- AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DELINEATION OF THE SPECIFIC FOREST LIMITS OF THE PUBLIC DOMAIN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES
- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
- 1 SECTION. 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the 2 "Forestland Limits Act".
  - SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is the policy of the State to conserve, protect and develop the forest resources of the country in order to attain ecological balance, preserve valuable ecosystems, prevent environmental degradation and promote sustainable development for the present and future generations. To achieve

these ends, Section 4 of Article XII of the Constitution mandates Congress to determine by law the specific limits of forestlands and national parks marking clearly their boundaries on the ground.

## SEC. 3. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

- (a) Agricultural lands refer to alienable and disposable lands of the public domain which have been the subject of the land classification system and declared as not needed for forest purposes;
- (b) Delimitation refers to the establishment of permanent boundary monuments of forestland through land survey in accordance with existing standards and practices;
- (c) Delineation refers to the conduct of site investigation, field reconnaissance and assessment, and staking of boundaries among forestlands, national parks and agricultural lands verified in the field in accordance with the criteria set forth under Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Administrative Order No. 2008-24:
- (d) Forest refers to a land with an area of more than 0.5 hectare and tree crown cover or equivalent stocking level of more than ten percent (10%) with trees at a minimum height of five (5) meters at maturity, in situ. It consists either of closed forest formations, where trees of various stories and undergrowth cover a high proportion of the ground or more than forty percent (40%), or open formations with a continuous vegetation cover in which tree crown cover exceeds ten percent (10%) but less than forty percent (40%). Young natural stands and all plantations established for forest purposes, which are yet to reach a crown density of more than

ten percent (10%) or tree height of five (5) meters are included under forests;

- (e) Forest reservations refer to forestlands which have been reserved by the President of the Philippines for any specific purpose or purposes;
- (f) *Production forestlands* refer to forestlands available for timber and agroforestry production, range lands for grazing and other forestlands special uses;
- (g) Protected area refers to identified portions of land and/or water set aside by reason of their unique physical and biological significance, managed to enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human exploitation:
- 13 (h) Protection forestlands refer to all areas within the 14 forestlands devoted primarily for the protection and conservation of 15 forest resources to ensure environmental stability, conservation of 16 biological diversity, improvement of ecosystem functions and 17 services, and provision of ecological and economic benefits. All 18 mossy and primary or old growth forests and natural beach, key 19 biodiversity areas, areas which are highly erodible or too rocky for 20 establishment as production forests, regardless of slope and 21 vegetation cover that are developed for the principal objective of 22 establishing vegetative cover to prevent erosion, conserve water and 23 nurture wildlife, freshwater, swamps, and marshes, all areas along 24 the bank of the rivers and streams, and the shores of the seas and 25 lakes throughout their entire length and within the zone of three (3) 26 meters in urban areas, twenty (20) meters in agricultural areas, and 27 forty (40) meters in forest areas, along their margins which are

- subject to the easement of public use such as for recreation, settlements, navigation, floatage, fishing or salvage shall also be subclassified as protection forestlands. Cutting of trees and mining are banned in these protection forestlands: *Provided*, That the provisions of Republic Act No. 8371, "The Indigenous Peoples' Rights Act of 1997" and Republic Act No. 7586, the "National
- 7 Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992" shall be respected;

- (i) Tenured migrant communities refer to communities within forestlands which have actually and continuously occupied such areas for five (5) years before the designation of the same as forestlands in accordance with this Act and are solely dependent therein for subsistence.
- 14 SEC. 4. Forestlands. The following shall constitute 15 forestlands:
  - (a) All lands of the public domain already classified as forestland based on existing land classification maps issued by the DENR;
  - (b) All permanent forest reserves proclaimed as such by the President or declared by law; and
  - (c) Such areas within the unclassified lands of the public domain that were assessed and delineated by the DENR in accordance with pertinent laws, rules and regulations and which may hereafter be classified as forestland by the DENR.
- 25 SEC. 5. Determining the Specific Limits of Forestlands. –
  26 The following guidelines and procedures shall be followed in
  27 determining the specific limits of forestlands in the country:

- (a) The previously established land classification (LC) survey lines per province with their respective technical descriptions (TDs) and maps shall be the basic data and information that will be used as reference material in undertaking the validation, assessment and delineation process;
- (b) All completed assessment and delineation reports for a given province shall be endorsed to the National Review and Evaluation Committee as created herein to be headed by the Secretary of the DENR for final approval; and
- (c) The same process shall be followed for other provinces with ongoing assessments and delineation activities until such time that all the boundaries of forestlands of the whole country shall have been delimited: *Provided*, That all assessments, validations and delineations shall be completed not later than one (1) year after the passage of this Act.
- SEC. 6. National Review and Evaluation Committee. Pursuant to the mandate embodied in Section 4, Article XII of the Constitution, and in view of the urgent need to establish the permanent limits of the forestlands of the country, a National Review and Evaluation Committee, hereinafter referred to as the Committee, is hereby created to process, evaluate and approve all completed assessment and delineation reports referred to in the immediately preceding section. The Committee, in its evaluation and approval of the reports, shall adhere strictly to established laws, policies, rules, regulations and guidelines pertinent thereto.
  - The Committee shall be composed of the following:
  - (a) Secretary of the DENR as Chairperson;

| 17 | SEC. 7. Demarcation and Delimitation of Forestland                      |
| 18 | Boundary Immediately after the passage of this Act, the forest          |
| 19 | line determined and established by the DENR shall be adopted as         |
| 20 | the forestland boundary of the country and all monuments                |
| 21 | established shall be deemed permanent. Maps of the forestland           |
| 22 | boundary prepared by the DENR shall be attached as an integral          |
| 23 | part of this Act for reference.   |
| 24 | SEC. 8. Permanency of the Specific Forestlands Limits                   |
| 25 | The permanent forestlands established pursuant to this Act shall        |
| 26 | not be diminished nor reduced except by an act of Congress. The         |

DENR, in coordination with all agencies and branches of

| 23 | from land classification as a result of the delimitation of forestlands |
| 24 | pursuant to this Act. The Board shall be composed of the following:     |
| 25 | (a) Secretary of the Department of Justice (DOJ) as                     |

| 17 | execution and other writs to enforce its orders and decisions.           |
| 18 | In any proceeding before the Board, the Rules of Evidence                |
| 19 | prevailing in courts of law or equity shall not be controlling and it is |
| 20 | the spirit and intention of this Act that shall govern. The Board        |
| 21 | shall use every and all reasonable means to ascertain the facts in       |
| 22 | each case speedily and objectively. The findings of fact of the Board    |
| 23 | shall be conclusive and binding on the parties and its decision or       |
| 24 | order shall be final and executory.                                      |
| 25 | A petition for review by certiorari and question of law may be           |
| 26 | filed by the aggrieved party with the Supreme Court within               |
| 27 | thirty (30) days from receipt of the order or decision of the Board.     |

| 2  | To attain the objectives of this Act, a field monitoring, evaluation     |
| 3  | and reporting system shall be adopted by the Secretary of the            |
| 4  | DENR to regularly keep track of the state of the country'                |
| 5  | forestlands after their delineation and ensure that these lands are      |
| 6  | protected and conserved.   |
| 7  | SEC. 15. Appropriations The Secretary of the DENR shall                  |
| 8  | include in the Department's program the implementation of this           |
| 9  | Act, the initial funding of which shall be charged against the           |
| 10 | current year's appropriations of the Department and, thereafter          |
| 11 | shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.              |
| 12 | Funds for the implementation of the provisions of this Ac                |
| 13 | shall be supplemented from any available official development            |
| 14 | assistance (ODA) and from joint projects between agencies of the         |
| 15 | Philippines and an assisting country.                                    |
| 16 | LGUs shall also allocate counterpart funds to be taken from              |
| 17 | their internal revenue allotment (IRA) and other LGU income for          |
| 18 | the delineation of the forest limits within their respective territorial |
| 19 | jurisdictions.   |
| 20 | SEC. 16. Implementing Rules and Regulations Within                       |
| 21 | ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the  |
| 22 | DENR shall issue the corresponding implementing rules and                |
| 23 | regulations for its implementation.                                      |
| 24 | SEC. 17. Separability Clause If any portion of this Act is               |
| 25 | declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and    |
| 26 | effectivity of the other provisions not affected thereby.                |

| 1 | SEC. 18. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, letters of                |

| 5 | SEC. 19. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)           |
