AN ACT DECLARING THE PASONANCA WATERSHED FOREST RESERVE LOCATED IN ZAMBOANGA CITY AS A PROTECTED AREA UNDER THE CATEGORY OF NATURAL PARK AND PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS 2 SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Pasonanca 3 Natural Park Act". 4 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - Considering the aesthetic, 5 sociocultural, economic and ecological importance of the Pasonanca 6 Watershed Forest Reserve, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to 7 further secure its protection and conservation, and the way of life of the people and communities residing therein. For this reason, the State 9 shall protect and conserve its biodiversity; advance, respect and protect 10 11 the customs and interests of its legitimate inhabitants; and foster 12 partnerships among government, nongovernment organizations (NGOs) 13 and people's organizations (POs).

SEC. 3. Scope. — The Pasonanca Natural Park located in Zamboanga City, which covers a total area of about twelve thousand one hundred two and 8/100 (12,102.08) hectares, is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point marked "1" on the Map, being N 06°53'25" E, 3,871.1994 meters from PRS '92 Control Monument "ZGC-2" with geographic coordinates 06°55'24.43" N, 122°04'3.2668" E located at Edwin Andrews Base, Zamboanga City.

SEC. 4. Land Classification. — Subject to private rights if there be any, all lands of the public domain declared within the coverage and scope of the Pasonanca Natural Park shall fall under the land classification of national park: *Provided, however*, That the present land classification of any area within its buffer zone, as defined and delimited herein, shall be retained and is hereby respected.

SEC. 5. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

- (a) Biodiversity or biological diversity refers to the variability among living organisms, including their genetic and structural differences, the variability within and between species, and the variability within and between ecosystems;
- (b) Buffer zone refers to identified areas outside the boundaries of and immediately adjacent to designated protected areas pursuant to Section 8 of Republic Act No. 7586 or the "National Integrated Protected Areas System

1	(NIPAS) Act of 1992" that need special development control in order to avoid
2	or minimize harm to the protected area;
3	(c) Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) refers to the procedures
4	undertaken pursuant to the Environment Impact Assessment System
5	established under Presidential Decree No. 1586 or supervening legislation;
6	(d) Management plan refers to the fundamental plan, strategy and/or
7	scheme which shall guide all activities relating to the Pasonanca Natural Park
8	in order to attain the objectives of this Act as stated in Section 2 hereof;
9	(e) National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) refers to the
10	classification and administration of all designated protected areas to maintain
11	essential ecological processes and life-support systems, to preserve genetic
12	diversity, to ensure sustainable use of resources found therein and to maintain
13	their natural conditions to the greatest extent possible;
14	(f) National park refers to one (1) of the four (4) classifications of
15	lands of the public domain, the others being agricultural, forest or timber and
16	mineral lands, pursuant to the Constitution;
17	(g) Natural park refers to a relatively large area not materially altered
18	by human activity where extractive resource uses are not allowed, and
19	maintained to protect outstanding natural and scenic areas of national or
20	international significance for scientific, educational and recreational use; and
21	(h) Protected area refers to identified portions of land and water set
22	aside by reason of their unique physical and biological significance, and
23	managed to enhance biological diversity and proteeted against destructive
24	human exploitation.
25	CHAPTER II
26	PROTECTED AREA MANAGEMENT
27	SEC. 6. Management Mechanism The management and
28	administration of the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be consultative and

participatory. The policy-making authority is solely vested in the Protected

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1	Area Management Board (PAMB), which shall be chaired by the Department
2	of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Regional Director (RD) for
3	Region IX. From time to time, the PAMB may also create committees to
4	which it may delegate some of its powers and functions.
5	SEC. 7. The Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) The
6	PAMB shall be composed of the following:
7	(a) The DENR RD for Region IX, as Chairperson;
8	(b) The Mayor of Zamboanga City or a duly designated representative,
9	as vice chairperson;
10	(c) The Chairperson of the Committee on Natural Resources and
11	Environmental Protection of the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Zamboanga
12	City, as member;
13	(d) The General Manager of the Zamboanga City Water District
14	(ZCWD) or a duly designated representative, as member;
15	(e) The planning and development officer of Zamboanga City,
16	as member;
17	(f) The barangay chairperson in Zamboanga City whose areas of
18	jurisdiction are within the protected area, as member;
19	(g) Three (3) representatives from Zamboanga City-based NGOs and
20	community organizations, including POs, church or civic organizations, with
21	interests within the protected area, as members;
22	(h) Three (3) representatives from national government agencies with
23	offices in Zamboanga City, that are involved in protected area management or
24	whose mandate affects the protection and conservation of the park, to be
25	appointed by the DENR Secretary upon the recommendation of their
26	respective heads of office, as members; and
27	(i) Three (3) representatives from local stakeholders who can assist

and contribute in the protection and conservation of the park, to be appointed

by the DENR Secretary, as members.

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1	In selecting the representatives from the POs and the NGOs, the
2	following criteria shall be primarily considered:
3	(1) Active involvement in the ecological conservation, preservation,
4	rehabilitation and protection of the park;
5	(2) Good potential in community organizing and other development
6	works;
7	(3) Favorable track record in community work; and
8	(4) Accreditation by the local government of Zamboanga City
9	and the DENR.
10	SEC. 8. Term of Office of PAMB Members Except for the
11	government officials who shall serve ex officio and whose term of office as
12	PAMB members are coterminous with their employment in the agency being
13	represented, the members of the PAMB shall be appointed by the DENR
14	Secretary and shall serve for a term of five (5) years: Provided, That said
15	PAMB members remain connected with the organization being represented.
16	Whenever a vacancy occurs during the term of a PAMB member who is not a
17	government agency representative, a new member shall be chosen in the

The members of the PAMB shall not receive any compensation but shall be entitled to reasonable per diem in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

same manner as the original selection process: Provided, further, That the

substitute shall only serve for the remaining term.

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SEC. 9. Duties and Functions of the PAMB. - As the highest policy-making body for the protected area, the PAMB shall exercise the following powers and functions:

(a) Approve or decide on all matters related to or based on the approved management plan, proposals, work and action plans, resource protection, delineation and demarcation of protected area boundaries, buffer

zones, ancestral domains, recognition of rights and privileges, and guidelines and policies for the management and conservation of the protected area:

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- (b) Review and adopt the management plan and development program and their implementing rules and regulations, and ensure strict compliance therewith;
- (c) Control and regulate the construction and maintenance of roads, trails, waterworks, sewerage, fire protection and sanitation systems and other utilities within the park:
- (d) Control and supervise the Office of the Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) and monitor and evaluate the performance of the protected area personnel, NGOs and communities involved in conservation and development work;
- (e) Issue all necessary permits for authorized activities within the park, including its buffer zones, and collect reasonable fees therefor in accordance with the management plan relative to the conservation and protection of the park. The PAMB may delegate this authority to the PASu under proper guidelines;
- (f) Deputize, through the PASu, individuals for the enforcement of all laws, rules and regulations governing conduct within the park and its buffer zones, and prescribe the qualifications therefor;
- (g) Accept donations and grants, approve proposals for funding and budget allocation, and exercise accountability over all funds that may accrue;
- (h) Coordinate with the appropriate agencies of the government, local or national, on all matters related to the protection and conservation of the protected area and its buffer zones, and request their assistance for the same purpose;
- (i) Retain a legal counsel, either on permanent, temporary or part-time basis, to defend cases against the PAMB, the PASu Office and staff, and deputized individuals whenever they are sued in connection with the

(j) Adopt rules and procedures for the conduct of business, including the creation of committees to which certain powers of the PAMB may be delegated.

The DENR, through the RD for Region IX, shall ensure that the PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of conflict between administrative orders issued by the DENR pursuant to Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the "National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) Act of 1992", the rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto and other relevant laws on environmental protection and natural resources management and the resolutions and issuances of the PAMB, the DENR Secretary shall decide as to which rule, regulation or resolution shall prevail.

- SEC. 10. Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office. There is hereby established a Protected Area Superintendent's Office in charge of the management, protection and administration of the protected area. The PASu Office shall be supported by the existing personnel of the DENR. The head of office shall be the chief operating officer of the Pasonanca Natural Park and shall be accountable to the DENR RD for Region IX and the PAMB. The PASu shall have the following powers and functions:
- 21 (a) Prepare the management plan and its successor plans as 22 herein provided;
 - (b) Serve as secretariat to the PAMB with the duty to provide the PAMB with all information necessary to make appropriate decisions for the implementation of this Act;
- (c) Supervise the necessary personnel to support operations as thebudget may allow;

 (d) Establish a productive partnership with local communities, including groups supporting the achievement of the goals and objectives of this Act;

- (e) Develop and implement park information, education and visitor programs;
- (f) Enforce the laws, rules and regulations and PAMB resolutions relevant to the protected area and its buffer zones, and assist in the prosecution of offenses;
- (g) Monitor all activities within the protected area and its buffer zones in conformity with the management plan; and
 - (h) Perform such other functions as the PAMB may assign.
- SEC. 11. Management Plan. Within one (1) year from the effectivity of this Act, the PASu shall prepare a management plan in accordance with the General Management Planning Strategy (GMPS) and in coordination with the appropriate offices of the DENR, local communities, the City Government of Zamboanga, NGOs, other government agencies and available experts with socio-environmental, economic and ecological experience in the area. The plan shall contain, among others, the following:
- (a) The period of its applicability, at least for ten (10) years, subject to review at any time as may be determined necessary by the Board;
- (b) The analysis of key management issues and problems considered as threats to conservation, management and maintenance, including impacts on the important features of the area;
- (c) Broad and long-term vision in the form of goals, guiding policies for management, sets of objectives and specific statements on what management can achieve within the time frame of the plan;
 - (d) Site management strategies;

 (e) Zoning plan, illustrating the boundaries, classification and management of specific zones and other activities allowed or prohibited for each zone;

- (f) Management programs to include the enforcement of laws, habitat and wildlife management, ecotourism, sustainable use of resources, infrastructure development and maintenance, fire prevention and pest control;
- (g) Mechanisms for the protection of tenured migrants in the exercise of their rights;
 - (h) Sustainable and nondestructive livelihood activities; and
- (i) Regulations in the furtherance of preservation and conservation objectives, such as the requirements in the issuance of permits and rules on the restrictions of resource use.

The management plan shall be reviewed and adopted by the PAMB and certified by the DENR Secretary that it conforms to all laws, rules and regulations issued by the DENR. In no case shall the management plan be revised or modified without the prior approval of the PAMB and in contravention to the procedures herein set forth.

One (1) year before the expiration of the management plan, the Office of the PASu shall prepare a successor management plan which shall be done in the same manner as the procedure and principles herein set forth and in accordance with the GMPS. In the same period, the PASu shall cause the publication of notices for comments and suggestions on the successor plan in a newspaper of local circulation and the posting of such notices in the city and barangay halls of the barangay units comprising the protected area and in three (3) other conspicuous places frequented by the public within the protected area. At least two (2) public hearings shall be conducted in order that the views and suggestions of affected sectors on the successor plan are heard.

The management plan shall be plainly written in English and Chabacano, and available for public perusal at the Office of the PASu.

 SEC. 12. Management Zoning. — Management zones shall be established in the protected area to provide protection for critical or representative habitats. Within each management zone, similar management emphasis shall be applied, comparable levels of use shall be permitted and different uses shall be segregated. Each management zone shall be demarcated on the ground and indicated on the maps after undertaking such steps as land and resource use mapping and dialogue with the communities, the City Government of Zamboanga and other stakeholders. Within each zone, management prescriptions shall be reasonably uniform but may differ in type or intensity from those in other zones in order to accommodate multiple objectives.

CHAPTER III

TENURED MIGRANTS

SEC. 13. Tenured Migrants. – Any person who has been actually and continuously occupying an area within the Pasonanca Natural Park for a period of five (5) years prior to the issuance of Proclamation No. 199, dated December 17, 1987, proclaiming the Pasonanca Watershed Forest Reservation, and is solely dependent on the protected area for subsistence shall be considered a tenured migrant.

A tenured migrant shall be eligible to become a steward of a reasonable portion of land within the multiple-use or buffer zones of the Pasonanca Natural Park from which tenured migrant's subsistence is derived: *Provided*, That current occupants who do not qualify as tenured migrants shall be resettled outside the protected area.

The PAMB shall review all tenure instruments, land claims or permits issued for resource use within the protected area, if any, and recommend the issuance of appropriate tenure instrument consistent with the management or

successor plans. Those who have been cultivating land within the protected area shall be considered to be occupying such lands and shall be entitled to a tenure instrument that is limited to cultivation and residence: *Provided*, That the rights accruing under such tenure instrument can only be transferred to direct descendants.

Nothing herein shall be construed to mean any diminution of accrued rights earned by tenured migrants. If an area occupied by a tenured migrant is designated as a zone in which no occupation or other activities are allowed, the latter shall be transferred to a multiple-use area or to the buffer zone under just and humane conditions.

In the event of termination of a tenure instrument for cause or by voluntary surrender of rights, the PASu shall take immediate steps to rehabilitate the area in order to return it to its approximate natural state prior to cultivation or other acts by the tenured migrant.

SEC. 14. Existing Rights. — All prior property and private rights within the protected area and its buffer zones, and ancestral domains already existing and/or with vested rights already accruing prior to the effectivity of this Act shall be protected and respected in accordance with existing laws.

CHAPTER IV

PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES

SEC. 15. Special Prosecutor. — Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Justice (DOJ) shall appoint a special prosecutor to whom all cases of violation of laws, rules and regulations in the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be assigned. Such special prosecutor shall coordinate with the PAMB and the PASu in the performance of their duties and assist in the training of park personnel in arrest and criminal procedures. The PAMB shall periodically submit an evaluation of the performance of the special prosecutor of the DOJ.

SEC. 16. *Prohibited Acts.* – The following acts are prohibited within the Pasonanca Natural Park and their corresponding penalties:

- (a) Hunting, destroying, disturbing or mere possession of any plant or animal and any product derived therefrom without a permit from the PAMB;
- (b) Dumping of any waste product or any form of activity detrimental to the protected area, or to the plants and animals or inhabitants therein;
- (c) Use of any vehicle or equipment within the protected area without a permit from the PAMB;
- (d) Mutilating, defacing or destroying objects of natural beauty or objects of interest to cultural communities;
 - (e) Damaging or leaving roads and trails in a damaged condition;
- (f) Squatting, undertaking mineral exploration, or otherwise occupying any portion of land;
- (g) Constructing or maintaining any kind of structure, fence or enclosure, or conducting any business enterprise without a permit duly issued by the PAMB; and
- (h) Altering, removing, destroying or defacing boundary marks or signs.

SEC. 17. Penalties. – Any person found guilty of any offense enumerated above shall be fined an amount of not less than five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) but not more than five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00), exclusive of the value of the thing damaged, and/or imprisonment of not less than one (1) year but not more than six (6) years, as may be determined by the court: Provided, That if the area requires rehabilitation or restoration, as determined by the court, the offender shall also be required to restore or compensate for the restoration of the damage: Provided, further, That the court shall order the eviction of the offender from the land and the forfeiture in favor of the government of all minerals, timber or any species collected or removed including all equipment, devices and

firearms used in connection therewith, and any construction or improvement made thereon by the offender. If the offender is an association or a corporation, the president or manager shall be directly responsible for the acts of employees and laborers: *Provided, finally,* That for such offenses, the DENR may conduct separate administrative proceedings against the offender and impose the corresponding fines and penalties in accordance with the law.

CHAPTER V

THE PROTECTED AREA FUND AND INCENTIVES FOR DONATIONS

AND BEQUESTS

SEC. 18. The Pasonanca Natural Park Fund. – There is hereby established a trust fund to be known as the Pasonanca Natural Park Fund (PNPF) for purposes of financing the projects of the protected area. All income generated from the operation or the management of wild flora and fauna in the protected area shall accrue to the PNPF. These income shall be derived from visitors/tourists fee, fees from permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the protected area, proceeds from the registration and lease of multiple-use areas, including tourism concessions, contributions from industries and facilities directly benefiting from the protected area, and such other fees and income derived from the operation of the protected area.

The PAMB shall retain seventy-five percent (75%) of all revenues raised, to be deposited in any government bank within the locality; and that disbursements shall be made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the area and implementation of duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with existing accounting, budgeting and auditing rules and regulations: *Provided*, That the Fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

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1	The remaining twenty-five percent (25%) of the revenues shall be
2	deposited as a special account in the National Treasury as share of the
3	Integrated Protected Area Fund (IPAF) created pursuant to Republic Act
4	No. 7586.
5	The local government units (LGUs) shall continue to impose and
6 .	collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally
7	collected, such as business permits, property tax and rentals of LGUs'
8	facilities. Furthermore, LGUs may charge add-ons to fees imposed by the
9	PAMB: Provided, That such add-ons shall be determined based on the
10	contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance and protection of the
11	Pasonanca Natural Park.
12	SEC. 19. Tax Exemption The Fund may be augmented by grants,
13	donations and endowment from various domestic or foreign sources.
14.	Any donation or bequest made to the Pasonanca Natural Park Fund shall be
15	exempt from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable
16	deduction from the gross income of the donor, in accordance with the
17	provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as amended.
18	The Fund may be augmented by grants, donations and endowment from
19 -	various domestie or foreign sources.
20	CHAPTER VI
21	EXISTING FACILITIES, UTILIZATION OF RESOURCES, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT
22.	ASSESSMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS
23	SEC. 20. Existing Facilities Within the Protected Area Existing
24	facilities, if any, within the Pasonanca Natural Park shall be inventoried and
25	assessed by the PAMB in accordance with the objectives of this Act. Within
26	thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, unless extended by the
27	PAMB, all commercial facilities existing within the boundaries of the

protected area with a total capitalization of not less than one hundred

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thousand pesos (P100,000.00) shall submit to the PAMB, through the PASu,

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2	a sworn statement containing the following information:								
3	(a) Environmental Impact Assessment and/or Environmental								
4	Management Plan;								
5	(b) Environmental Compliance Certificate; and								
.6	(c) Development Plan.								
7	Based on these submissions, the PAMB, with the assistance of the								
8	DENR, shall determine whether the existence of such facilities and their								
9	future plans and operations are detrimental to the Pasonanca Natural Park.								
10	Failure to submit the required information shall constitute a violation								
11	of this Act, punishable after proper administrative proceedings, by								
12	expulsion from the area.								
13	The PAMB may prescribe conditions for the operation of the facilities								
14	to ensure that these do not conflict with management objectives. If any of								
15	such conditions is violated, a fine shall be imposed by the PAMB.								
16	The PAMB, through the PASu or other deputized government entities, is								
17	hereby authorized to cause the immediate cessation and demolition of any								
18	facility within the Pasonanca Natural Park whose continued operation is								
19	deemed detrimental to the area. The cost of the demolition shall be borne by								
20 .	the owners or operators of these facilities.								
21	The removal of existing facilities which provide basic services and								
22	amenities to the public shall require the concurrence of the City Government								
23	of Zamboanga, consistent with the responsibility of the local government to								
24 .	secure the welfare of its constituents.								
25	Existing facilities within the Pasonanca Natural Park may be charged								
26	reasonable fees by the PAMB, subject to the DENR approval, pursuant to								
27	Section 10(f) of the NIPAS Act, based on the extent of their impact on the								
28	environment and biodiversity. All income derived from such fees shall accrue								

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to the PNPF.

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1	SEC. 21. Utilization of Nonrenewable Resources Any exploration
2	for, or exploitation or utilization of nonrenewable resources within the
3	Pasonanca Natural Park shall not be allowed.
4	SEC. 22. Environmental Impact Assessment System Existing laws
5	rules and regulations relating to EIA shall apply to all projects and activitie
6	intended in the Pasonanca Natural Park. The issuance of the Environmenta
7	Compliance Certificate or its exemptions shall be undertaken in coordination
8	with the PAMB.
9	SEC. 23. Partnerships For the purpose of attaining the objective
10	of this Act, other government agencies or offices, NGOs and POs and their
11	personnel shall continuously foster and develop strong and true partnerships.
12	All NGOs, POs and private entities implementing any part
13	conservation, protection and development program must be accredited by the
14	City Government of Zamboanga and the DENR.
15	SEC. 24. Roles of National Agencies and the Local Government Unit
16	Concerned The City Government of Zamboanga and relevant national
17	agencies represented in the PAMB shall have the following roles:
18	(a) Apprise their respective constituents, office or sector on activities
19	and programs for the protected area;
20	(b) Ensure consistency in the implementation of all activities in the
21	protected area;
22	(c) Assist the PAMB in the implementation of the overall park
23	programs, including the imposition, collection and utilization of park fees,
24	enforcement of policies, rules and regulations and other similar activities;
25	(d) Accredit POs, NGOs and other entities and groups involved in the
26	activities within the protected area; and

(e) Provide the PAMB with relevant information and data for the

effective management of the protected area.

1	Additionally, in the exercise of its ordinance-making power over any
2	area within the protected area, the City Government of Zamboanga shall
3	consider the management plan and the rules and regulations adopted by the
4	PAMB in the legislative agenda relating to biodiversity, conservation,
5	protection and sustainable development.
6	In the formulation of its development plan, the City Government of
7	Zamboanga shall consult the PAMB for the Pasonanca Natural Park.
8	Finally, the City Government of Zamboanga may provide financial
9	assistance for the protection and enhancement of the protected area.
10	SEC. 25. Public Service Utilities and Projects All existing and
11	future development projects of public service utilities involving water services,
12	communication facilities, power and energy generation, public security, health
13	and education services and others which will promote public welfare shall be
14	implemented within areas designated and approved by the PAMB.
15	CHAPTER VII
16	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
17	SEC. 26. Appropriations The DENR Secretary shall immediately
18	include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the
19	funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
20	SEC. 27. Construction The provisions of this Act shall be construed
21	liberally in favor of tenured migrants, with due consideration to the prior
22	property rights of the stakeholders to sustainable development, and the
23	conservation and protection of biodiversity. Existing forestry laws and their
24	corresponding rules and regulations not inconsistent herewith shall have
25	suppletory effect in the implementation of this Act.

SEC. 28. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the other parts or sections hereof.

	SEC. 29.	Repealing	Clause.	-	All	laws,	rules	and	regulations		
inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.											

SEC. 30. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation readily available in and around the scope specified herein. It shall likewise be posted in a conspicuous place at the City Hall of Zamboanga and in the barangay halls concerned where the protected area is located and in other places frequented by the public.
