## AN ACT PROVIDING FOR EARLY VOTING TO QUALIFIED MEMBERS OF THE MEDIA

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. Elections shall be free and equal. The State shall ensure the exercise of the right of suffrage by all citizens of the Philippines not otherwise disqualified by law.
- SEC. 2. Who are Qualified to Vote. Any person, by reason of his/her functions and duties as a member of the media, who is not able to cast his/her vote on election day.
- SEC. 3. How to Apply for Early Voting. Thirty (30) days before the election, the appropriate head of office shall submit to the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) a list of members of media who are registered voters and, by reason of their duties and functions, will not be able to vote on election day but desire to exercise their right to vote by filling up an application form for early voting.

Upon verification by the COMELEC that the persons included in the list are qualified voters, it shall transmit the exact number of application forms to the head of office making the request.

SEC. 4. Who to Vote for, When and Where A member of the media
qualified to vote early may cast his/her ballot in the Office of the
Municipal/City Election Registrar where he/she is registered during office
hours within seven (7) working days before the day of elections. He/She may
vote for as many positions available to be voted on as any other qualified voter
casting his/her ballot on election day proper.

- SEC. 5. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The COMELEC shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations to implement this Act.
- SEC. 6. Appropriations. The amount needed to initially implement the provisions of this Act shall be charged against the current fiscal year's appropriations of the COMELEC for the holding of elections. In case of deficiency, any savings generated from the budget of the COMELEC may be used to augment said appropriations. Thereafter, such sums as may be needed for its continued implementation shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- SEC. 7. Separability Clause. If any part or provision of this Act shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
- SEC. 8. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations, other issuances and parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 9. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in three (3) newspapers of general circulation.
