AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE ROMBLON PROVINCIAL TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (TESDA) TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTERS IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF CAJIDIOCAN IN SIBUYAN ISLAND, AND ODIONGAN IN TABLAS ISLAND, PROVINCE OF ROMBLON, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Romblon Provincial TESDA Training and Assessment Centers Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. Establishment. There is hereby established two (2)
- 5 Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA)
- 6 Provincial Training and Assessment Centers in the Province of
- 7 Romblon, under the supervision of the TESDA, to be known

as the Romblon Provincial TESDA Training and Assessment
Centers. The Centers shall be established, respectively, in the
municipalities of Cajidiocan in Sibuyan Island and Odiongan in
Tablas Island, Province of Romblon, pursuant to the purposes
of this Act and to the mutual agreement between the TESDA

6 and the concerned local government units (LGUs).

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SEC. 3. General Mandate. - The Romblon Provincial TESDA Training and Assessment Centers, hereinafter referred to as the Centers, shall primarily provide technical-vocational training and skills development programs, including short-term specialty courses and one (1)-year to three (3)-year TESDA-registered technical-vocational skills training programs and certificate courses, to out-of-school youths, high school students and graduates, unemployed and underemployed adults, workers in the informal sector, persons with disabilities and indigenous people, and residents from low-income families in the host municipalities of Cajidiocan and Odiongan and the adjacent localities in Sibuyan and Tablas Islands and islet municipalities of the Province of Romblon, to help them become productive, self-reliant and globally competitive labor assets. The Centers shall also aim to meet the maximum competency requirements under Level V, or the Diploma Level in Technical-Vocational Education and Training (TVET), of the Philippine Qualifications Framework (PQF), as institutionalized by Republic Act No. 10968 (PQF Act).

1 The Centers shall help train and develop local residents 2 in the seventeen (17) island localities in the Province of 3 Romblon within the operational radius of the Centers into 4 globally competitive middle to high-level skilled labor force to 5 meet the manpower demands of both local and international 6 labor markets, and hasten the socioeconomic development of 7 these areas and of the province. The Centers shall consider, in the design of relevant TVET programs to be offered therein. 8 9 the preferred skills categories based on identified development targets to propel these areas to becoming skilled human resource 10 11 and productivity hubs.

The Centers shall also serve as TESDA-accredited Assessment Centers for acquired competencies in technicalvocational skills in the municipalities of Cajidiocan and Odiongan, and the neighboring islands and localities in the Province of Romblon.

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17 The Centers, in coordination with the Department of 18 Education (DepEd) and the TESDA, shall offer relevant teachers' 19 training assistance and curriculum design to the secondary 20 schools providing the technical-vocational livelihood (TVL) track under the K to 12 Program of the DepEd in Cajidiocan and 22 Odiongan, and the neighboring islands and localities in the Province of Romblon.

SEC. 4. Curricular Offerings/Training Programs. - The Centers, in consultation with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI),

Department of Agriculture (DA), Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA). locally and internationally-based business industry partners, and other relevant agencies, shall offer diverse short-term certificate courses and modular trainings in relevant technical-vocational skills and trade specialization to comply with employment standards in preferred and emerging market-driven labor opportunities. The Centers shall spearhead training programs in new skills to respond to market trends towards attaining a robust inclusive economy in the host sites and in the adjacent localities and communities in the Province of Romblon within the operational radius of the Centers. 

The Centers may establish research and technology hubs, technology development farms, mobile training programs, and satellite or extension training centers in priority areas throughout the municipalities of Cajidiocan and Odiongan, and the neighboring islands and localities in the Province of Romblon to serve the manpower needs of these areas and strengthen the linkages among the industry, the academe, and the Centers.

The Centers shall offer the following TESDA-registered technical-vocational training programs with competencies assessment leading to National Certification Levels I-III to increase the livelihood assets and competitive productivity of the municipalities of Cajidiocan and Odiongan, and the neighboring islands and localities in the Province of Romblon:

- (a) Skills training in industrial technology and hard trades such as metal and steel works, machine fabrication and operation, heavy equipment operation, automotive mechanic, refrigeration and air conditioning, electronics, and operation of power tools and equipment for both medium skills grade and industrial purposes;
- (b) Agriculture and aquaculture-related training and skills development in such areas as farming-fishing operations technology, backyard farming and home-based aquaculture and propagation innovation, mechanized farm and fishing tools and equipment operation, agribusiness, agri-aqua trade technology and innovation, and relevant farmers' and fisherfolk's continuing training for increased productivity and entrepreneurship;
- (c) Social communication skills development, language proficiency courses in English and other languages for business process outsourcing (call center) employment and overseas job placement;
- (d) Livelihood skills development courses for preferred skills employment and small-scale entrepreneurship (including practical skills education in crafts and arts), workmanship and designing (such as fabric, woodworks, jewelry and metal works), high-speed sewing, dressmaking and tailoring, agriculture and farm technology, horticulture, livestock raising and breeding, food processing technology, home technology, culinary arts and commercial cooking (including baking), beauty culture (such as cosmetology, hair and nail styling), and health and wellness trainings;

- (e) Basic business literacy training in financial management and marketing, practical accountancy, bookkeeping and office procedures, business processes and application procedures including registration, licensing, documentation, business patent and intellectual property regulation, business financing and investment opportunities sourcing, import-export accreditation, including online home-based business operation and use of social media business marketing;
  - (f) Technical-vocational occupation and trade skills such as carpentry, masonry, plumbing, welding, practical electricity and installation, automotive servicing, electronics servicing, personal computer (PC) servicing, and other relevant practical skills courses;
  - (g) Computer literacy and information technology (IT)-related skills, digital technology, web design, animation, photoshop/online photography, computer design and advertising;
- (h) Seminars in personality development, career counselingand job placement, and work ethics and values; and
- 18 (i) Other preferred priority skills and trade trainings
  19 that may be utilized by the people of the Province of Romblon
  20 for practical livelihood, gainful employment, and entrepreneurial
  21 activities.
  - SEC. 5. Compliance with TESDA Requirements. The provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the Centers established herein shall become operationally effective only upon the determination and declaration of the TESDA, through the issuance of a formal recommendation and certificate of compliance, that each

of the Centers has satisfactorily complied with the minimum 1 2 requirements for quality standards prescribed by TESDA governing the following competency assessment: (a) standard 3 procedures and guidelines (SPGs) for the establishment and 4 operation of a TESDA-accredited provincial training 5 competency assessment center; (b) operational sustainability 6 of each of the Centers established herein, such as licensed 7 faculty-trainers and personnel, equipment, training and laboratory 8 facilities, instructional materials, and sustainable funding 9 source for the budgetary requirement of the Centers herein 10 established; (c) assurance that the training programs offered are 11 fully aligned with the minimum standards of competency-based 12 13 quality technical-vocational skills technology and the needs of the host localities and the adjacent islands and communities 14 within the service area of the Centers; (d) program alignment 15 16 and benchmarking in the context of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) framework and the PQF for TVET; 17 18 and (e) compliance with other TESDA conditionalities and 19 standards in establishing a TESDA-accredited training and 20 assessment center, as may be necessary. 21

SEC. 6. Administration. — The Centers shall each be headed by a Technical-Vocational Administrator, who shall hold the appropriate position title and rank under existing TESDA staffing pattern, and who shall be appointed by the TESDA Director General in accordance with Civil Service Commission rules and regulations and the qualification requirements for such office.

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Technical-Vocational Administrator shall render full-time service and shall be responsible for the administration and operation of the Centers. As far as necessary and practicable, and subject to existing procedures and the approval of the TESDA Director General, the Technical-Vocational Administrator shall enter into mutual agreements with local-based counterpart agencies, or instrumentalities and persons, both private and government, for such assistance as may be necessary to effectively implement this Act.

SEC. 7. Appropriations. — The Director General of the TESDA shall include in the Authority's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act. The LGUs concerned, in consultation with then TESDA, shall likewise set aside from any available local revenue an amount deemed appropriate as annual counterpart fund to support the operation of the Centers established herein.

SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. — Within ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act, the TESDA, in coordination with the DOLE, DTI, DA, Department of Budget and Management (DBM), DILG, DOST, NEDA, the concerned LGUs, and other relevant agencies and industry-business partners of the host localities and the provincial government shall prepare and issue the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

SEC. 10. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders, decrees, instructions, rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with any provision of this Act are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SEC. 11. Effectivity. — This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
