AN ACT REQUIRING ALL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES ISSUING IDENTIFICATION CARDS, CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES TO INDICATE THEREIN THE BLOOD TYPE OF THE HOLDER AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Blood Type Identification Act of 2012".
 - SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. In order to promote public health, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote awareness about the importance of blood type which is to be found in all government-issued identification cards and to facilitate immediate transfusion during medical emergencies.

1	SEC. 3. Blood Type Identification The Government Service
2	Insurance System (GSIS), the Social Security System (SSS), the Professional
3	Regulation Commission (PRC), the Land Transportation Office (LTO), the
4	Philippine National Police (PNP), the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA),
5	the Local Treasurer's Office, the Local Registrar's Office and other pertinent
6	agencies which may later be identified or created upon the effectivity of this
7	Act shall indicate in their issued certificates, licenses and identification cards
8	the blood type of the owner-holder.
9	SEC. 4. Coverage The following government-issued identification
10	documents shall bear the blood type of its owner-holder:
11	(a) Certificates:
12	(1) Birth Certificate or Certificate of Live Birth; and
13	(2) Community Tax Certificate, as issued by the Local Treasurer's
. 14	Office.
15	(b) Licenses:
16	(1) Driver's license, as issued by the LTO; and
17	(2) Firearms license, as issued by the PNP.
18	(c) Identification Cards:
19	(1) SSS Card, as issued by the SSS;
20	(2) GSIS Card, as issued by the GSIS;
21	(3) Passport as issued by the DFA; and
22	(4) Professional Identification Card (PIC), as issued by the PRC and
23	such other certificates, licenses and/or identification documents that the other

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enumerated above.

SEC. 5. Prohibited Act. - It shall be unlawful for any person to deliberately bear false information as to one's blood type on any certificate, license and other government identification card.

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SEC. 6. Penal Provision. - Violations of Section 5 of this Act shall

4	Any person in government office who violates the provisions of this Act
5	shall, in addition to the penalty stated above, be dismissed from government
6	service.
7	SEC. 7. Appropriations The amount necessary for the
8	implementation of this Act shall be charged to the appropriations of the
9	implementing agencies under the General Appropriations Act (GAA).
10	Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for its continued implementation
11	shall be included in the GAA.
12	SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations All government
13	implementing agencies, in coordination with the Department of Health, shall
14	formulate the rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of
15	this Act within six (6) months of its effectivity.
16	SEC. 9. Separability Clause In the event that any provision of this
17	Act is declared unconstitutional, the validity of the other provisions shall not
18	be affected by such declaration.
19	SEC. 10. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and
20	regulations and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the
21	provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
22	SEC. 11. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
23	its publication in at least two (2) national newspapers of general circulation.
