## AN ACT DECRIMINALIZING VAGRANCY, AMENDING FOR THIS PURPOSE ARTICLE 202 OF ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE REVISED PENAL CODE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Article 202 of the Revised Penal Code is hereby amended
2	to read as follows:
3	"ART. 202. [Vagrants and p]Prostitutes-Penalty
4	The following are vagrants:
5	1. Any person having no apparent means of
6	subsistence, who has the physical ability to work and who
7	neglects to apply himself or herself to some lawful calling;
8	2. Any person found loitering about public or
9	[semi-public buildings or places or tramping or wandering

about the country or the streets without visible means of

1 3. Any idle or dissolute person who lodges in houses of 2 ill-fame; ruffians or pimps and those who habitually associate 3 with prostitutes: 4. Any person who, not being included in the 4 provisions of other articles of this Code, shall be found 5 6 loitering in any inhabited or uninhabited place belonging to 7 another without any lawful or justifiable purpose: Prostitutes. 8 "For the purposes of this article, women who, for 9 10 money or profit, habitually indulge in sexual intercourse or 11 lascivious conduct, are deemed to be prostitutes. "Any person found guilty of any of the offenses covered 12 13 by this article shall be punished by arresto menor or a fine not exceeding 200 pesos, and in case of recidivism, by arresto 14 15 mayor in its medium period to prision correccional in its 16 minimum period or a fine ranging from 200 to 2,000 pesos, or 17 both, in the discretion of the court." 18 SEC. 2. Effect on Pending Cases. - All pending cases under the 19 provisions of Article 202 of the Revised Penal Code on vagrancy prior to its 20 amendment by this Act shall be dismissed upon effectivity of this Act. SEC. 3. Immediate Release of Convicted Persons. - All persons 21 22 serving sentence for violation of the provisions of Article 202 of the Revised 23 Penal Code on vagrancy prior to its amendment by this Act shall be 24 immediately released upon the effectivity of this Act: Provided, That they are 25 not serving sentence or detained for any other offense or felony.

SEC. 4. Repealing Clause. – All laws, presidential decrees, executive
orders, rules and regulations and other issuances or any parts thereof
inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, modified or amended
accordingly.

SEC. 5. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
