AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INDIGENOUS TRAINING CENTER IN THE CITY OF KIDAPAWAN, PROVINCE OF NORTH COTABATO, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. There shall be established an indigenous training and learning center in the City of Kidapawan, Province of North Cotabato.

4 SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the National Commission on 5 Indigenous Peoples (NCIP), in coordination with the Technical

6 Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), to provide

appropriate training of skills and development to recipient members

of the indigenous cultural communities (ICCs) in the City of

9 Kidapawan, Province of North Cotabato.

To this end, the NCIP shall formulate learning programs that
shall be relevant to the needs of the concerned ICCs who themselves
shall determine the types of skills they need to be trained at, given
their circumstances. For this purpose, the NCIP shall coordinate
with the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) for
the construction of a building where the skills training and learning
sessions shall be conducted.

- SEC. 3. The Chairperson of the NCIP shall include in the Commission's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- SEC. 4. Within sixty (60) days after the effectivity of this Act, the NCIP, in coordination with the TESDA, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations to govern the effective implementation of this Act.
- SEC. 5. Any provision of law, order, issuance, rule or regulation inconsistent with this Act is hereby repealed, revoked, or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 6. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
