	AN ACT DECLARING THE BAKHAWAN ECO-PARK IN BARANGAY NEW BUSWANG, MUNICIPALITY OF KALIBO, PROVINCE OF AKLAN AN ECOTOURISM ZONE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR
	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
1	SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy The State is mandated
2	to promote a tourism industry that is ecologically sustainable
3	responsible, participative, culturally sensitive, economically viable
4	and equitably beneficial to local communities.
5	Sec. 2. Bakhawan Eco-Park Ecotourism Zone
6	The Bakhawan Eco-Park in Barangay New Buswang, Municipality
7	of Kalibo, Province of Aklan is hereby declared a community-based
8	ecotourism zone. As such, its development shall be prioritized by
9	the Department of Tourism (DOT), subject to the rules and
10	regulations governing the development of ecotourism zones.
11	Sec. 3. Objectives Pursuant to the above declaration
12	of policy, the State shall seek to:

(a) Develop and promote responsible "community-based ecological tourism" as the core management strategy in the development of the Bakhawan Eco-Park;

- (b) Ensure the conservation of the biodiversity and the preservation of said eco-park;
- (c) Develop tourism products and programs that shall generate employment and livelihood for the local residents and nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) concerned, consistent with the preservation and maintenance of the mangrove forest;
- (d) Guarantee that the financial and economic benefits of the tourism industry are equitably shared by and distributed among the local residents and NGOs concerned, by giving preference and support to community- and home-based tourism enterprises, such as micro and small businesses, like local inns, lodges and homestays, restaurants, food and fruit stands, and other similar tourism-oriented industries and businesses;
- (e) Ensure that the quality of local tourism programs and activities are educational and enriching for tourists and visitors through the provision of orientation, educational and tour programs by local tour operators, NGOs, the municipal government of Kalibo and the DOT; and
- (f) Guarantee that, in the development and promotion of the local tourism industry, the municipal government of Kalibo ensures that the need of local residents for water, food, energy and local construction materials is adequately met.

SEC. 4. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

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2 (a) Biodiversity conservation refers to the practice of 3 preserving the variety of species, habits and ecosystems, and genetic 4 diversity of the place, including *inter alia*, terrestrial, marine and 5 other aquatic ecosystems, and the ecological complexes which they 6 are a part of;

- (b) Community-based tourism refers to a form of tourism where the local community and its residents have substantial control over and involvement in the development and management of the local tourism industry and a greater portion of the economic gains remain within the community;
- (c) Ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism within a natural area where community participation, protection and management of natural resources, cultural and indigenous knowledge and practices, environmental education and ethics, as well as economic benefits are fostered and pursued for the enrichment of host communities and satisfaction of visitors;
- (d) Homestay refers to a system of tourist accommodation where a tourist stays with local residents and experiences the day-to-day life of the residents of the Bakhawan Eco-Park community, Barangay New Buswang and the Municipality of Kalibo; and
- (e) Responsible ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism in which both the tourism sector and the tourists take responsibility in the protection, respect, and conservation of the natural environment and the local culture and ways of life, and where community participation as well as economic benefits

- 1 are fostered and pursued for the well-being of the local people 2 in Barangay New Buswang and visitors.
- SEC. 5. Scope and Coverage. This Act shall cover the boundaries of the two hundred twenty (220)-hectare mangrove
- 5 forest of the Bakhawan Eco-Park in Barangay New Buswang,
- 6 Municipality of Kalibo, Province of Aklan.
- 7 The setting of technical boundaries of the ecotourism zone 8 shall be undertaken by the Department of Environment and
- 9 Natural Resources (DENR) and other concerned agencies.
- 10 SEC. 6. Tourism Development Plan for the Bakhawan 11 Eco-Park. – The DOT, in coordination with the DENR, 12 shall assist the municipal government of Kalibo in the formulation
- shall assist the municipal government of Kalibo in the formulation
- 13 of a tourism development plan for the Bakhawan Eco-Park that
- shall be complemented by a set of guidelines for a responsible,
- 15 community-based ecotourism.

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- The tourism development plan shall ensure the preservation of the area and shall include the following components:
 - (a) Carrying capacity of the eco-park;
- 19 (b) Specific site assessment;
 - (c) Identification of strategic priorities;
- 21 (d) Product development plans for local income generation;
- 22 (e) Capacity-building for the local community so residents 23 therein can ably manage economically viable and responsible,
- 24 community-based ecotourism business enterprises;
- 25 (f) Strategies to promote the formulation of local production 26 groups and networks, including the marketing and pricing of 27 products; and

1	(g) Marketing strategies that uphold the natural, social
2	and environmental integrity of the Bakhawan Eco-Park
3	and its local residents.
4	The process of formulating the tourism development plan
5	for the Bakhawan Eco-Park shall be participatory, with the
6	framework to be provided by the DOT and the DENR,
7	in consultation with the local governments of Kalibo and Barangay
8	New Buswang.
9	Sec. 7. Formulation of Guidelines and Standards
10	The concerned Protected Area Management Board of the DENR
11	and the local tourism council, in coordination with the local
12	governments of Kalibo and Barangay New Buswang, shall assist in
13	the formulation of local tourism standards, ensuring that
14	environmental protection is integrated in the development of
15	ecotourism plans.
16	These local tourism standards shall:
17	(a) Raise the capacity of all stakeholders and ensure that best
18	practices are followed;
19	(b) Ensure optional use of water and energy;
20	(c) Reduce waste and pollution through the encouragement
21	and recycling and environmentally-sound waste management
22	disposal schemes, with a principle of taking as much waste away
23	from the eco-park as possible;
24	(d) Prevent vandalism in the facilities of the eco-park; and
25	(e) Encourage the use of local produce and services, and
26	support the employment of local people.

1	SEC. 8. Coordination with National Agencies The
2	DOT shall closely coordinate with the municipal government
3	of Kalibo, as well as the regional offices of the DENR, Department
4	of Labor and Employment, Department of Public Works and
5	Highways, Department of Transportation, Department of
6	Agriculture, Department of Education, Department of Trade
7	and Industry, Department of the Interior and Local Government,
8	Philippine National Police, Maritime Industry Authority, and other
9	line agencies of the government in the implementation of this Act.
10	SEC. 9. Appropriations The Secretary of the DOT
11	shall include in the Department's program the implementation
12	of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual
13	General Appropriations Act and from internally generated funds
14	of the DOT.
15	Sec. 10. Implementing Rules and Regulations
16	Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the DOT and
17	the DENR, in consultation with the municipal government of Kalibo
18	and other concerned government agencies and stakeholders, shall
19	promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper
20	implementation of this Act.
21	Sec. 11. Separability Clause If, for any reason,
22	any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the
23	other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall

SEC. 12. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, executive

orders, proclamations and administrative regulations, or parts

continue to be in full force and effect.

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- 1 thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified
- 2 accordingly.
- 3 SEC. 13. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect
- 4 fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette
- 5 or in any newspaper of general circulation.
