## AN ACT INSTITUTIONALIZING THE BALIK SCIENTIST PROGRAM AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Title. This Act shall be known as the "Balik Scientist
  Act".
- 3 SEC 2. Declaration of Policy. The State recognizes that the 4 utilization of the expertise of expatriate Filipino scientists and technologists is 5 a vital component of the nation's political, economic, and social development
- 6 efforts; hence, it is hereby declared to be the policy of the State to encourage
- 7 Filipino scientists and technology experts from abroad to return to the
- 8 Philippines and share their expertise to help accelerate the growth and progress
- 9 of the country.

 Towards this end, any foreign-based scientist, professional, technician or any person with special skills or expertise who is of Filipino descent shall be allowed to share such expertise and pertinent knowledge gained through the years in the practice of profession with sectors of the economy that will greatly benefit from such collaboration and transfer of technologies. The participation and service of expatriates or returning scientists shall be governed by rules and regulations that shall be promulgated by the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in consultation with relevant agencies of the government and nongovernment organizations.

- SEC. 3. General Objective. This Act aims to strengthen the scientific and technological human resources of the academe, public institutions, and domestic corporations by the promotion of knowledge sharing and accelerate the flow of new technologies into the country.
- SEC. 4. Definition of Balik Scientist. As used in this Act, a "Balik Scientist" refers to a science or technology expert or professional, as certified by the DOST, who is a Filipino citizen or a foreigner of Filipino descent, residing abroad, and contracted by the government to return and serve in the Philippines in a particular field of expertise for either a short-term award with a duration of at least fifteen (15) days per award, to be served within one (1) year from the date of the award, or a long-term award with a duration of twenty-four (24) to thirty-six (36) months subject to renewal, when necessary, to be determined by the DOST and to be served within five (5) years from the date of the award.
- SEC. 5. Incentives. The following incentives shall be offered to a "Balik Scientist":
  - (a) For Short-Term Award:
- Provision of one (1) free round-trip airfare originating from a foreign country to the Philippines;

(2) Reimbursement of expenses for excess baggage allowance related to scientific project or activities;

- (3) Exemption from the payment of income tax of daily allowance to be determined by the DOST;
- (4) Exemption from the licensing or permit requirement of the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC): *Provided*, That the DOST shall submit to the PRC the list of "Balik Scientists" whom it has certified prior to the award: *Provided*, *further*, That accomplishment reports of these "Balik Scientists" shall likewise be furnished by the DOST to the PRC at the end of each award;
- (5) Exemption from the payment of taxes and duties over donation of equipment, instruments and materials to the DOST to be used actually, directly and exclusively for scientific program or activities of the "Balik Scientist": Provided, That freight and storage expenses shall be borne by the host institution:
- (6) Participation in Grants-in-Aid (GIA) research and development projects of the DOST subject to guidelines to be provided in the implementing rules and regulations;
- (7) Exemption of the "Balik Scientist" from the payment of visa, immigration and registration fees in accordance with Section 251 of the Philippine Foreign Service Code of 1983, as amended by Section 831 of Department Order No. 19A-95, series of 1995, otherwise known as the Regulations of the Department of Foreign Affairs, and subject to the applicable provisions of Section 29, Commonwealth Act No. 613, otherwise known as the "Philippine Immigration Act of 1940", as amended. The Secretary of Justice may grant the "Balik Scientist" of foreign citizenship special nonimmigrant visas under Section 47(a)(2), after compliance with the requirements therefore; and
  - (8) Free accident and medical insurance; and

1 (b) For Long-Term Award:

upon expiration of the award;

- (1) Provision of one (1) free one-way airfare from a foreign country to the Philippines, including airfare for the spouse and two (2) minor dependents, and one (1) free return trip airfare after completion of the award;
- (2) Reimbursement of expenses for excess baggage allowance related to scientific project or activities;
  - (3) Relocation allowance to be determined by the DOST;
- (4) Exemption from the payment of income tax of daily allowance to be determined by the DOST;
- (5) Provision for housing may be arranged by predetermined host institutions;
- (6) As determined by the DOST, importation of personal effects and professional instruments and materials in quantities and of class suitable to the profession, rank or position of the "Balik Scientists" importing them for their own use and not for barter or sale; one (1) unit second hand motor vehicle with gross vehicle weight (GVW) not exceeding 3000 kgs shall be exempt from duties and taxes in accordance with Section 800(h) of Republic Act No. 10863, entitled: "An Act Modernizing the Customs and Tariff Administration": Provided, That the grantee under the short-term program shall likewise be entitled to this benefit who shall decide to avail of the long-term award: Provided, further, That the grantee shall be exempted from posting of bond and exportation of the motor vehicle to the country of origin
- (7) Exemption from the payment of taxes and duties for donations of equipment, instruments and materials to the DOST to be used actually, directly and exclusively for scientific program or activities of the "Balik Scientist": *Provided*, That the freight and storage expenses shall be borne by the host institution: *Provided*, *further*, That reimbursement of expenses for the surface shipment of personal household effects and professional instruments,

including one (1) motor vehicle the total weight of which does not exceed a three and a half (3 ½) tons volume weight;

- (8) Exemption from the payment of travel tax of the "Balik Scientist" and immediate family members as certified by the DOST;
- (9) Exemption from submission of Immigration Clearance Certificate and payment of multiple entry fees;
- (10) Exemption from the securing of alien employment permit within the duration of their award pursuant to Section 2 of Department Order No. 97-09, series of 2009, as amended by Department Order No. 120-12, series of 2012, of the Department of Labor and Employment;
- (11) Exemption from the licensing or permit requirement of the PRC: Provided, That the DOST shall submit to the PRC the list of "Balik Scientists" whom it has certified prior to the grant of an award or project: Provided, further, That accomplishment reports of these "Balik Scientists" shall likewise be furnished by the DOST to the PRC at the end of each award;
- (12) Participation in the GIA for research and development projects approved by the Secretary of the DOST;
- (13) Provision of funds for construction and setup of the laboratory to be used to come up with an innovation: *Provided*, That the laboratory shall remain as property of the government after the expiration of the contract;
- (14) Exemption of the "Balik Scientists" and immediate family members from the payment of visa, immigration and registration fees in accordance with the Philippine Foreign Service Code of 1983, as amended by Section 831 of Department Order No. 19A-95, series of 1995, otherwise known as the "Regulations of the Department of Foreign Affairs", subject to applicable provisions of Section 29, Commonwealth Act No. 613, otherwise known as the "Philippine Immigration Act of 1940", as amended. The Secretary of Justice may grant to the "Balik Scientist" of foreign citizenship

1	special nonimmigrant visas under Section 47(a)(2), after compliance with the
2	requirements therefore; and
3	(15) Grant of reasonable accident and medical insurance for the
4	duration of the award as determined by the DOST.
5	The DOST may draw up other privileges that may be extended to the
6	"Balik Scientist" in the rules and regulations to be issued to implement this
7	Act.
8	SEC. 6. Administration This program shall be administered by the
9	DOST.
10	SEC. 7. Implementing Rules and Regulations The DOST, in
11	consultation with concerned agencies and stakeholders, shall promulgate the
12	implementing rules and regulations of this Act within ninety (90) days from
13	the effectivity of this Act.

SEC. 8. Appropriations. – The amount necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be included in the budget of the DOST under the annual General Appropriations Act.

- SEC. 9. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Act shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not otherwise affected shall remain in full force and effect.
- SEC. 10. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, ordinances, rules and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 11. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
