AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES BY DECLARING IT AS THE NATIONAL POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Revised Polytechnic University of
 the Philippines (PUP) Charter."

3 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - The Polytechnic University of the Philippines, 4 hereinafter referred to as the University, is hereby declared as the National 5 Polytechnic University. For this purpose, the University shall be strengthened to 6 guide and support other polytechnic state universities and colleges (SUCs) in 7 developing professional courses and other technical programs.

1 SEC. 3. *The University System.* - The University shall be composed of its existing regular 2 campuses and other campuses that maybe established.

SEC. 4. Fiscal and Institutional Autonomy. - As the National Polytechnic University, it shall З enjoy institutional and fiscal autonomy. It shall be treated in a manner consistent with its 4 institutional requirements. Taking into account national goals and priorities, it shall exclusively 5 determine its teaching, research and extension thrusts, plans, policies, programs and standards. On 6 the basis of such determination, the University shall recommend its annual budget to the President 7 of the Republic of the Philippines and Congress. Appropriations for the University shall not be 8 reduced by the legislature below the amount appropriated for the previous year and shall 9 automatically and regularly be released to the University immediately after approval. 10

SEC. 5. General Mandate. - The University shall primarily provide higher occupational, technical and professional instruction and training in the fields of engineering and architecture, applied sciences, accountancy, law, education, business and management, and shall promote applied research, advance studies, and progressive leadership in these fields. As the national polytechnic university, the University shall implement programs designed to ameliorate pressing social needs by rendering services to individuals and communities and empowering the citizenry for sustainable development.

18 SEC. 6. *Curricular Offerings.* - The University shall offer undergraduate and graduate programs 19 in the fields of accountancy, engineering, architecture, applied sciences, law, education, business 20 and management, non traditional courses, and other fields of study. In addition, the University 21 shall offer other programs in the polytechnic areas in light of its purpose as a national polytechnic 22 university.

SEC. 7. The University Administration. - The administration of the University shall be vested in the President of the University who shall render full-time service. The President shall be appointed by the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of a duly constituted search committee and shall have a term of six (6) years without reappointment: *Provided*, That the incumbent President shall become the first President of the University upon effectivity of this Act; *Provided further*, That in cases where no appointment is made, the incumbent President shall continue to serve in a hold-over capacity, for a period of not more than ninety (90) days.

The President shall be assisted by an Executive Vice President and Vice Presidents for Academic Affairs, Administration, Research, Finance and Student Affairs, who shall be appointed by the Board upon the recommendation of the President, without prejudice to the appointment of additional vice presidents when so warranted.

In case of a vacancy by reason of death, resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the President to perform the functions of the office, the Board of Regents shall have the authority to designate an Officer-In-Charge pending the appointment of a new President. The successor thereto shall serve only for the unexpired portion of the term.

SEC. 8. Powers and Duties of the President. - The President of the University shall have the following specific powers and duties in addition to those normally pertaining to the Office of the President of the University:

(a) As the Chief Executive Officer of the University, to provide progressive and dynamic, ethical, and intellectual and administrative leadership in the University;

- (b) To serve as the head of the University faculties and of any branch thereof;
  - (c) To have general supervision over all academic, business and financial operations of the University;
- (d) To promulgate and enforce general policies affecting any unit of the University and take such actions which in one's judgment are necessary for the protection of property and general interest of the University, its' students and personnel and the operation of the University as a whole and shall inform the Board on all matters relating to the operation and welfare of the University;
- (e) To appoint qualified persons to fill all vacancies and new positions subject to the approval of the Board and make such other arrangements to meet emergencies occurring between meetings of the Board so that work in the University shall not suffer;
   (f) To institute disciplinary action against any University personnel faculty or non-faculty.
  - (f) To institute disciplinary action against any University personnel, faculty or non-faculty or any student of the University whose actions adversely affect the general interest of the University, subject to the approval of the Board of Regents;
    - (g) To decide appeals in any controversy between ranking officials of the University; the decision being final and conclusive subject to the approval of the Board of Regents;
  - (h) To grant or deny sabbatical leaves, leaves of absence without pay or extension of such leaves, extension of fellowships or any form of scholarships for a period not exceeding one (1) academic year, if the budget permits and for reasons the President may deem satisfactory;
    - (i) To make ad-interim appointments, subject to the approval of the Board of Regents;
      - (j) To grant or withhold permission to reveal confidential matters affecting the University or any unit thereof, any action taken by the Board of Regents;
      - (k) To grant permission for the use of buildings and premises of the University for academic, professional and scientific conventions, student and other related activities, and to fix the fee thereof;
      - To be authorized to join in the execution of all contracts, deeds, and instruments for the proper conduct of the business of the University;
  - (m) To prepare an annual report on the programs, projects, and accomplishments of the University for the previous year as well as the needs for the current year, including a budget covering the estimates of income and expenditures; and
- (n) To exercise such other powers as may be specifically authorized by the Board of
   Regents.
- SEC. 9. The Board of Regents. The governing body of the University shall be the Board of
  Regents of the Polytechnic University of the Philippines, hereinafter referred to as the "Board". It
  shall be chaired and co-chaired by the Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education
  (CHED) and the President of the University, respectively, and with the following as members:
  (a) Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Education, Arts, and Culture;

- (b) Chairperson of the House Committee on Higher and Technical Education;

1	(c)	Director-General of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA);
2	(d)	Director of the National Capital Region of the Department of Science and
3		Technology (DOST);
4	(e)	President of the Alumni Association who shall serve for a period of two (2) years;
5	(f)	One (1) Faculty Regent representing all teaching personnel, chosen in accordance
6		with the rules and qualifications set by the constituent university councils to serve
7		for a term of two (2) years;
8	(g)	One (1) Student Regent, elected by the students in accordance with the rules and
9		qualifications set out by said constituency, who shall serve for a period of one (1)
10		year;
11	(h)	One (1) Staff Regent representing all non-teaching personnel, elected in accordance
12		with the rules and regulations set out by said constituency, who shall serve for a
13		period of two (2) years; and
14	(i)	Two (2) other Regents who are prominent citizens representing the private sector
15		who shall serve for a period of two (2) years and who shall be appointed by the
16		Board as recommended by the search committee organized for the purpose.
17		
18	In case of vacancy in the Board, except for the President of the University, such vacancy	
19	shall be miled in the same manner as provided for the predecessor, and such appointed shall hald	
20	office only for the unexpired portion of the term. In the case of Regents representing a particular	
21	sector, men membership shall cease upon suspension separation or recall No person however	
22	who has succeeded and served for more than three (3) years of the unexpired portion of the term	
23	shall be eligible for appointment as Regent.

25	SEC. 10. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents In addition to its general powers of	
26	administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the Board of Directors of a corporation	
27	under Section 50 of Batas Pambansa Blg. 68 or the Corporation Code of the Philippines the Board	
28	shall have the	following specific powers and duties:

30	(a) Pr	omulgate and implement policies in accordance with the declared state policies and
31	the provisions of the Philippine Constitution on education agriculture science and	
32	tec	chology, as well as the policies, standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic

1	(e) Establish professorial chairs in the university and provide fellowships for qualified
2	faculty members and scholarships to deserving students;
3	(f) Receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided for the support of the
4	University in the manner it may determine, in its discretion, in order to carry out the
5	purposes and functions of the University;
6	(g) Set policies on admission and graduation of students;
7	(h) Award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of outstanding contribution in
8	the field of education, public service, arts, science and technology or in any field of
9	specialization within the academic competence of the university and to authorize the
10	award of certificates of completion of non-degree and non-traditional courses;
11	(i) Establish research and extension centers of the SUC where such will promote the
12	development of the latter;
13	(j) Develop academic arrangements for institution capability building with appropriate
14	institutions and agencies, public or private, local or foreign, and to appoint
15	experts/specialists as consultants, or visiting or exchange professors, scholars,
16	researchers, as the case may be;
17	(k) Set up the adoption of modern and innovative modes of transmitting knowledge such
18	as the use of information technology, the dual system, open learning, community
19	laboratory, for the promotion of greater access to higher education that shall possess
20	international character and shall have international linkages and adopt internationally
21	recognized curricula;
22	(I) Collaborate with other governing boards of SUCs, in restructuring said colleges and
23	universities to make them more efficient, relevant, productive, and competitive, in
24	coordination with the CHED and the Department of Budget and Management
25	(DBM);
26	(m)Absorb non-chartered tertiary institutions within their respective provinces in
27	coordination with the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and to offer therein
28	needed programs or courses, to promote and carry out equal access to educational
29	opportunities as mandated by the Constitution;
30	(n) Create, organize, reorganize, merge or abolish colleges, institutes, and other
31	academic and administrative units of the University;
32	(o) Authorize an external management audit of the University and to institute reforms,
33	including academic and structural changes, on the basis of the audit results and
34	recommendations;
35	(p) Develop consortia and other forms of linkages with local government units,
36	institutions and agencies, both public and private, local and foreign, in furtherance of
37	the purposes and objectives of the institution;
38	(q) Enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the profitable development
39	and management of the economic assets of the college or institution, the proceeds
40	from which to be used for the development and strengthening of the University;
41	(r) Import economic, technical and cultural books and publications;

- (s) Receive, in trust, legacies, gifts and donations of real and personal properties of all kinds, to administer and dispose the same when necessary for the benefit of the 1 University, subject to limitations, directions and instructions of the donors, if any; 2 (t) Delegate any of its powers and duties provided for hereinabove to the President and 3 other officials of the university as it may deem appropriate so as to expedite the 4 5 administration of the affairs of the university; (u) Establish policy guidelines and procedures for participative decision-making and 6 7 transparency within the institution; (v) Authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machineries, equipment and 8 other facilities and the purchase and acquisition of real and personal properties 9 10 including necessary supplies, materials and equipment; (w)Privatize, where most advantageous to the institution, the management of non-11 academic services such as health, food, building or grounds or property maintenance 12 13 and other similar services; and 14 (x) Enact rules and regulations not contrary to law as may be necessary to carry out the 15 purposes and functions of the university. 16 17 SEC. 11. Quorum and Service of Processes. - A quorum of the Board shall consist of a 18 majority of all members. All processes against the Board shall be served on the President or 19 Secretary thereof of the Board. 20 21 SEC. 12. Meetings. - Regular meetings of the Board shall be held every third (3rd) Tuesday of 22 the month. Special meetings of the Board may be called upon by the Chairperson or upon the 23 24 25
- request by the four (4) members of the Board. In both cases, all notices of such meetings shall be issued at least three (3) calendar days prior to the meeting. The members shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in their 26 attendance to the meetings of the Board or in connection with their official business authorities 27
- by resolution of the Board subject to the existing laws and regulations. 28
- 29
- In the absence of the CHED Chairperson, a Commissioner of the CHED, duly designated 30 by the CHED Chairperson as representative, in the meeting, shall have all the rights and 31 responsibilities of a regular member: Provided, however, That during this meeting, the President 32 of the University, as Vice-Chairperson, shall be the Presiding Officer: Provided further, That this 33 proviso, notwithstanding, the Chairperson of the CHED is hereby authorized to designate a 34 CHED Commissioner as the regular Chairperson of the Board, in which case the said CHED 35 Commissioner shall act as the Presiding Officer. 36

37

In case the Chairpersons of the Senate Committee on Education, Arts and Culture and the 38 House Committee on Higher and Technical Education will not be able to attend the board 39 meeting, they may designate their respective representatives to attend the meeting. These 40 representatives shall have the same rights and responsibilities as the regular members of the 41 42 Board.

43

SEC. 13. University Officials. - The administration of the University shall be vested in the 44 University President who shall be assisted by the Executive Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents, 45 the Secretary of the University, and such other academic and administrative officials whose 46

positions and functions are deemed necessary to assist in the effective and efficient administration
 of the University, as may be determined by the Board.

SEC. 14. Heads of University Campuses. - The Campus Directors shall serve as heads or administrators of the University campuses and shall render full-time service.

They shall be appointed/designated by the Board upon the recommendation of the Search
 Committee and the President, subject to the guidelines, qualifications and standards set by the
 Board: *Provided*, That the incumbent Campus Directors of the existing campuses shall serve as
 Campus Directors of their respective campuses upon the effectivity of this Act.

SEC. 15. The Faculty. - The teaching staff of each college shall constitute its faculty. The College Faculty shall be headed by a Dean who shall be chosen by the President from a shortlist of three (3) nominees submitted by a special search committee established for the purpose. If a Dean fails to complete the term, the President shall appoint an Acting Dean while a search process is in progress. In no case shall the search and election of the next Dean be longer than sixty (60) calendar days from the date of the vacancy.

19 SEC. 16. Academic Freedom. - The University, as the National Polytechnic University, shall 20 have the right and responsibility to exercise academic freedom.

SEC. 17. Internationalization. - The University shall be a polytechnic university of international character and shall have international linkages. It shall also adopt internationally recognized curricula.

## 26 SEC. 18. Land Grants and Other Real Properties of the University. -

27

(a) The State shall support the University in the form of lump sum amount, through the
annual General Appropriations Act (GAA) and other financial benefits, and in kind, through land
grants and donations and use of other real properties. To carry out the intent of these grants, income
derived from the development of all land grants and real properties shall be used to further the end
of the National Polytechnic University, as may be decided by the Board;

(b) Such parcels of land ceded by law, decree or presidential issuance to the Polytechnic 33 University of the Philippines are hereby declared to be reserved for the purposes intended. The 34 absolute ownership of the National Polytechnic University over these landholdings, including 35 those covered by original and transfer certificates of title in the name of the Polytechnic University 36 of the Philippines and their future derivatives, is hereby confirmed. Where the issuance of proper 37 certificates of title is yet pending for these landholdings, the appropriate government office shall 38 expedite the issuance thereof within six (6) months from the date of effectivity of this 39 Act: Provided, that all registration requirements necessary for the issuance of the said titles have 40 been submitted and complied with; 41

(c) The Board may plan, design, approve and cause the implementation of land leases: *Provided*, that such mechanisms and arrangements shall sustain and protect the environment in accordance with law, and be exclusive of the academic core zone of the campuses of the University: *Provided further*, That such mechanisms and arrangements shall not be in conflict with the academic mission of the National Polytechnic University; 1 (d) The Board may allow the use of the income coming from real properties of the 2 National Polytechnic University as security for transactions to generate additional revenues when 3 needed for educational purposes;

(e) The Board may approve the implementation of joint ventures: *Provided*, That in the event real properties of the University are involved, only its income derived from the use of the real properties shall be the subject of its participation or obligation in the joint ventures: *Provided further*, That no joint venture shall result in the alienation of the real properties of the national polytechnic university; and

(f) Any plan to generate revenues and other sources from land grants and other real 9 properties entrusted to the National Polytechnic University shall be consistent with its academic 10 mission and orientation and shall protect it from undue influence and control of commercial 11 interests: Provided, That such programs, projects or mechanisms shall be approved by the Board 12 subject to a transparent and democratic process of consultation with the constituents of the 13 National Polytechnic University: Provided further, That funds generated from such programs, 14 projects or mechanisms shall not be meant to replace, in part or in whole, the annual appropriations 15 it is receiving as provided by the national government. 16 17

SEC. 19. Safeguards on Assets Disposition. - The preservation of the value of the assets of the
 University shall be of primordial consideration.

The sale of any existing real property of the University shall be prohibited: *Provided*, That the Board may alienate real property donated after the effectivity of this Act if the terms of the donation specifically allow it.

Notwithstanding the provision of this Act or any other law to the contrary, the lease of more than five (5) years of the assets of the University and any transaction referred to in Section 18 of this Act shall be subject to the following conditions and procedures:

(a) The transactions shall be discussed with the members of the Board in any of its
 formally convened regular or special meeting at least one (1) month before a decision shall be
 made;

(b) The transactions shall be based on a multi-year comprehensive development plan,
 crafted and developed by qualified urban planning professionals having at least five (5) years
 experience, with prior consultation with and concurrence of third-party experts and duly approved
 by a majority vote of all the members of the Board;

(c) The transactions shall be subject to competitive and public bidding, as provided under
 R.A. No. 9184, otherwise known as the "Government Procurement Reform Act"; and
 (d) If the contract or transaction involves on emerged of the contract or transaction.

(d) If the contract or transaction involves an amount more than Fifty million pesos
 (P50,000,000.00), it shall be approved by three-fourths (3/4) of all the members of the
 Board: *Provided*, That the splitting of contracts, which is by breaking up a contract into smaller
 quantities or amounts or dividing contract implementation into artificial or arbitrary phases or
 subcontracts for the purpose of circumventing this provision, shall not be allowed.

44 SEC. 20. Tax Exemptions. - The provisions of any general or special law to the contrary 45 notwithstanding:

1 All revenues and assets of the University used for educational purposes, or in (a) support thereof, shall be exempt from all taxes and duties; 2

3 Gifts and donations of real and personal properties of all kinds shall be exempt from (b) the donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income of 4 the donor, in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997, as 5 6 amended:

7 Importation of economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical, historical, (c) legal and cultural books, supplies and materials duly certified by the Board, including scientific 8 and educational computer and software equipment, shall be exempt from customs duties; and 9 (e)

All academic awards shall be exempt from income taxes.

SEC. 21. Development Plan and Organizational Structure. - Within a period of one hundred 12 twenty (120) days after the approval of this Act, the University shall accomplish the following: 13 14

- (a) Submit a five (5)- year development plan, including its corresponding program budget to the CHED, for corresponding recommendation to the DBM;
- (b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with the CHED; and
- (c) Set up its new organizational, administrative as well as academic structure, including the appointment of the key officials of the University.

SEC. 22. Filing of Report Period. - On or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the second (2nd) month 21 after the opening of the regular classes each year, the Board shall file with the Office of the 22 President of the Philippines through the Chairperson of the CHED, based on the recommendation 23 of a panel of experts, that the institution has complied with the requirements for a national 24 polytechnic university status. The CHED shall regularly provide technical assistance to the 25 institution and monitor compliance with the requirements of the Commission. 26

27

The CHED shall designate a panel of experts who shall prepare, provide, and define the 28 specific indicators and levels of accomplishments based on the acceptable international practices 29 to be used as benchmarks in declaring the PUP as the National Polytechnic University. This 30 benchmarks prepared by the panel of experts shall be recommended to the Commission en Banc. 31 32

The institution shall retain its status prior to the effectivity of this Act, unless it is available 33 34 to comply with the requirements provided herein. 35

SEC. 23. Rules of Construction. - No statutory or other issuances shall diminish the powers, 36 rights, privileges and benefits accorded to the University under this Act or enjoyed at present, by 37 it under other issuances not otherwise modified or repealed under this Act, unless subsequent 38 legislation expressly provides for their repeal, amendment or modification. Any case of doubt in 39 the interpretation of any of the provisions of this Charter shall be resolved in favor of the academic 40 freedom and fiscal autonomy of the University. 41

42

SEC. 24. Appropriations. - The amount necessary to carry out the initial implementation of this 43 Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the PUP. Thereafter, such sums 44

as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual
 GAA.
 3

SEC. 25. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Board shall, in consultation with the CHED, formulate the rules and regulations to fully implement the provisions of this Act.

8 SEC. 26. Separability Clause. - Should any provision herein be declared unconstitutional, the
 9 same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.

10

SEC. 27. Repealing Clause. - Presidential Decree No. 1341, R.A. No. 8292, and all laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations, and other issuances or parts thereof that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 28. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official
 Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
