documents which remain unused and unconsumed after the lapse of the said six (6)-month period may still be used: Provided, further, That appropriate inventory thereof as confirmed and approved by the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) is conducted and: Provided, finally, That, after a period of six (6) months thereafter, the said unused receipts, invoices, permits, licenses and clearances shall no longer be allowed for use in any transaction in the Philippines.

SEC. 8. Penalty. — Any person who fails to comply with the requirements of this Act, including the parties involved in a transaction where the use of security paper made from indigenous materials or water-marked security paper is prescribed, as well as any government functionary involved in the monitoring or regulating these transactions, shall be subject to all the appropriate sanctions and penalties provided for in the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC) and other pertinent laws, rules and regulations.

SEC. 9. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) The Secretary
of the DOF, in consultation with the Director of the NPO, shall promulgate
appropriate rules and regulations, including the identification and setting of the
standards upon which the security paper shall be sourced and supplied and
such other details as would be necessary and appropriate for the effective
implementation of this Act.

SEC. 10. Separability Clause. — If, for any reason, any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder or any provision hereof not affected thereby shall remain in force and in effect.

SEC. 11. Repealing Clause. — The provisions of any law, executive order, presidential decree or other issuance inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 12. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation, whichever comes earlier.
