AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTIES FOR THE CRIME OF SLANDER BY DEED AND INCLUDING THE INTENTIONAL FILING OF A FALSE COMPLAINT IN COURT OR WITH ANY GOVERNMENT AGENCY EXERCISING QUASI-JUDICIAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS AS ONE OF ITS FORMS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ARTICLE 359 OF ACT NO. 3815, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE REVISED PENAL CODE"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Article 359 of Act No. 3815, otherwise known as "The
 Revised Penal Code", is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3 "Art. 359. Slander by deed. - The penalty of arresto mayor in its maximum] PRISION MAYOR IN ITS MEDIUM period to 4 5 prision correctional in its minimum ITS MAXIMUM period or a 6 fine [ranging from 200 to 1,000 pesos] OF 100,000 PESOS, OR 7 BOTH, shall be imposed upon any person who shall perform any 8 act not included and punished in this title, which shall 9 cast dishonor, discredit or contempt upon another person[.], 10 INCLUDING THE INTENTIONAL FILING OF A FALSE COMPLAINT

1IN COURT OR WITH ANY GOVERNMENT AGENCY EXERCISING2QUASI-JUDICIAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS. If said act is not3of a serious nature, the penalty shall be [arresto menor] PRISION4MAYOR IN ITS MINIMUM PERIOD or a fine [not exceeding 2005pcsos] OF 50,000 PESOS.

DURING 6 "IF THE COURSE \mathbf{OF} ANY FORMAL 7 INVESTIGATION OR TRIAL OF THE CASE, IT IS PROVEN THAT 8 THE ABOVE FALSE COMPLAINT HAS BEEN OR IS BEING USED 9 BY THE COMPLAINANT TO GAIN ADVANTAGE OR TO RECEIVE 10 A FAVORABLE DECISION, ACTION, OR RESOLUTION ON ANY 11 MATTER. THE MAXIMUM PENALTY PROVIDED HEREIN SHALL BE 12 IMPOSED."

SEC. 2. If any provision of this Act is declared invalid by a competent
 court, the remainder of this Act or any provision not otherwise affected by such
 declaration of invalidity shall remain in force and effect.

SEC. 3. All laws, decrees, executive orders, and rules and regulations
inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified
accordingly.

 SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
 in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation. Approved,
