AN ACT DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL A TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AREA AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The Province of Misamis Oriental is hereby declared a tourism development area. As such, its development shall be prioritized by the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), and shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the development of tourism development areas.

SEC. 2. The DOT, in coordination with the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority and other concerned agencies of the government, shall prepare a tourism development plan providing for the development, maintenance, improvement and restoration of tourist sites, where appropriate, in conformity with set forth standards, including the construction of hotels, resorts, restaurants, recreational facilities and other appropriate facilities

- and infrastructure: *Provided*, That said development plan shall ensure the preservation of the ecological balance and natural beauty of the areas concerned.
- SEC. 3. The DPWH, in coordination with the DOT, shall implement the construction and/or improvement of roads and other infrastructure necessary in the development of the Province of Misamis Oriental upon the promulgation of this Act and incorporate the same in its infrastructure program.
  - SEC. 4. The DOT shall take immediate steps to implement the development plan and incorporate the same in the Department's overall tourism development program for the ensuing year.
  - SEC. 5. The Secretary of the DOT and the Secretary of the DPWH shall include in their respective Departments' programs the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act and from internally generated funds of the DOT.
  - SEC. 6. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the DOT shall likewise promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper implementation of this Act.
  - SEC. 7. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.
  - SEC. 8. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in any newspaper of general circulation.
