AN ACT REQUIRING A BASIC FIRST AID TRAINING FOR PERSONNEL OF TOURISM ENTERPRISES. TOURISM-ORIENTED NONGOVERNMENT ORGANIZATIONS PEOPLE'S ORGANIZATIONS. AND INDIVIDUAL PROVIDERS OF TOURISM-RELATED SERVICES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The State recognizes tourism as an indispensable element of the national economy and an industry of national interest and importance. Towards this end, the State shall develop the necessary human resources that shall advance sustainable tourism and the safety of tourists in the country. The State shall ensure that personnel providing tourism services be equipped with the necessary skills and training to achieve these objectives.

SEC. 2. Personnel of tourism enterprises and tourism-oriented nongovernment organizations (NGOs) and people's organizations (POs), as well as individual providers of tourism-related services are required to undergo basic first aid training provided by the Philippine Red Cross (PRC) or other reputable institutions offering such training. The PRC and such other training institutions shall issue the appropriate training certification for this purpose.

As a requirement for the renewal of their business permits, all tourism enterprises shall submit to the concerned local government units (LGUs) a sworn statement attesting that their personnel have undergone such training, attaching the copies of the individual training certificates thereto.

The concerned LGUs shall facilitate the registration of personnel of tourism-oriented NGOs and POs, and individual providers of tourism-related services under their jurisdiction as trainees of basic first aid training seminar and coordinate with the PRC or other reputable institutions for the provision of such training.

- SEC. 3. The concerned LGUs shall ensure that tourism enterprises and tourism-oriented NGOs and POs are equipped with first aid kits. A periodic inspection for this purpose shall be conducted by the concerned LGUs.
- SEC. 4. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this
  Act, the Department of Tourism, in coordination with concerned
  agencies of the government, shall promulgate the necessary rules
  and regulations for the proper implementation of this Act.

SEC. 5. If any provision of this Act is declared 1 unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provision not 2 3 affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect 4 SEC. 6. All other laws, executive orders, presidential decrees, proclamations, rules, regulations, issuances, 5 6 enactments or parts thereof inconsistent with this 7 Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. SEC. 7. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after 8 its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of 9 general circulation. 10
