AN ACT ESTABLISHING A MATERNAL AND INFANT HEALTH HOME VISITATION PROGRAM

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as
 the "Expanded Maternal and Infant Care Act".
- 3 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is a policy of the State to 4 equally protect the life of the mother and the life of the unborn from 5 conception. In line with this policy, the State shall, in addition to 6 maternity care services provided in health facilities, administer 7 prenatal and postnatal maternity and infant care services under a 8 home visitation program in order to protect the health and well-being 9 of mothers and infants.

SEC. 3. Definition of Term. - As used in this Act. the term 1 "poor" shall refer to income brackets that fall below the poverty 2 threshold defined by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) based 3 on the most recent Family Income and Expenditure Survey (FIES). 4

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SEC. 4. Establishment of Maternal and Infant Health Home Visitation Program. - The Secretary of the Department of Health 6 (DOH) shall require health centers to designate an appropriate 7 health professional or a qualified nonprofessional acting under the 8 supervision of a health care professional who shall render maternal 9 and infant care services in the home of eligible individuals. 10

SEC. 5. Eligibility to Avail of Home Visitation Services. -11 A pregnant woman not more than twenty-one (21) years old, or 12 families with an infant up to the age of one (1) year, belonging to the 13 low-income brackets below the poverty threshold shall be eligible to 14 receive the maternal and infant care services provided under this Act. 15

SEC. 6. Maternal and Infant Health Services. - The 16 maternal and infant care services that shall be provided in the 17 home of eligible individuals shall include the following: 18

(a) Instruction and counseling concerning all aspects of 19 prenatal care, childbirth, and motherhood; 20

(b) Nutrition counseling; 21

(c) General family counseling, including child and family 22 23 development; and

(d) Physical examination or referral for further medical care 24 for a mother and/or infant. 25

SEC. 7. Prohibition on Abortion. - Any maternal and infant 26 care service which shall be made available under this Act shall not 27 be construed to advocate, promote, or encourage abortion. 28

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1 SEC. 8. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof 2 is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the 3 provision or part not otherwise affected shall remain valid and 4 subsisting.

5. SEC. 9. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or 6 issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, 7 rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of 8 this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

9 SEC. 10. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) 10 days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of 11 general circulation.
