AN ACT DESIGNATING THE NATIONAL MUSIC COMPETITIONS FOR YOUNG ARTISTS (NAMCYA) AS THE NATIONAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR MUSIC, DEFINING ITS ROLE AND FUNCTIONS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 Section 1. Title. This Act shall be known as the 2 "NAMCYA Act".
- 3 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the 4 policy of the State to appropriately recognize, designate, and 5 support nongovernment organizations that have demonstrated 6 pioneering, consistent, and unassailable competence, effectiveness,

and success in discovering and developing young musical artists and talents, and the preservation, development, and promotion of Philippine music and culture.

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- SEC. 3. Designation as the Philippine National Youth Development Program in Music. The National Music Competitions for Young Artists (NAMCYA) is hereby designated as the Philippine National Youth Development Program for Music in recognition of its role in developing young Filipino musical artists and talents and in promoting Philippine music and culture.
- SEC. 4. Role and Functions. As the duly designated National Youth Development Program for Music, the NAMCYA shall:
- (a) Discover outstanding musical talents through nationwide competitions and festivals designed for young Filipino musicians in all forms, styles, and musical traditions in the country;
- (b) Assist in the cultivation, development, and advancement of outstanding young Filipino musicians through scholarships, training performances and other forms of incentives:
- (c) Preserve, develop, and promote Philippine music as an art and as an important component of cultural and social development;
- (d) Establish a training program for music leaders, experts, and teachers in order to maintain and cultivate the highest standard of musical training for the youth;
- (e) Strengthen the multicultural fiber of the country by nurturing and developing gifted young musicians and musical ensembles from the cultural communities, and preserve and disseminate their musical expressions and traditions;

1	(f) Encourage and support the creation and performance of
2	works by Filipino composers and making possible their publication
3	and dissemination;
4	(g) Recognize artistic achievements through awards, grants,
5	and services;
6	(h) Undertake a continuing program of research,
7	documentation, and publication of Philippine music for
8	dissemination to schools and the general public; and
9	(i) Receive and accept donations and other conveyances from
10	government agencies, private entities, and other sources, including
11	funds, materials, and services, by gratuitous title.
12	SEC. 5. Entitlements The NAMCYA shall be entitled to
13	avail of assistance, benefits and privileges from the following
14	government agencies, namely:
15	(a) The Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP), which shall
16	provide the NAMCYA with financial support, office space, and free
17	use of venue and facilities for NAMCYA organized competitions,
18	festivals, productions, and performances: Provided, That a
19	reasonable amount of utilities and direct costs may be charged;
20	(b) The Department of Education (DepEd) and the
21	Commission on Higher Education (CHED), which shall assist
22	the NAMCYA in the identification, selection, and training of
23	participants from the different regions of the country. The DepEd,
24	CHED, and state universities and colleges shall likewise

provide free use of their respective venues and facilities for

NAMCYA-organized local music competitions and festivals;

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1	(c) The Department of the Interior and Local Government
2	(DILG), which shall be authorized to utilize its funds for the
3	training of participants and in the conduct of NAMCYA-organized
4	local music competitions and festivals;
5	(d) The National Commission for Culture and the Arts
6	(NCCA), which shall give preference to project proposals from
7	NAMCYA and provide continuous financial and technical support
8	for its competitions, festivals, scholarship assistance, and research
9	activities. The NCCA shall ensure the provision of annual financial
10	assistance to NAMCYA to sustain its aforestated role and functions
11	under this Act; and
12	(e) The government-cwned and-controlled corporations, which
13	may give donations and grants to the NAMCYA.
14	SEC. 6. Donations Any donation, contribution, bequest and
15	grant which may be made to the NAMCYA to be used actually.
16	directly and exclusively for charitable purposes shall be exempt
17	from donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable
18	deductions from the gross income of the donor, in accordance with
19	the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code, as amended.

SEC. 7. Memorandum of Agreement. — Within thirty (30) days upon the effectivity of this Act, the NAMCYA shall execute the necessary Memoranda of Agreements with the CCP, NCCA, DepEd, CHED, DILG and other concerned stakeholders, respectively, in accordance with this Act and other existing laws.

SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within ninety (90) days from the approval of this Act, the President of the CCP shall, in consultation with the Chairperson of the NCCA and

1.	heads of other concerned government agencies, formulate the rules
2	and regulations implementing the provisions of this Act.
3	SEC. 9. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is
4	held invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not so declared
5	shall remain in force and effect.
6	SEC. 10. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, and
7	rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions
8	of this Act are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
9	SEC. 11. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)
0,	days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of
1	general circulation.
