AN ACT RECOGNIZING THE EARLY YEARS FROM ZERO (0) TO SIX (6) AS THE FIRST CRUCIAL STAGE OF DEVELOPMENT AND FOR THIS PURPOSE STRENGTHENING THE EARLY COUNCIL, CHILDHOOD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT RENAMING THE DAY CARE CENTER AS CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Early
 Years Act (EYA) of 2011".
- SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote the rights of children to survival, development and special protection with full recognition of the nature of childhood and as well as the
- 6 need to provide developmentally appropriate experiences to address their

needs; and to support parents in their roles as primary caregivers and as their children's first teachers.

The State shall institutionalize a National System for Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) that is comprehensive, integrative and sustainable, that involves multisectoral and interagency collaboration at the national and local levels among government, service providers, families and communities; and public and private sectors, nongovernment organizations, professional associations and academic institutions.

This System shall promote the inclusion of children with special needs, and advocate respect for cultural and linguistic diversity. It shall be anchored on complementary strategies for ECCD that include service delivery for children from zero (0) to age six (6), educating parents and caregivers, encouraging the active involvement of parents and communities in ECCD programs, raising awareness about the important efforts that improve the quality of life for young children and families.

It shall also be the policy of the State to recognize the early years from zero (0) to age (6) as the first crucial stage of educational development.

- SEC. 3. Objectives. The objectives of the National ECCD System are:
- (a) To achieve improved infant and child survival rates by ensuring that adequate health and nutrition programs are accessible to young children and their parents, from the prenatal period throughout the early childhood years;
- (b) To enhance the physical-motor, socioemotional, cognitive, language, psychological and spiritual development of young children;
- (c) To facilitate a smooth transition from care and education provided at home to community or school-based setting and to kindergarten and primary school;

(d) To ensure that young children are adequately prepared for the formal learning system and that both public and private schools are responsive to the development needs of these children;
(e) To establish an efficient system for early identification, prevention,

- referral and intervention for the wide range of children with special needs from zero (0) to six (6) years;
- (f) To upgrade and update the capabilities of service providers and their supervisors to comply with quality standards for various ECCD programs;
- (g) To reinforce the role of parents and other caregivers as the primary caregivers and educators of their children especially from zero (0) to six (6) years;
- (h) To enhance and sustain the efforts of communities to promote ECCD programs and ensure that special support is provided for poor, disadvantaged and linguistic minority communities; and
- (i) To improve the quality standards of public and private ECCD programs through, but not limited to, a registration and credential system for ECCD service providers.

SEC. 4. Definitions. - For purposes of this Act:

- (a) Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) System shall refer to the full range of health, nutrition, early education and social development programs that provide for the basic holistic needs of young children from zero (0) to age six (6), and to promote their optimum growth and development. These programs include:
- (1) Center-based programs, such as the day care service established under Republic Act No. 6972, hereinafter referred to as the child development service, public and private pre-schools, kindergarten or school-based programs, community or church-based early childhood education programs initiated by nongovernment organizations or people's organizations,

workplace-related child care and education programs, child-minding centers, health centers and stations; and

- (2) Home-based programs, such as the neighborhood-based play groups, family child care programs, parent education and home visiting programs.
- (b) ECCD Service Providers shall include the various professionals, paraprofessionals and volunteer caregivers who are directly responsible for the care and education of young children from zero (0) to six (6) years through the various center and home-based programs. They include, but are not limited to, day care workers hereinafter referred to as child development workers, child development teachers, teacher-aides, rural health midwives, social workers, community health workers, barangay nutrition scholars, parent effectiveness service volunteers and family day care providers.
- (c) ECCD Curriculum shall refer to the developmentally appropriate educational objectives and practices, programs of activities, organized learning experiences, recommended learning materials and appropriate assessment for children that are implemented by service providers through center and home-based programs. It shall consist of national program goals and guidelines, instructional objectives, and content outlines that are age-appropriate, individually appropriate and culturally-relevant.
- (d) Parent Education shall refer to the various formal and alternative means of providing parents with information, skills and support systems to assist them in their roles as their children's primary caregivers and educators. These include public and private parent education programs linked to center, home and media-based child care and education programs.

SEC. 5. System Framework and Components. — The ECCD System shall include the following components:

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- (a) ECCD. Curriculum. Focuses on children's total development and takes into account age, individual and sociocultural appropriateness. It shall promote the delivery of complementary and integrative services for health care, nutrition, early childhood education, sanitation and cultural activities. It shall use the child's first language as the medium of instruction.
- (b) Parent Education and Involvement, Advocacy and Mobilization of Communities. Harness and develop parents' strengths as providers of ECCD programs at home, as active partners of other stakeholders, as advocates for community concerns that affect children, and as pillars of support for local and national ECCD programs through community organization efforts.
- (c) Human Resource Development Program. Establishes mechanisms for the systematic professionalization of ECCD service providers, through enrollment in educational programs in site-based or distance education modes, through pre-service or in-service training including continuing education programs, whereby a registration and credential system shall be developed in the ECCD System.
- (d) ECCD Management. Focuses on a continuing process of planning, implementation, supervision, financial management, monitoring, evaluation and reporting to persons concerned. It shall encourage the active involvement and build the capabilities of service providers, parents and local government officials to sustain the program, and it shall be guided by the principles of decentralization as stipulated in the Local Government Code of 1991 and the principles of shared governance in the "Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001".

(e) Quality Standards and Accreditation. – Ensures that each component in the ECCD System complies with national quality standards to be established by the ECCD Council linked to an accreditation process.

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- SEC. 6. Expanding the ECCD System. The National ECCD System shall be expanded to all provinces, cities/municipalities and barangays as may be determined by the ECCD Council to achieve universal ECCD coverage for all children from zero (0) to six (6) years.
- SEC. 7. Implementing Arrangements and Operational Structures. The implementation of the National ECCD System shall be the responsibility of the ECCD Council.
- (a) Responsibilities of the ECCD Council. The ECCD Council shall be responsible for developing policies and programs, providing technical assistance and support to the ECCD service providers and monitoring of ECCD service benefits and outcomes.

The Department of Education (DepED), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), the Department of Health (DOH), the National Nutrition Council (NNC) and the Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines (ULAP) shall jointly prepare annual ECCD work plans that will coordinate their respective technical assistance and support for the National ECCD program. They shall consolidate the following existing program implementing guidelines that ensure consistency in integrated service delivery within the National ECCD System.

(1) The DepED shall promote the National ECCD program in schools. ECCD programs in public schools shall be the joint responsibility of their respective school principal/school-head and parent-teachers associations (PTAs) within the standards set forth in the National ECCD System and under the guidance of the city/municipal ECCD Coordinating Committees for the

effective and equitable delivery of ECCD services. It shall also make available existing facilities of public elementary schools for ECCD classes.

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- (2) Private pre-schools shall be registered by the Council upon the recommendation of the city/municipal ECCD Coordinating Committees. Nongovernment organization-initiated community, church, home and workplace-based service providers shall be registered by the Council upon the recommendation of the city/municipal ECCD Coordinating Committees. These public and private ECCD service providers shall operate within the standards set forth in the National ECCD System.
- (b) Responsibilities of Local Government Units. Local government units (LGUs) shall be primarily responsible for:
- (1) Implementing the National ECCD System by providing basic public ECCD programs;
- (2) Supporting the organization of parent cooperatives to initiate the establishment of ECCD programs;
- (3) Ensuring that service providers of public ECCD programs under their supervision shall be justly compensated, that adequate funds are available, and their working conditions are conducive to fulfill national quality standards; and
- (4) Providing funds for the training and continuing education of ECCD public service providers.
- (c) Responsibilities of Families and Communities. Families and communities shall support the local ECCD programs by participating in various projects for the overall development of their children from zero (0) to six (6) years.
- SEC. 8. Strengthening the ECCD Council. The ECCD Council shall be strengthened to ensure the State's focus on building a strong foundation for the development and learning of children during the early years from zero (0)

1	to six (6) years, to support the full range of health, nutrition, early education
2	and social development programs for the child's holistic development and
3	ensure sustained interagency and multisectoral collaboration.

- SEC. 9. Organization of the ECCD Council. The ECCD Council shall be composed of:
- (a) ECCD Governing Board. The ECCD Governing Board shall be headed by a Chairperson with the salary grade and emoluments of a cabinet secretary to be appointed by the President, and shall have as members the heads of the:
- (1) Department of Education (DepED);
 - (2) Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD);
- 12 (3) Department of Health (DOH);

- (4) National Nutrition Council (NNC); and
 - (5) Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines (ULAP).

In addition, one (I) private individual who is an ECCD practitioner and expert shall be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Board.

The heads of the concerned departments, agencies and institutions shall, as much as possible, attend the meetings of the Board. In their absence, they must designate a permanent representative with a rank not lower than an Undersecretary or its equivalent who may attend and participate at meetings of the Board.

The Board shall meet once a month or as often as necessary.

(b) Council Secretariat. - There shall be established an ECCD Secretariat headed by an Executive Director to be appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Board. The Executive Director shall have the rank, privileges and emoluments of a Career Executive Service Officer I.

1	There shall be created two (2) permanent positions of Deputy Executive
2	Directors to be appointed by the Board, one of whom shall be concerned with
3.	ECCD programs and activities and the other with general administrative
4	services of the ECCD Council.

- The Executive Director and the Deputy Executive Directors shall be assisted by a designated ECCD Focal Person from the DepED, the DSWD, the DOH, the NNC and the ULAP, and by technical staff as may be necessary to achieve the goals and objectives of the National ECCD System.
- SEC. 10. Functions of the ECCD Council. The ECCD Council shall implement the National Early Childhood Care and Development System and perform the following functions:
- (a) Promulgate policies and implementing guidelines for ECCD programs in consultation with stakeholders, including the regional level when appropriate, consistent with the national policy and program frameworks as defined in this Act;
- (b) Establish ECCD program standards that reflect developmentally appropriate practices for ECCD programs, which shall interface with the kindergarten and primary school curriculum of the DepED;
- (c) Develop a national system for the recruitment, registration, continuing education and equivalency, and credential system of ECCD service providers, supervisors and administrators to improve and professionalize the ECCD sector and upgrade quality standards of public and private ECCD programs;
- (d) Develop a national system of awards and recognition to deserving ECCD program implementers and service providers;
- (e) Promote, encourage and coordinate the various ECCD programs of the DepED, the DSWD, the DOH and the NNC, and monitor the delivery of services to the ECCD program beneficiaries nationwide;

1 (f) Evaluate and assess the impact and outcome of various ECCD programs nationwide through an effective information system;

- (g) Develop and establish a national system for early identification, screening and surveillance of young children;
- (h) Develop and implement various support mechanisms that maximize the public and private resources for implementing ECCD programs, giving priority to the needy and high risk children from poor communities;
- (i) Provide funds to poor and disadvantaged communities for the establishment and expansion of public ECCD programs, improvement of physical facilities and for hiring of ECCD service providers;
- (j) Promote and encourage private sector initiatives for the establishment of ECCD programs;
- (k) Provide guidelines for the conduct of solicitations and requests for assistance from local and international civic organizations, and private philanthropic foundations to supplement available resources; and
- (l) Perform such other functions as the ECCD Council may deem necessary.
- SEC. 11. Annual Report. The ECCD Council shall, at the close of each calendar year, submit an annual report to Congress, giving a detailed account of its proceedings and accomplishments during the year and making recommendations for the adoption of measures that will improve the National ECCD System and ensure achievement of universal coverage of ECCD benefits to all children from zero (0) to six (6) years.
- SEC. 12. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The Council, in consultation with appropriate government agencies and nongovernment organizations, shall formulate and issue the necessary rules and regulations for the implementation of this Act within ninety (90) days after the effectivity of this Act.

1	SEC. 13. Repealing Clause. — Republic Act No. 8980, otherwise
2	known as the "Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) Act" is hereby
3	repealed. Pertinent provisions of all laws, decrees, executive orders
4	presidential proclamations, rules and regulations or parts thereof contrary to or
5	inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified
6	accordingly.
7	SEC. 14. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is
8	declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity
9	of the other provisions hereof.
10	SEC. 15. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)
11	days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2)
12	newspapers of general circulation.
