AN ACT STRENGTHENING ASSISTANCE TO ALL FARMERS BY PROVIDING FREE IRRIGATION SERVICE FEE AND ALL OTHER SIMILAR OR RELATED FEES OR CHARGES, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF

REPUBLIC ACT NO. 3601, AS AMENDED BY PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 552 AND PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1702, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE NATIONAL IRRIGATION ADMINISTRATION ACT, AND REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8435, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES MODERNIZATION ACT OF 1997, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as "Free Irrigation Services Act".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote a just and dynamic social order that will ensure the prosperity of the nation and free the people from poverty through policies that provide adequate social services, promote full employment, a rising standard of living, and an improved quality of life for all.

To this end, the State shall pursue a genuine agricultural development strategy by providing support services to all farmers, including their irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives, with the end in view of increasing their productivity and improving their access to markets. More particularly, the government shall promote and institutionalize irrigation systems that are free, effective, suitable, applicable and efficient as a key strategy to achieve genuine agricultural development.

SEC. 3. Free Irrigation Program. — All irrigation systems constructed/built, funded, operated/managed, and maintained by the National Irrigation Administration (NIA), the Department of Agriculture (DA), other government agencies, or those turned over and maintained or operated by farmers' organizations, irrigators' associations and the local government units (LGUs) shall be free of charge. Corollary thereto, all back accounts or unpaid irrigation service fees (ISF) in national irrigation systems and amortization payment of loans in the construction/rehabilitation of communal irrigation and the corresponding penalties and/or interests thereof due from farmers,

- including their irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives, are hereby condoned by the government, thereby relieving them from payment thereof.
- SEC. 4. Qualified Beneficiaries. The qualified beneficiaries of the free irrigation program shall include all farmers, irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives. Owners or operators of corporate farms, plantations, fishponds and other nonagricultural crop users drawing water or using the drainage facilities of NIA irrigation systems are not qualified beneficiaries of the Program.

- SEC. 5. Mechanism for the Management of Irrigation Systems. The government, together with the farmers and irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives, shall endeavor to build and operationalize an effective grassroots-based management of irrigation systems, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act (GAA).
- SEC. 6. Construction, Repair and Maintenance of National Irrigation Systems. For the purpose of ensuring the necessary construction, repair and maintenance of irrigation systems administered by the NIA, the required amounts shall be included in the annual GAA.
- SEC. 7. Technical Assistance to Stakeholders. The NIA shall provide technical and financial assistance to LGUs and all farmers, including their irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives with respect to irrigation systems located, utilized, and managed in their respective jurisdictions, including all functional equipment and facilities appurtenant thereto.
- SEC. 8. Appropriations. Such sums as may be necessary to cover the requirement of the NIA for payment of salaries and maintenance and other operating expenses shall be funded under the GAA.
- SEC. 9. Implementing Rules and Regulations. The NIA, in consultation with the DA, farmers and their irrigators' associations and farmers' cooperatives and other stakeholders, shall formulate the

3	SEC. 10. Separability Clause If any part or provision of this Act is
4.	declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected by such
5	declaration shall be in full force and effect.

7	Act No. 3601, entitled "An Act Creating the National Irrigation
8	Administration; Section 1, paragraph (b) of Presidential Decree No. 552;
9	Section 1, paragraph (b) of Presidential Decree No. 1702; Section 35 of
10	Republic Act No. 8435, otherwise known as the "Agriculture and Fisheries
11	Modernization Act of 1997"; and all other laws, executive and administrative
12	orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are
13	hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
14	SEC. 12. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
15	after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general
16	circulation.
