AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE PASONANCA WATERSHED FOREST RESERVE LOCATED IN ZAMBOANGA CITY AS A PROTECTED AREA UNDER THE CATEGORY OF NATURAL PARK, PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

CHAPTER I

2	INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS
3	SECTION 1. Title This Act shall be known as the "Pasonanca Natural
4	Park Act of 2011".
5	SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy Considering the importance of the
6	Pasonanca Watershed Forest Reserve's unique biological resources and its
7	aesthetic, sociocultural, economic and ecological importance, it is hereby
8	declared the policy of the State to further secure its protection and
9	conservation, including the people and the communities residing therein as
10	well as their way of life. For this reason, the State shall protect and conserve

its biodiversity; advance, respect and protect the customs and interests of its legitimate inhabitants; and foster partnerships among government, nongovernment organizations (NGOs) and people's organizations (POs).

 SEC. 3. Scope. — The Pasonanca Natural Park, including its buffer zone, covers a total area of about seventeen thousand four hundred fourteen (17,414) hectares. Its technical description, subject to actual ground survey and demarcation, begins at a point marked "1" which is S. 11° 27' W., at one thousand nine hundred four point eighty-eight (1,904.88) meters from FNSP-ZS 75 Ashtech point monument;

SEC. 4. Land Classification. — Subject to private rights if there be any, all lands of the public domain declared within the coverage and scope of the Pasonanca Natural Park shall fall under the land classification of national park: *Provided, however*, That the present land classification of any area within its buffer zone, as defined and delimited herein, shall be retained and is hereby respected.

SEC. 5. Definition of Terms. - For purposes of this Act, the following terms are defined as follows:

٠.

- (a) Biodiversity or biological diversity shall refer to the variability among living organisms, including genetic and structural differences, including the variability within and between species, and within and between ecosystems.
- (b) Buffer zone shall refer to identified areas outside the boundaries of and immediately adjacent to designated protected areas pursuant to Section 8 of Republic Act No. 7586 or the "National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992" that need special development control in order to avoid or minimize harm to the protected area.
- (c) Conservation shall refer to the optimum utilization and management of natural resources in order to meet the needs and aspirations of the present and the future.
- (d) Environmental Impact Assessment shall refer to the procedures undertaken pursuant to the Environmental Impact Assessment System established under Presidential Decree No. 1586 or supervening legislation.
- (e) Integrated Protected Area Fund shall refer to the trust fund which shall be established for purposes of financing projects of the protected area.
- (f) Management plan shall refer to the fundamental plan, strategy and/or scheme which shall guide all activities relating to the Pasonanca Natural Park in order to attain the objectives of this Act as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (g) Multiple-use zone shall refer to areas identified in a plan or map where settlement, traditional and/or sustainable land-use, including agriculture, agro-forestry, extraction activities and other income generating or livelihood activities, may be allowed to the extent prescribed in the management plan. Within multiple-use zones, land tenure may be granted to actual residents,

whether members of indigenous communities or migrants residing or occupying any land within the protected area and acknowledged as members of the local community.

- (h) National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) shall refer to the classification and administration of all designated protected areas to maintain essential ecological processes and life-support systems, to preserve genetic diversity, to ensure sustainable use of resources found therein and to maintain their natural conditions to the greatest extent possible.
- (i) National park shall refer to one (1) of the four (4) classifications of lands of the public domain, the others being agricultural, forest or timber and mineral lands, pursuant to the Philippine Constitution.
- (j) Natural park shall refer to a relatively large area not materially altered by human activity where extractive resource uses are not allowed, and maintained to protect outstanding natural and scenic areas of national or international significance for scientific, educational and recreational use.
 - (k) PAMB shall refer to the Protected Area Management Board.
- (l) Protected area shall refer to identified portions of land and water set aside by reason of their unique physical and biological significance managed to enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human exploitation.
- (m) Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) shall refer to the chief operating officer of the Pasonanca Natural Park and its buffer zones.
- (n) Recreation zone shall refer to an area of high recreational, tourism, educational or environmental awareness value where ecotourism, recreational, conservation, educational or public awareness activities may be allowed.
- (o) Restoration zone shall refer to an area of degraded habitat or where the long-term goal is to restore natural habitat with its associated biodiversity

and to rezone the area to a more strict protection level, and excludes the use or introduction of exotic species in the restoration process.

- (p) Stakeholders shall refer to individuals, communities, organizations or aggrupation of specific interests or sectors which have particular interest in the achievement of the objectives of this Act or which, through time, has established dependence, access or utilization of resources within the protected area such as, but not limited to, the local government units (LGUs), the NGOs, the POs, the indigenous cultural communities, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and other concerned government agencies.
- (q) Strict protection zone shall refer to an area with a high biodiversity value, which shall be closed to all human activity except for scientific studies and/or ceremonial or religious use by indigenous communities.
- (r) Tenured migrant communities shall refer to communities within protected areas, which have actually and continuously occupied such areas for five (5) years before their designation as protected areas in accordance with the NIPAS Act and are solely dependent therein for subsistence.

PROTECTED AREA MANAGEMENT

SEC. 6. Management Mechanism. – The management and administration of the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be consultative and participatory. The sole policy-making authority is vested in the PAMB, which shall be chaired by the DENR Regional Executive Director (RED) for Region IX. From time to time, the PAMB may also create committees to which it may delegate some of its powers and functions. The PASu shall be the chief operating officer of the Pasonanca Natural Park and its buffer zones.

SEC. 7. The Protected Area Management Board (PAMB). — The PAMB shall be composed of the following:

(a) The DENR RED for Region IX, who shall sit as PAMB

3	(b) The mayor of Zamboanga City or his/her duly designated

5	(c) The chairperson of the Committee on Natural Resources and

9	(ZCWD) or his/her duly designated representative, as member;			
10	(e) The city planning and development officer of Zamboanga City, as

12	(f) The barangay chairperson in Zamboanga City whose areas of			
13	jurisdiction are within the protected area, as members;			
14	(g) Three (3) representatives from Zamboanga City-based NGOs and			
15	community organizations, including POs, church or civic organizations, with			
16	interests within the protected area;			
17	(h) Three (3) representatives from national government agencies with			
18	offices in Zamboanga City, involved in protected area management or whose			
19	mandate affects the protection and conservation of the park, to be appointed			
20	by the DENR Secretary upon the recommendation of their respective heads of			
21	office; and			
22	(i) Three (3) representatives from local stakeholders, who can assist			
23	and contribute in the protection and conservation of the park, to be appointed			
24	by the DENR Secretary.			
25	In selecting the representatives from the NGOs and the POs, the			
26	following criteria shall be primarily considered:			

(1) Active involvement in the ecological conservation, preservation,

rehabilitation and protection of the park;

1	(2) Good potential in community organizing and other development
2	works;
3	(3) Favorable track record in community work; and
4	(4) Duly accredited by the local government of Zamboanga City and
5	the DENR.
6	SEC. 8. Term of Office of PAMB Members Except for the
7	government officials who shall serve ex officio and whose term of office as
8	PAMB members are coterminous with their employment in the agency being
9	represented, the members of the PAMB shall be appointed by the DENR
10	Secretary and shall serve for a term of five (5) years: Provided, That said
11	PAMB members remain connected with the organization being represented.
12	Whenever a vacancy occurs during the term of a PAMB member who is not a

The members of the PAMB shall not receive any compensation but shall be entitled to reasonable *per diem* in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

government agency representative, a new member shall be chosen in the same

manner as the original selection process: Provided, further, That the substitute

shall only serve for the remaining term.

- SEC. 9. Duties and Functions of the PAMB. As the highest policy-making body for the protected area, the PAMB shall exercise the following powers and functions:
- (a) Approve or decide on all matters related to or based on the approved management plan, proposals, work and action plans, resource protection, delineation and demarcation of protected area boundaries, buffer zones, ancestral domains, recognition of rights and privileges, and guidelines and policies for the management and conservation of the protected area;

(b) Review and adopt the management plan and development program and their implementing rules and regulations, and ensure strict compliance therewith;

- (c) Control and regulate the construction and maintenance of roads, trails, waterworks, sewerage, fire protection and sanitation systems and other utilities within the park;
- (d) Control and supervise the office of the PASu and monitor and evaluate the performance of the protected area personnel, NGOs and communities involved in conservation and development work;
- (e) Issue all necessary permits within the park, including its buffer zones, and collect reasonable fees therefor in accordance with the management plan and consistent with the conservation and protection of the park. The PAMB may delegate this authority to the PASu under proper guidelines;
- (f) Deputize, through the PASu, individuals for the enforcement of all laws, rules and regulations governing conduct within the park and its buffer zones, and prescribe the qualifications therefor;
- (g) Accept donations and grants and approve proposals for funding and budget allocation, and exercise accountability over all funds that may accrue;
- (h) Coordinate with the appropriate agencies of the government, local or national, on all matters related to the protection and conservation of the protected area and its buffer zones, and request their assistance for the same purpose;
- (i) Retain a legal counsel, either on permanent, temporary or part-time basis, to defend cases against the PAMB, the PASu office and staff, and deputized individuals whenever they are sued in connection with the performance of their duties under this Act, and to assist the PAMB on all legal matters; and

(j) Adopt rules and procedures for the conduct of business, including the creation of committees to which certain powers of the PAMB may be delegated.

 The DENR, through the RED for Region IX, shall ensure that the PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of conflict between administrative orders issued by the DENR pursuant to Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the "National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992", the rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto and other relevant laws on environmental protection and natural resources management and the resolutions and issuances of the PAMB, the DENR Secretary shall decide as to which rule, regulation or resolution shall prevail.

SEC. 10. Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office. — There is hereby established a PASu office in charge of the management, protection and administration of the protected area. The PASu office shall be supported by the existing personnel of the DENR. The head of office shall be the chief operating officer of the Pasonanca Natural Park and shall be accountable to the DENR RED for Region IX and the PAMB. The PASu shall have the following powers and functions:

- (a) Prepare the management plan and its successor plans as herein provided;
- (b) Serve as secretariat to the PAMB with the duty to provide the PAMB with all information necessary to make appropriate decisions for the implementation of this Act;
- (c) Supervise the necessary personnel to support operations as the budget may allow;
- (d) Establish a productive partnership with local communities, including groups supporting the achievement of the goals and objectives of this Act;

(e) Develop and implement park information, education and visitor programs;

- (f) Enforce the laws, rules and regulations and PAMB resolutions relevant to the protected area and its buffer zones, and assist in the prosecution of offenses;
- (g) Monitor all activities within the protected area and its buffer zones in conformity with the management plan; and
 - (h) Perform such other functions as the PAMB may assign.
- SEC. 11. Management Plan. Within one (1) year from the effectivity of this Act, the PASu shall prepare a management plan in accordance with the General Management Planning Strategy (GMPS) and in coordination with the appropriate offices of the DENR, local communities, the city government of Zamboanga, NGOs, other government agencies and available experts with socio-environmental, economics and ecological experience in the area. The plan shall contain, among others, the following:
- (a) The period of its applicability, at least for ten (10) years, subject to review anytime as may be determined necessary by the PAMB;
- (b) The analysis of key management issues and problems considered as threats to conservation, management and maintenance, including impacts on the important features of the area;
- (c) Broad and long-term vision in the form of goals, a "vision statement", guiding policies for management, sets of objectives and specific statements on what management can achieve within the timeframe of the plan;
 - (d) Site management strategies;
- (e) Zoning plan, illustrating the boundaries, classification and management of specific zones and other activities allowed or prohibited for each zone;

(f) Management programs to include the enforcement of laws, habitat and wildlife management, ecotourism, sustainable use of resources, infrastructure development and maintenance, fire prevention and pest control:

- (g) Mechanisms for the protection of tenured migrants in the exercise of their rights;
 - (h) Sustainable and non-destructive livelihood activities; and
- (i) Regulations in the furtherance of the preservation and conservation objectives, such as the scheme in the issuance of permits and rules on the restrictions of resource use.

The management plan shall be reviewed and adopted by the PAMB and certified by the DENR Secretary that it conforms to all laws, rules and regulations issued by the DENR. In no case shall the management plan be revised or modified without the prior approval of the PAMB and in accordance with the procedures herein set forth.

One (1) year before the expiration of the management plan, the office of the PASu shall prepare a successor management plan which shall be done in the same manner as the procedure and principles herein set forth and in accordance with the GMPS. In the same period, the PASu shall cause the publication of notices for comments and suggestions on the successor plan in a newspaper of local circulation and the posting of such notices in the city and barangay halls of the barangay units comprising the protected area and in three (3) other conspicuous places frequented by the public within the protected area. At least two (2) public hearings shall be conducted on the successor plan.

The management plan shall be written in English and Chabacano, plainly written and available for public perusal at the office of the PASu.

SEC. 12. Management Zoning. - Management zones shall be established in the protected area to provide protection for critical or

representative habitats. Within each management zone, similar management emphasis shall be applied, comparable levels of use shall be permitted and different uses shall be segregated. Each management zone shall be demarcated on the ground and indicated on the maps after undertaking such steps as land and resource-use mapping and dialogue with the communities. the city government of Zamboanga and other stakeholders. Within each zone. management prescriptions shall be reasonably uniform but may differ in type or intensity from those in other zones in order to accommodate multiple objectives.

10 CHAPTER III

TENURED MIGRANTS

SEC. 13. Tenured Migrants. — Any person who has been actually and continuously occupying an area within the Pasonanca Natural Park for a period of five (5) years prior to the issuance of Proclamation No. 199, dated December 17, 1987, proclaiming the Pasonanca Watershed Forest Reservation, and is solely dependent on the protected area for subsistence shall be considered a tenured migrant.

A tenured migrant shall be eligible to become a steward of a reasonable portion of land within the multiple-use or buffer zones of the Pasonanca Natural Park from which he may derive subsistence: *Provided, however,* That current occupants who do not qualify as tenured migrants shall be resettled outside the protected area.

The PAMB shall review all tenure instruments, land claims or permits issued for resource-use within the protected area, if any, and recommend the issuance of appropriate tenure instrument consistent with the management or successor plans. Those who have been cultivating land within the protected area shall be considered to be occupying such lands and shall be entitled to a tenure instrument limited to cultivation and residence: *Provided*. That the

rights accruing under such tenure instrument can only be transferred to direct descendants.

Nothing herein shall be construed to mean any diminution of accrued rights earned by tenured migrants. If areas occupied by tenured migrants are designated as zones in which no occupation or other activities are allowed, they shall be transferred to multiple-use areas or to the buffer zones under just and humane conditions.

In the event of termination of a tenure instrument for cause or by voluntary surrender of rights, the PASu shall take immediate steps to rehabilitate the area in order to return it to its approximate natural state prior to cultivation or other act by the tenured migrant.

SEC. 14. Existing Rights. — All prior property and private rights within the protected area and its buffer zones and ancestral domains already existing and/or vested prior to the effectivity of this Act shall be protected and respected in accordance with existing laws.

CHAPTER IV

PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES

SEC. 15. Special Prosecutor. — Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Justice (DOJ) shall appoint a special prosecutor to whom all cases of violation of laws, rules and regulations in the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be assigned. Such special prosecutor shall coordinate with the PAMB and the PASu in the performance of his/her duties and assist in the training of park personnel in arrest and criminal procedures. The PAMB shall periodically submit an evaluation of the performance of the special prosecutor of the DOJ.

SEC. 16. Prohibited Acts. – Except as may be allowed by the nature of their categories and pursuant to the rules and regulations governing the same, the following acts are prohibited within the Pasonanca Natural Park:

(a) Hunting, destroying, disturbing or mere possession of any plant or animal and any product derived therefrom without a permit from the PAMB:

- (b) Dumping of any waste product or any form of activity detrimental to the protected area, or to the plants and animals or inhabitants therein;
- (c) Use of any vehicle or equipment within the protected area without a permit from the PAMB;
- (d) Mutilating, defacing or destroying objects of natural beauty or objects of interest to cultural communities;
 - (e) Damaging or leaving roads and trails in a damaged condition;
 - (f) Squatting, undertaking mineral exploration or otherwise occupying any portion of land;
 - (g) Constructing or maintaining any kind of structure, fence or enclosure, or conducting any business enterprise without a permit duly issued by the PAMB; and
- (h) Altering, removing, destroying or defacing boundary marks or signs.
- SEC. 17. Penalties. Any person found guilty of any offense enumerated above shall be fined an amount of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more than Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00), exclusive of the value of the thing damaged, and/or imprisonment of not less than one (1) year nor more than six (6) years, as determined by the court: Provided, That if the area requires rehabilitation or restoration, as determined by the court, the offender shall also be required to restore or compensate for the restoration of the damage: Provided, further, That the court shall order the eviction of the offender from the land and the forfeiture in favor of the government of all mineral, timber or any species collected or removed including all equipment, devices and firearms used in connection therewith, and any construction or improvement made thereon by the offender. If the

1 offender is an association or corporation, the president or manager shall

be directly responsible for the act of his/her employees and laborers:

Provided, finally, That, for such offenses, the DENR may conduct separate

administrative proceedings against the offender and impose the corresponding

fines and penalties in accordance with law.

6 CHAPTER V

7 PROTECTED AREA FUND

SEC. 18. The Pasonanca Natural Park Fund. — There is hereby established a trust fund to be known as the Pasonanca Natural Park Fund (PNPF) for purposes of financing projects of the system. All income generated from the operation of the system or the management of its wild flora and fauna in the protected area shall accrue to the PNPF. These income shall be derived from visitors/tourists fee, fees from permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the protected area, proceeds from the registration and lease of multiple-use areas, including tourism concessions, contributions from industries and facilities directly benefiting from the protected area, and such other fees and income derived from the operation of the protected area.

The PNPF may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various sources, domestic or foreign, for purposes related to their functions: *Provided,* That it shall be deposited as a special account in the National Treasury and disbursements therefrom shall be made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the system, and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with existing accounting and budgeting rules and regulations: *Provided, further,* That the PNPF shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business

permits, property tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities. Furthermore, LGUs may charge add-ons to fees imposed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That such add-ons shall be determined based on the contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance and protection of the Pasonanca Natural Park.

5 CHAPTER VI

22.

EXISTING FACILITIES, UTILIZATION OF RESOURCES, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS

SEC. 19. Existing Facilities Within the Protected Area. — Existing facilities, if any, within the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be inventoried and assessed by the PAMB in accordance with the objectives of this Act. Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, unless extended by the PAMB, all commercial facilities existing within the boundaries of the protected area with a total capitalization of not less than One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) shall submit to the PAMB, through the PASu, a sworn statement containing the following information:

- (a) Environmental impact assessment and/or environmental management plan;
 - (b) Environmental Compliance Certificate; and
 - (c) Development plan.

Based on these submissions, the PAMB, with the assistance of the DENR, shall determine whether the existence of such facilities and their future plans and operations are detrimental to the Pasonanca Natural Park. Failure to submit the required information shall constitute a violation of this Act punishable, after proper administrative proceedings, by expulsion from the area.

The PAMB may prescribe conditions for the operation of the facilities to ensure that these do not conflict with the management objectives. If any of such conditions are violated, a fine shall be imposed as prescribed by the

PAMB. The PAMB, through the PASu or other deputized government entities, is hereby authorized to cause the immediate cessation of operations and demolition of any facility within the Pasonanca Natural Park whose continued operation is deemed detrimental to the area. The cost of the demolition shall be borne by the owners or operators of these facilities.

The removal of existing facilities which provide basic services and amenities to the public shall require the concurrence of the city government of Zamboanga, consistent with the responsibility of the local government to secure the welfare of its constituents.

Existing facilities within the Pasonanca Natural Park may be charged reasonable fees by the PAMB, subject to the DENR approval, pursuant to Section 10(f) of the NIPAS Act, based on the extent of their impact on the environment and biodiversity. All income derived from such fees shall accrue to the PNPF.

SEC. 20. *Utilization of Nonrenewable Resources*. – Any exploration for or exploitation or utilization of nonrenewable resources within the Pasonanca Natural Park shall not be allowed.

SEC. 21. Environmental Impact Assessment System. — Existing laws, rules and regulations relating to environmental impact assessment shall apply to all projects and activities intended in the Pasonanca Natural Park. The issuance of the environmental compliance certificate or its exemptions shall be undertaken in coordination with the PAMB.

SEC. 22. *Partnerships*. – For the purpose of attaining the objectives of this Act, other government agencies or offices, NGOs and POs and their personnel shall continuously foster and develop a strong and true partnership.

All NGOs, POs. and private entities implementing any park conservation, protection and development program must be accredited by the city government of Zamboanga and the DENR.

CHAPTER VII	
TRANSITORY AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS	
SEC. 25. Appropriations The DENR Secretary shall immediately	
include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the	
funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.	
SEC. 26. Construction The provisions of this Act shall be	
construed liberally in favor of tenured migrants, with due consideration to the	
prior property rights of the stakeholders to sustainable development, and the	
conservation and protection of biodiversity. Existing forestry laws and their	
corresponding rules and regulations not inconsistent herewith shall have	
suppletory effect in the implementation of this Act.	
. SEC. 27. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is	
declared unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the other parts or	
sections hereof.	
SEC. 28. Repealing Clause All laws, rules and regulations	
inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.	
SEC. 29. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)	
days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general	
circulation.
