AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8491, ENTITLED "AN ACT PRESCRIBING THE CODE OF THE NATIONAL FLAG, ANTHEM, MOTTO, COAT-OF-ARMS AND OTHER HERALDIC ITEMS AND DEVICES OF THE PHILIPPINES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Republic Act No. 8491 is hereby amended to read as
2	follows:
3	"SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as
4	the 'Flag and Heraldic Code of the Philippines'."
5	"SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – IT IS HEREBY
6	DECLARED THE POLICY OF THE STATE THAT [R]Reverence and
7	respect shall at all times be accorded the flag, the anthem, and
8	other national symbols which embody the national ideals and
9	traditions and which express the principles of sovereignty and

national solidarity. The heraldic items and devices shall seek to
 manifest the national virtues and to inculcate in the minds and
 hearts of our people a just pride in their native land, fitting
 respect and affection for the national flag and anthem, and TO
 PRESCRIBE STANDARDS FOR the proper use of the national
 motto, coat-of-arms and other heraldic items and devices."

7 "SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. - Whenever used in this
8 Act, the term:

9 "[(a) "Military" shall mean all branches of the Armed 10 Forces of the Philippines including the Philippine National 11 Police, the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology, and the 12 Bureau of Fire Protection;]

13 "(A) 'ADVERTISEMENT OR INFOMERCIAL' SHALL MEAN ADVERTISEMENT OR ANY INFORMATION MATERIAL IN 14 15 PRINT, RADIO, TELEVISION, CINEMA, VIDEO AND THE LIKE, 16 OUTDOOR AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA, SEEKING TO PROMOTE 17 ENTITIES, PRODUCTS OR SERVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS, 18 COMMERCIAL, POLITICAL PURPOSES OR INFORMATION 19 CAMPAIGNS:

20 "(B) 'DISPLAY' SHALL REFER TO THE MANNER IN
21 WHICH THE FLAG IS PUBLICLY PRESENTED AND VENERATED;

22 "[(b)](C) 'Festoon' shall mean to hang in a curved
23 shape between two points as a decoration, CURTAIN, DRAPE,
24 ETC.;

25 "[(c)](D) 'Flag' shall mean the Philippine National Flag,
26 unless stated otherwise;

27 "[(d)](E) 'Fly' shall mean the part of the flag outside the
28 hoist or length;

1 "[(e) 'Symbol' shall mean any conventional sign which 2 reveals man's achievement and heroism (for orders and 3 decorations), identification, authority and a sign of dignity (for 4 coat-of-arms, logo and insignia);]

"(F) 'GOVERNMENT ENTITIES' SHALL MEAN ALL 5 6 BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT, THEIR BUREAUS AND, 7 ATTACHED AGENCIES, CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICES, LOCAL 8 GOVERNMENT OFFICES, GOVERNMENT-OWNED ÀND/OR 9 -CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS, GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL 10 INSTITUTIONS, EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, AND THE ARMED 11 FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES INCLUDING ITS BASIC 12 COMPONENT UNITS;

13 "[(f)](G) 'Half-Mast' shall mean lowering the flag to onehalf the distance between the top and bottom of the staff[;]. IF
THE FLAG IS DISPLAYED IN A HANGING POSITION OR USED IN A
PARADE AS A SIGN OF MOURNING, HALF-MAST SHALL MEAN
PLACING A BLACK RIBBON ON THE BLUE FIELD HOIST SIDE;

18 "(H) 'HALYARD' SHALL MEAN THE LONG ROPE WHERE
19 THE FLAG FASTENS AND WHICH RUNS UP THE LENGTH OF THE
20 FLAGPOLE;

21 "(I) 'HANGING POSITION' SHALL MEAN THE WHITE
22 FIELD SHALL BE ON TOP, THE BLUE FIELD SHALL BE TO THE
23 RIGHT (LEFT OF THE OBSERVER) IN TIME OF PEACE; THE
24 WHITE FIELD SHALL BE ON TOP, AND THE RED FIELD TO THE
25 RIGHT (LEFT OF THE OBSERVER) IN TIME OF WAR;

26 "(J) 'HERALDIC ITEMS/HERALDIC ITEMS AND
27 DEVICES' SHALL MEAN COAT-OF-ARMS, SEALS, LOGOS,
28 INSIGNIAS, BADGES, FLASHES, PATCHES, ORDERS AND

DECORATIONS, MEDALS, STARS, CITATIONS, LAPEL PINS, 1 TROPHIES, DRY, WAX OR WET SEALS AND IMPRINTS ON 2 3 LETTERHEADS, ENVELOPES AND CARDS; "(g) (K) 'Hoist' shall mean the part of the flag nearest 4 the staff or the canvass to which the halvard is attached; 5 "[(h)](L) 'Inclement Weather' shall mean [that a 6 typhoon signal is raised in the locality] A WEATHER CONDITION 7 SUCH AS RAIN OR STRONG WIND THAT WILL BE UNFAVORABLE 8 9 FOR THE RAISING OF THE FLAG SINCE IT WILL LESSEN THE 10 DIGNITY THAT SHOULD BE ACCORDED TO THE FLAG; "[(i)](M) 'National Anthem' shall mean the Philippine 11 National Anthem, ENTITLED "LUPANG HINIRANG"; .12 "[(i)](N) 'Official Residences' shall mean Malacañang, 13 and other government-owned structures where the President 14 resides. [and other structures occupied by] the Philippine 15 16 Consulates or Embassies abroad, AND OTHER STRUCTURES OCCUPIED BY NATIONAL AND LOCAL PUBLIC OFFICIALS; 17 "[(k)](O) 'Places of Frivolity' shall mean places of 18 hilarity marked by or providing boisterous merriment or 19 recreation; [and] 20 "[(1) 'Institute' shall mean the National Historical 21 Institute. 22 "(P) 'PHILIPPINE SUN' SHALL MEAN THE GOLDEN 23 SUNBURST WITH EIGHT (8) EQUALLY SPACED RAYS DISPLAYED 24 25 IN THE FLAG. EACH RAY HAVING ONE (1) MAJOR BEAM, TWICE AS BROAD AS THE TWO (2) MINOR BEAMS ON EITHER SIDE; 26

"(Q) 'SYMBOL' SHALL MEAN ANY CONVENTIONAL
 SIGN WHICH REVEALS MAN'S ACHIEVEMENT AND HEROISM
 USUALLY SHOWN OR DISPLAYED IN MEDALS, CITATIONS,
 ORDERS, AND DECORATIONS OR IDENTIFICATION OR
 AUTHORITY SUCH AS COAT-OF-ARMS, LOGOS AND INSIGNIAS;

6 "(R) – **'UNIFORMED** SERVICE' SHALL MEAN ALL 7 BRANCHES OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE PHILIPPINES, 8 THOSE OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, THE BUREAU 9 OF JAIL MANAGEMENT AND PENOLOGY, THE BUREAU OF 10 FIRE PROTECTION, THE BUREAU OF IMMIGRATION, THE 11 BUREAU OF CUSTOMS, THE PHILIPPINE COAST GUARD AND OF 12 OTHER AGENCIES USING RANK INSIGNIA;

13 "(S) 'VEXILLARY ITEMS' SHALL MEAN NATIONAL,
14 LOCAL, HOUSE FLAGS, OR ADMINISTRATIVE, INSTITUTIONAL,
15 CORPORATE, AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONAL BANNERS; AND

16 "(T) "100 TO 120 METRONOME" SHALL MEAN THE
17 REGULATED AURAL, VISUAL OR TACTILE PULSE TO ESTABLISH
18 A STEADY TEMPO IN THE RENDITION OF THE NATIONAL
19 ANTHEM."

20 "CHAPTER I
21 "THE NATIONAL FLAG
22 "[A. Design of the National Flag]
23 "SEC. 4. DESIGN OF THE NATIONAL FLAG. – The flag of
24 the Philippines shall be blue, white and red with an eight-rayed
25 golden-yellow sun and three five-pointed stars, as consecrated
26 and honored by the people."

"[B. Hoisting and Display of the National Flag]

"SEC. 5. HOISTING AND DISPLAY OF THE NATIONAL FLAG. – The flag shall be HOISTED OR displayed in all public buildings, official residences, public plazas, and institutions of learning every day throughout the year."

6 "SEC. 6. WHERE FLAG SHOULD BE PERMANENTLY 7 **DISPLAYED.** – The flag shall be permanently hoisted, day and 8 night throughout the year, in front of the following; [at] (A) Malacañang Palace; [the Congress of the Philippines] (B) 9 10 SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES BUILDING; (C) HOUSE OF 11 **REPRESENTATIVES** building: (D) Supreme Court building: [the] 12 (E) Rizal Monument in Luneta, CITY OF Manila; (F) Aguinaldo 13 Shrine in Kawit, Cavite; (G) Barasoain Shrine in Malolos, 14 Bulacan; [the] (H) Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Libingan ng 15 mga Bayani IN TAGUIG CITY, METRO MANILA; (I) ALL 16 MEMORIALS DEDICATED TO THE VETERANS OF THE MILITARY; 17 (J) Musoleo de los Veteranos dela Revolucion IN THE NORTH CEMETERY, CITY OF MANILA; (K) MARCELA AGONCILLO 18 19 HISTORICAL LANDMARK TAAL, IN BATANGAS; 20 (L) PINAGLABANAN HISTORICAL LANDMARK IN SAN JUAN 21 CITY, METRO MANILA; (M) all International Ports of Entry; and 22 (N) all other places as may be SUBSEQUENTLY designated AND MARKED by the [Institute] National Historical Institute (NHI). 23

24 "The flag, ON THE ABOVE-STATED PLACES, shall be25 properly illuminated at night."

"SEC. 7. DISPLAY OF FLAG IN PRIVATE BUILDINGS AND 1 2 **OFFICES.** – The flag shall also be displayed in private buildings and residences or raised [in the open on flag-staffs] ON 3 4 FLAGPOLES in front of said buildings [every April 9 (Araw ng 5 Kagitingan); May 1 (Labor Day); May 28 (National Flag Day) to June 12 (Independence Day); last Sunday of August (National 6 7 Heroes Day); November 30 (Bonifacio Day); and December 30 8 (Rizal Day); and on such other days as may be declared by the President and/or local chief executives] DURING FLAG DAYS, AS 9 10 PROVIDED IN SECTION 25 OF THIS ACT.

11 "The flag may also be displayed throughout the year in 12 private buildings or offices or raised [in the open on flag-staffs] 13 ON FLAGPOLES in front of private buildings: *Provided*, That 14 [they] THE OCCUPANTS OF THE SAID BUILDING SHALL observe 15 flag-raising ceremonies in accordance with the IMPLEMENTING 16 rules and regulations (IRR) to be issued by the [Office of the 17 President] NHL."

"[SEC. 8. All government agencies and instrumentalities,
and local government offices, government-owned corporations
and local government units are enjoined to observe flag day with
appropriate ceremonies. Socio-civic groups, non-government
organizations and the private sector are exhorted to cooperate in
making the celebrations a success.]"

1	"SEC. [9]8. DISPLAY OF FLAG ON SEAFARING VESSELS.
2	- The flag shall be flown on [merchant ships] ALL SEAFARING
3	VESSELS of Philippine registry [of more than one thousand
4	(1,000) gross tons and on all naval vessels].
5	"On board [naval] SEAFARING vessels, the flag shall be
6	displayed on the flag-staff at the stern when the ship is at anchor.
7	The flag shall be hoisted to the gaff at the aftermast when the
8	ship is at sea."
9	"SEC. [10]9. THE BLUE, RED AND WHITE FIELDS OF
10	THE FLAG The flag, if [flown from a flagpole,] HOISTED shall
11	have its blue field on top in time of peace and the red field on top
12	in time of war; if in a hanging position, THE WHITE FIELD
13	SHALL BE ON TOP, the blue field shall be to the right (left of the
14	observer) in time of peace, THE WHITE FIELD SHALL BE ON TOP,
15	and the red field to the right (left of the observer) in time of war.
16	"[The flagpole staff must be straight and slightly tapering
17	at the top.]"
18	"SEC. [11]10. FLAGPOLE IN THE OPEN FIELD If
19	planted on the ground, the flagpole shall be at a prominent place
20	and shall be of such height as would give the flag commanding
21	position in relation to the buildings in the vicinity. THE
22	FLAGPOLE STAFF MUST BE STRAIGHT AND SLIGHTLY
23	TAPERING AT THE TOP.

1	"If attached to a building, the flagpole shall be on top of
2	its roof or anchored on a sill projecting at an angle upward.
3	"If on a stage or platform or government office, the flag
4	shall be at the left OF THE OBSERVER (facing the stage) or the
5	left of the office upon entering."
6	"SEC. [12]11. THE PHILIPPINE FLAG WHEN FLOWN
7	WITH ANOTHER FLAG When the Philippine flag is flown with
8	another flag, the flags, if both are national flags, must be flown
9	on separate staffs of the same height and shall be of equal size.
10	The Philippine flag shall be TO THE LEFT OF THE OBSERVER
11	AND hoisted first and lowered last.
12	"If the other flag is not a national flag, it may be flown
13	DURING SPECIAL OCCASIONS in the same [lineyard] HALYARD
14	as the Philippine flag but below the latter and it cannot be of
15	greater size than the Philippine flag."
16	"SEC. [13]12. THE PHILIPPINE FLAG WHEN DISPLAYED
17	WITH ANOTHER FLAG When displayed with another flag, the
18	Philippine flag shall be on the right of the other flag (LEFT OF
19	THE OBSERVER). If there is a line of other flags, the Philippine
20	flag shall be [in the middle of the line] AT THE LEFTMOST OF
21	THE OBSERVER.
22	"When carried in a parade with flags which are not
23	national flags, the Philippine flag shall be in front of the center of
24	the line.

1"Additional protocol for the display of the2Philippine flag shall be contained in the IRR to be3issued by the NHI pursuant to the common provisions4stated in this Act."

"SEC. [14]13. PROPER USE. DISPOSAL 5 AND **REPLACEMENT OF WORN OUT FLAG. - THE FLAG SHALL BE** 6 7 REPLACED IMMEDIATELY BY THE CONCERNED 8 AGENCY/INSTITUTION/OFFICE WHEN IT BEGINS TO SHOW SIGNS 9 OF WEAR AND TEAR.

"[A] THE flag worn out through wear and tear[,] shall not 10 11 be thrown away. It shall be TURNED OVER TO THE APPROPRIATE BOY SCOUTS OR GIRL SCOUTS LOCAL COUNCIL 12 COMMITTEE FOUND IN THE NEAREST SCHOOL WHO SHALL 13 14 CONDUCT PROPER DISPOSAL RITES ON THE WORN OUT FLAG/S [solemnly burned] to avoid misuse or desecration. [The flag 15 shall be replaced immediately when it begins to show signs of 16 17 wear and tear.

18 "THE MANNER OF DISPOSAL OF THE WORN OUT FLAG
19 SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES TO BE ISSUED BY
20 THE NHI."

21 "SEC. [15]14. APPROPRIATE TIME FOR FLAG RAISING
22 AND LOWERING. - The flag shall be raised at sunrise and lowered
23 at sunset. It shall be on the mast at the start of official office
24 hours, AND shall remain flying throughout the day."

"SEC. [16]15. MANNER OF DISPLAYING THE FLAG. -1 The flag may be displayed: 2 3 "(a) Inside or outside a building or on stationary OR 4 MOVABLE flagpoles. If the flag is displayed indoors on a 5 flagpole, it shall be placed at the left of the observer as one 6 enters the room; "(b) From the top of a flagpole, which shall be at a 7 8 prominent place or a commanding position in relation to the 9 surrounding buildings; 10 "(c) From a staff projecting upward from the window 11 sill, canopy, balcony or facade of a building: 12 "(d) In a suspended position from a rope extending from a building OR LAMPOST to A pole erected away from the 13 14 building: 15 "(e) Flat against the wall vertically with the sun and stars 16 on top; and 17 "(f) Hanging in a vertical position across a street, with 18 the blue field pointing east, if the road is heading south or north, 19 or pointing north if the road is heading east or west. "The flag shall not be raised when the weather is 20 inclement] DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER. If already raised 21 PRIOR TO INCLEMENT WEATHER, the flag shall not be lowered." 22 23 "SEC. [17]16. MANNER OF HOISTING THE FLAG. -- The 24 flag shall be hoisted to the top briskly and lowered 25 ceremoniously.

1	"The flag shall never touch anything beneath it, such as
2	the ground, flood, water or other objects.
3	"After being lowered, the flag shall be handled and folded
4	solemnly as part of the ceremony."
5	"[C. Conduct of Flag Raising Ceremony]
6	"SEC. [18]17. FLAG CEREMONY IN PUBLIC OFFICES
7	AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS All government offices and
8	educational institutions shall henceforth observe the flag-raising
9	ceremony every Monday morning and the flag lowering
10	ceremony every Friday afternoon. The ceremony shall be simple
11	and dignified and shall include the playing [or] AND
12	MANDATORY singing of the Philippine National Anthem."
13	"[SEC. 19. The Office of the President upon the
14	recommendation of the Institute shall issue rules and regulations
15	for the proper conduct of the flag ceremony.]"
16	"SEC. [20]18. DIGNITY IN THE OBSERVANCE OF FLAG
17	CEREMONY The observance of the flag ceremony in official or
18	civic gatherings shall be simple and dignified and shall include
19	the playing [or] AND MANDATORY singing of the NATIONAL
20	anthem in its original Filipino lyrics and march tempo."
21	"SEC. [21]19. FLAG-RAISING CEREMONY During the
22	flag-raising ceremony, the assembly shall stand in formation
23	facing the flag. At the moment the first note of the anthem is
24	heard, everyone in the premises shall come to attention; moving
25	vehicles shall stop. All persons present shall place their right
26	palms over their chest, those with hats shall uncover; while those

.

1 in military, scouting, security guard, and citizens military training 2 uniforms shall give the salute prescribed by their regulations, 3 which salute shall be completed upon the last note of the anthem. "The assembly shall sing the Philippine [n] National 4 5 [a]Anthem, accompanied by a band, if available, and at the first 6 note, the flag shall be raised briskly. 7 "The same procedure shall be observed when the flag is 8 passing in review or in parade." "SEC. [22]20. FLAG-LOWERING CEREMONY. - During 9 the flag lowering, the flag shall be lowered solemnly and slowly 10 11 so that the flag shall be down the mast at the sound of the last 12 note of the anthem. Those in the assembly shall observe the 13 same deportment or shall observe the same behavior as for the flag-raising ceremony." 14 "[D. Half-Mast] 15 "SEC. [23]21. FLAG IN HALF-MAST. - The flag shall be 16 flown at half-mast as a sign of mourning on all the buildings and 17 places [where it is displayed, as provided for in this Act] WHERE 18 19 THE DECEASED WAS HOLDING OFFICE, on the day of official 20 announcement of the death of any of the following officials: 21 "(a) The President or a former President, THE FLAG 22 SHALL BE FLOWN AT HALF-MAST for ten (10) days; 23 "(b) The Vice President, the Chief Justice, the President 24 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, 25 THE FLAG SHALL BE FLOWN AT HALF-MAST for seven (7) days: 26 and

"(c) [Other persons to be determined by the Institute,] THE INCUMBENT MEMBERS OF THE SUPREME COURT, THE 2 3 CABINET, THE SENATE OR THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND SUCH OTHER PERSONS AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE 4 5 NHI, THE FLAG SHALL BE FLOWN AT HALF-MAST for any period less than seven (7) days. 6

"The flag shall be flown at half-mast on all the buildings and places where the decedent was holding office, on the day of death until the day of interment of an incumbent member of the Supreme Court, the Cabinet, the Senate or the House of Representatives, and such other persons as may be determined by the Institute.

"The flag when flown at half-mast shall be first hoisted to 13 the peak for a moment then lowered to the half-mast position. 14 15 The flag shall again be raised to the peak before it is lowered for 16 the day."

"[E, Casket]

"SEC. [24]22. FLAG OVER THE CASKET. - The flag may 18 19 be used to cover the caskets of the honored dead of the military, veterans of previous wars, national artists, and of civilians who 20 have rendered distinguished service to the nation, as may be 21 22 determined by the local government unit concerned. In such cases, the flag shall be placed such that the white triangle shall 23 be at the head and the blue portion shall cover the right side of 24 the caskets. The flag shall not be lowered to the grave or 25 allowed to touch the ground, but shall be folded solemnly and 26 [handled] HANDED over to the heirs of the deceased." 27

1	"[F. Pledge to the Flag]
2	"SEC. [25]23. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE The following
3	shall be the Pledge of Allegiance to the Philippine flag:
4	"Ako ay Pilipino
5	Buong katapatang nanunumpa
6	Sa watawat ng Pilipinas
7	At sa bansang kanyang sinasagisag
8	Na may dangal, katarungan at kalayaan

14	"[Such pledge] THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE
15	PHILIPPINE FLAG shall be recited while standing with the right
16	hand with palm open raised shoulder high. Individuals whose
17	faith or religious beliefs prohibit them from making such pledge
18	must nonetheless show full respect when the pledge is being
19	rendered by standing at attention."
20	"SEC. 24. OATH OF PATRIOTISM THE FOLLOWING
21	SHALL BE THE OATH OF PATRIOTISM TO THE PHILIPPINES
22	WHICH SHALL BE RECITED BY STUDENTS IN ALL LEVELS IN
23	ADDITION TO THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE
24	Philippine flag:
25	"INIIBIG KO ANG PILIPINAS.
26	ITO ANG AKING LUPANG SINILANGAN.
27	ITO ANG TAHANAN NG AKING LAHI.

16	EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS AFTER THE SINGING OF THE
17	NATIONAL ANTHEM. INDIVIDUALS WHOSE FAITH OR
18	RELIGIOUS BELIEFS PROHIBIT THEM FROM MAKING SUCH
19	PLEDGE MUST, NONETHELESS, SHOW FULL RESPECT WHEN

9 "SEC. 26. OBSERVANCE OF FLAG DAYS. - ALL 10 GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND INSTRUMENTALITIES, LOCAL 11 OFFICES, GOVERNMENT GOVERNMENT-OWNED 12 CORPORATIONS AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS ARE 13 ENJOINED TO OBSERVE FLAG DAY WITH APPROPRIATE 14 CEREMONIES. SOCIO-CIVIC GROUPS, NON-GOVERNMENT 15 ORGANIZATIONS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR ARE EXHORTED TO COOPERATE IN MAKING THE CELEBRATION A SUCCESS." 16

"[H. Specifications of the National Flag] 17 18 "SEC. 27. FLAG PROPORTIONS. - The flag shall have the 19 following proportions. The width of the flag, ONE (1); the length 20 of the flag, TWO (2); and sides of the white triangle, ONE (1)." "SEC. 28. FLAG TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS. - The 21 22 technical specifications OF THE FLAG shall be as follows: 23 "The blue color shall bear Cable No. 80173; the white color, Cable No. 80001; the red color, Cable No. 80108; and the 24

25 golden yellow, Cable No. 80068."

"SEC. 29. STANDARDS FOR FLAG REQUISITION. -- In order to establish uniform criteria in the making of our national flag and to guarantee its durability by the use of quality materials, the following standards and procedures shall be observed:

6 "(a) All requisitions for the purchase of the Philippine 7 National Flag must be based on strict compliance with the 8 design, color, craftsmanship and material requirements of the 9 [G]Government;

"(b) 10 All submitted samples of flags by accredited suppliers offered for purchase for government use shall be 11 12 evaluated as to design, color and craftsmanship specifications by 13 the [Institute] NHI, through its Heraldry and Display Section, 14 which shall stamp its approval or disapproval on the canvass reinforcement of the flag sample submitted. The samples shall be 25 sent annually to the ITDI/PTRI by the manufacturer. The laboratory test results shall be submitted by the said office to the 26 27 Institute NHI."

3	"SEC. [35]34. TITLE OF THE NATIONAL ANTHEM The
4	National Anthem is entitled Lupang Hinirang."
5	"SEC. [36]35. LANGUAGE AND LYRICS OF THE
6	NATIONAL ANTHEM The National Anthem shall always be
7	sung in the national language within or [without] OUTSIDE the
8	country. The following shall be the lyrics of the National
9	Anthem:

RENDITION OF THE NATIONAL ANTHEM. 3 - The rendition of the National Anthem, whether played or 4 5 sung, shall be in accordance with the musical arrangement and 6 composition of Julian Felipe. SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH 7 THE MUSICAL ARRANGEMENT AND COMPOSITION OF JULIAN 8 FELIPE, IN 2/4 BEAT WHEN PLAYED; AND WITHIN THE RANGE 9 OF 100 TO 120 METRONOME, IN 4/4 BEAT WHEN SUNG. 23 is none, they shall face the band or the conductor. At the first

"SEC. [39]38. STRICT COMPLIANCE WITH RULES FOR 23 THE RENDITION OF THE NATIONAL ANTHEM. - All officials and 24 25 employees of the national and local governmentS, and any 26 agency or instrumentality thereof, including government-owned or -controlled corporations, privately-owned entities or offices 27

displaying the national flag and government institutions of

PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATIONS. - Any 3 person WHO or ANY juridical entity which violates any of the 4 5 provisions of this Act shall, upon conviction, be punished by a 6 fine of not less than [Five] FIFTY thousand pesos [(P5,000)] (PHP50,000.00) nor more than [Twenty] ONE 7 8 HUNDRED thousand pesos [(P20,000)] (PHP100,000.00) [, or] 9 AND by imprisonment for not more than [one (1) year.] TWO (2) YEARS: [or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of 10 11 the court: Provided. ISSUANCE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS 6 AND THEIR ENFORCEMENT. - The [Institute] NHI shall issue 7 the necessary rules and regulations [to implement the provisions 8 of this Act] within ninety (90) days after [effectivity] THE 9 APPROVAL OF THIS ACT. The [Institute] NHI shall submit its 10 11 rules and regulations to the Office of the President and the 12 Congress of the Philippines. "[SEC. 52.] The [Institute] NHI shall [also] be 13 14 responsible for the strict enforcement of the provisions of this Act. It may call upon any government department, agency, 15 office, or government instrumentality, including government 16 17 corporations, and local government units, for such assistance as it may deem necessary for the effective discharge of its functions 18 under this Act." 19 SEC. 2. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any portion or 20 provision of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional, the other parts or 21 provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full 22 force and effect. 23 SEC. 3. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules 24 and regulations, part or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this 25

26 Act, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 4. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from
 the date of its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2)
 newspapers of general circulation, whichever comes earlier.
