AN ACT CONVERTING THE WESTERN VISAYAS SANITARIUM AND LEPROSARIUM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF STA. BARBARA, PROVINCE OF ILOILO INTO THE PRESIDENT DIOSDADO MACAPAGAL MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE FOR TROPICAL MEDICINE, DEFINING ITS POWERS FUNCTIONS, APPROPRIATING AND FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared a policy of 2 the State to protect and promote the right to health, instill health consciousness 3 among the people and advance the integrated and comprehensive approach to 4 health development and research.

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SEC. 2. Conversion into a Research Institute for Tropical Medicine. 6 The Western Visayas Sanitarium and Leprosarium in the Municipality of 7 Sta. Barbara, Province of Iloilo is hereby converted into the President 8 Diosdado Macapagal Memorial Hospital and Research Institute for Tropical Medicine, hereinafter referred to as the Institute. 9

SEC. 3. Scope and Coverage of Tropical Medicine. - For purposes of 1 2 this Act, the scope and coverage of tropical medicine shall pertain to diseases 3 that are specific to the tropics, which is the geographical area between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn, and for diseases that present 4 5 differently in this geographical region as compared to other regions, to wit: 6 gastrointestinal infections, viral hepatitis, bacterial and non-bacterial 7 respiratory infections, amoebiasis, schistosomiasis, filiariasis. malaria. 8 pertussis, diphteria, tetanus, meningitis, maningismus, measles, mumps, herpes, 9 chicken pox, rocky mountain spotted fever, encephalitis, echo-viral diseases, 10 coxachie viral diseases and Philippine hemorrhagic fever: Provided, That the 11 Department of Health (DOH) may include such other pertinent diseases in 12 consultation with the Advisory Board herein created.

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SEC. 4. Organization. – The Institute shall be organized as follows:

14 (a) The Institute shall be operated as a special project of the DOH in the Visayas area. The Secretary of Health shall promulgate policies for and 15 16 exercise overall supervision over the Institute;

17 (b) The Institute shall be headed by an executive director who shall be 18 assisted by two (2) assistant directors, all of whom shall be appointed by the Secretary of the DOH. The executive director shall be responsible for the 19 20 implementation of policies and the immediate management of the programs 21 and operations of the Institute; and

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(c) The assistant directors shall aid the executive director in the performance of his operational duties, and shall perform such other functions 23 24 as may be directed by the executive director. One (1) assistant director shall be 25 tasked to overlook the policy, planning and monitoring activities of the 26 Institute, while the other shall be responsible for support staff services.

27 SEC. 5. Powers and Functions. - The Institute shall have the 28 following powers and functions:

1 (a) Undertake research activities in the diagnosis, control and 2 prevention of tropical diseases that are major causes of mortality and morbidity in the Philippines; 3

(b) Conduct clinical trials aimed at better understanding and control of 4 5 tropical diseases;

(c) Conduct regular training courses for medical and paramedical 6 7 personnel in the control of common tropical diseases not just in the Western 8 Visayas but in the country as well;

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(d) Provide high-quality tertiary care to both inpatients and outpatients 10 suffering from tropical diseases included within the scope of the Institute's 11 research activities;

12 (e) Participate in the technical cooperation program in coordination 13 with the DOH's Research Institute for Tropical Medicine in research activities 14 in the diagnosis, control and prevention of tropical diseases;

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(f) Apply for, receive and accept bequests, grants and donation of funds, equipment, materials and services needed for the attainment of its 16 17 objectives; and

(g) Perform such other related activities as may be assigned by the 18 19 DOH.

20 SEC. 6. Personnel. -The Institute shall have its technical and administrative support. The officers and employees of the Institute shall be 21 appointed by the Secretary of Health, upon recommendation of the Advisory 22 Board, in accordance with existing laws governing such. Consultants may be 23 drawn from the public and private sectors on consultancy or contractual basis 24 25 and shall be granted honoraria or allowances at such amounts as may be - 26 determined in accordance with existing rules and regulations.

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SEC. 7. Advisory Board. - There shall be in the Institute an Advisory 1 Board to be administered under the direction of the Secretary of Health to be 2 composed of the following officials or their duly designated representatives: 3 (a) The Secretary of the DOH or the duly designated representative: 4 (b) The Secretary of the Department of Science and Technology or the 5 duly designated representative: 6 7 (c) The executive director of the Institute: (d) One (1) representative from the association of medical research 8 9 organizations to be appointed by the Secretary of Health: and (e) The chief of hospital. 10 The functions of the Advisory Board shall be: 11 12 (1) Formulate and recommend to the Secretary of Health policies, 13 programs, standards and guidelines for the effective and efficient operation of 14 the Institute: 15 (2) Review, endorse and recommend to the Secretary of Health the 16 annual budget plan: 17 (3) Advise the Institute on creating and implementing its vision and 18 missions: (4) Report annually to the Secretary of Health on its activities and, 19 20 whenever necessary, make recommendations in relation to the performance of 21 the Institute; and (5) Recommend to the Secretary of Health the appointments of officers, 22 23 personnel and consultants. SEC. 8. Biomedical Research Functions. -The functions of the 24 Institute involving biomedical research in tropical medicine will be undertaken 25 26 together with applicable appropriations, records, equipment, property and such 27 personnel as may be necessary.

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1 SEC. 9. Funding. – The Secretary of Health shall immediately include 2 in the Department's programs the implementation of this Act, the initial 3 funding of which shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of 4 the Western Visayas Sanitarium and Leprosarium. Thereafter, the amount 5 necessary for the continued operation of the President Diosdado Macapagal 6 Memorial Hospital and Research Institute for Tropical Medicine shall be 7 included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

8 SEC. 10. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
9 completion of its publication in at least two (2) national newspapers of general
10 circulation.
