AN ACT DECLARING THE SANTA LUCIA WATERSHED LOCATED IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF SALCEDO, PROVINCE OF ILOCOS SUR AS A PROTECTED AREA

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Salcedo Protected Area Act of 2005".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to regulate the utilization of wildlife resources and other natural resources; the culture and indigenous knowledge as well as the historical and aesthetic values of its communities; and to ensure the continuity of ecological processes and life-support systems, including natural biological and physical diversities thereof for the benefit of its people of the present and future generations. For this purpose, the State hereby declares as a protected area (PA), under the category of protected landscape as defined herein, the Santa Lucia Watershed located in the town of Salcedo, Province of Ilocos Sur, whose thick molave forests and indigenous species of trees serve as life-support

system to migratory and endemic species of birds, amphibians, reptiles and mammals, some of which are listed under the endangered category.

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SEC. 3 Scope. – The boundaries of the Salcedo Protected Landscape are as follows:

Beginning at T.L. corner 1 on the map being 76° 32" E, about 3,470 m. from BLLM No. 1, Municipality of Salcedo, Ilocos Sur;

Any modification on this Act due to factors such as changing ecological situations, new scientific or archaeological findings, or discovery of traditional boundaries not previously taken into account shall be made through an act of Congress after full consultation with the affected public.

Private lands inside the PA shall be governed as part of the PA subject to rules and regulations relating thereto. Penal provisions, however, in this Act or in rules, and regulations issued by the Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) shall not apply to private lands unless specifically stated.

- SEC. 4. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Act, the following terms shall be defined as follows:
- (a) "Protected Area Management Board (PAMB)" refers to the site-based decision-making body responsible in the planning, resource protection and general administration of the area in accordance with the approved management plan.
- (b) "General Management Plan" refers to the basic framework plan in the management of the PA and in the preparation of the annual operations plan and budget.
- 27 (c) "General Management Planning Strategy (GMPS)" refers to the 28 guide in the formulation of site management plans including buffer zones.

(d) "Tenured migrants" refers to any person or persons who actually and continuously occupied an area for five years prior to the designation of the same as PA in accordance with Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the National Integrated Protected Areas System Act of 1992 or the NIPAS Act, and is solely dependent therein for subsistence.

- (e) "Protected Area Superintendent (PASu)" refers to the chief operating Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) officer at the PA.
- (f) "Protected landscapes" refers to areas of national significance characterized by the harmonious interaction of man and land while providing opportunities for public enjoyment through recreation and tourism within the normal lifestyle and economic activity of these areas.
- (g) "Forest lands" refers to all lands within the Salcedo Protected Landscape which are public lands and have not been classified as alienable or disposable.
- SEC. 5. Administration and Management. The DENR shall be the lead agency in the administration and management of the PA and shall also promote the permanent preservation of the area, to the greatest extent possible, of their natural conditions.
- SEC. 6. Control and Supervision. Direct supervision in the implementation of the provisions of this Act shall be made through the PAMB.

The PASu shall prepare the management plan in consultation with the appropriate offices of the DENR and local experts who may donate their services including, but not limited to, people's organizations (POs), nongovernment organizations (NGOs), local government units (LGUs) and other government agencies. The management plan shall be reviewed, approved and adopted by the PAMB and certified by the Secretary of the DENR. Such certification is mandatory and shall state that the plan conforms

to all laws, rules and regulations of national application issued by the DENR.

In no case shall the DENR revise or modify a management plan without prior consultation with the PAMB.

The PASu, in coordination with all concerned officials, shall prepare all successor plans. One year before the expiration of the period of applicability of the plan in effect, the PASu shall cause the publication of notices for comments and suggestions on the next successor plan in a newspaper of local circulation and the posting of such notices in the provincial, municipal and barangay halls and in three other areas frequented by the public. Public hearings may be conducted on the successor plan upon the written request of any interested party. A finalized plan shall be made available for public perusal at the office of the PASu upon its approval by the PAMB.

Within one year from the effectivity of this Act, a management plan shall have been put into effect following the GMPS provided under the NIPAS Act and according to the procedure herein set forth.

- SEC. 7. Institutional Mechanism. The following administrative and policy-making mechanisms shall apply:
 - (A) The Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) There shall be a PAMB which shall serve as the policy-making body of the PA. The Board shall be composed of:
- (1) The Regional Executive Director (RED), Region 1 of the DENR as the chairman;
 - (2) The provincial planning and development officer of Ilocos Sur;
- 24 (3) One representative from the municipal government of Salcedo, to be appointed by the sangguniang bayan;
- 26 (4) One representative from the barangay who has jurisdiction over.

1	(5) At least three representatives from NGOs and community
2	organizations (COs), including PO, church or civic organizations based in or
3	near the PA, whose representatives shall be chosen by among themselves; and
4	(6) One representative from other national government agencies

6	The PAMB shall exercise the following powers and functions:
7	(i) Decide matters relating to planning, resource protection and general
8	administration of the area in accordance with the GMPS;
9	(ii) Approve proposals, work plans, action plans, guidelines for the
10	management of the PA in accordance with the approved management plan;
11	(iii) Promulgate rules and regulations to promote development programs
12	and projects on biodiversity conservation and sustainable development as well
13	as developmental activities and such other related activities within the PA
. 14	consistent with the approved management plan;
15	(iv) Ensure the implementation of programs as prescribed in the
16	management plan in order to provide employment to the people dwelling in
17	and around the PA;
18	(v) Monitor and evaluate the performance of PA personnel, NGOs and
19	the communities in providing for biodiversity conservation and sociocultural
20	economic development and report their assessment to the NIPAS Policy and
21	Program Steering (NPPS) Committee and the Integrated Protected Area Fund
22	(IPAF) Governing Board; and
23	(vi) Approve proposals for funding, budget allocations and exercise
24	responsibility over all funds that may accrue to the PA, donated for the purpose
25	of the above policy declaration.
26	The DENR, through the RED, shall exercise the authority to oversee the

PAMB to ensure that the latter acts within the scope of its powers and

functions. In case of a conflict between administrative orders issued by the

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- DENR and the rules and regulations issued by the PAMB, the latter shall notify the DENR Secretary who shall decide whether to apply the rule or withdraw it for purposes of the Salcedo Protected Landscape. The decision of the Secretary shall be guided by a preference to local initiative and specific policies enacted by the PAMB. The decision of the Secretary shall be appealable to the regional trial court that has jurisdiction over the PA.
 - (B) Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office There is hereby established a PASu's office in charge of the management, protection and administration of the PA. The PASu shall be supported by the existing personnel of the DENR. The head of office shall be the chief operating officer of the Salcedo Protected Landscape or the PA and shall be accountable to the RED of the DENR-I and the PAMB. The PASu shall have the following powers and functions:

Administrative -

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- (1) Serve as chief administrative officer of the PA for the purpose of implementing the management plan as detailed in the annual work program;
- (2) Establish a productive partnership with the local community, including groups, in the planning, protection and management of the PA;
 - (3) Ensure the performance and good morale of his staff;
- (4) Ensure the proper utilization of annual budget allocations and the proper disposition of fees and other funds generated within the PA;
- (5) Develop and implement a natural history documentation program and to oversee research that may be conducted within the area;
- (6) Develop and implement a park information, education and visitor program;
- (7) Integrate the roles of NGOs and the DENR staff in the operation of
 the area; and

1	(8) Document the processes involved in the establishment and
2	management of the PA, with particular reference to the development of
3	relationships with cultural communities, tenured migrants, buffer zone
4	residents and others in establishing effective protection of the area.
5	Regulatory –
6	(1) Act as peace officer for the purpose of maintaining peace and order
7	within the PA;
8	(2) Enforce the rules and regulations established to protect the area and
9	preserve it from trespass, damage, injury and illegal occupancy;
10	(3) Require permits, when necessary, from any person entering or
11	passing across, through, or any part of the PA;
12	(4) Summarily remove or eject from the area persons who have
13	rendered disorderly conduct or who have violated any of the regulations of the
14	PA;
15	(5) Require persons who are cutting or gathering forest products, or
16-	hunting or fishing within the PA to produce, upon demand, any authority or
17	permit to do so; and
18	(6) Seize and confiscate timber and other forest products, game birds,
19	animals and fish, including instruments, tools and conveyances used inside the
20	PA by unauthorized persons.
21	The PASu may, as necessary, delegate authority to his staff.
22	SEC. 8. Prohibited Acts and Penalties. —
23	(A) The penalties in Articles 309, on theft and 310, on qualified theft,
24	of the Revised Penal Code, depending on the value of the resource taken,
25	damaged or destroyed, shall be imposed upon any person who:

(1) Hunts, destroys, disturbs or removes any wild plants or animal

products derived therefrom without a permit from the PAMB;

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- (2) Conducts mineral exploitations or extractions within the forest 1 lands as defined herein; and 2 (3) Cut, remove, gather or take timber or other forest products from the 3 forest lands without authorization. 4 Valuation of the damage shall take into account biodiversity and 5 conservation considerations as well as aesthetic and scenic values. 6 (B) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) but not 7 more than Two hundred fifty thousand pesos (P250,000.00) and/or 8 9 imprisonment of not less than one year nor more than five years, and the cost of restoration and rehabilitation of the damage shall be imposed upon any 10 person who: 11 (1) Alters topography through digging, blasting, earth-filling activities 12 or stonewalling without a permit from all proper authorities as required under 13 existing laws, rules and regulations, and from the PAMB; 14 15 (2) Damages roads or trails or leaves them in a damaged condition or mutilates, defaces, destroys or vandalizes any object of natural beauty or scenic 16 17 value within the PA; 18 (3) Constructs or maintains any kind of structure without a permit from 19 the PAMB or without other requisite permits under existing laws such as, but 20 limited to, municipal permits, public works requirements and 21 Environmental Compliance Certificates (ECC); and 22 (4) Alters, removes, destroys or defaces boundary marks/monuments or signs in the PA. 23 24 (C) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more 25 than One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) and/or imprisonment from
 - (1) Occupies lands classified as forest lands as herein defined without a legal instrument for such occupation;

one year to three years shall be imposed upon any person who:

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(2) Violates any rules and regulations in the management plan of the PAMB or agreements reached before the PAMB in its exercise of adjudicative functions;

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- (3) Dumps any waste materials on land other than in areas identified as dumping sites by the concerned local governments, or leaves exposed or in unsanitary condition on land human wastes or refuse; and
- (4) Possesses a chainsaw without clearance from the PAMB which shall specify the legal uses for which it can be applied.
- (D) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more than Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) and/or imprisonment of not less than one year and not more than five years, or both, shall be imposed upon:
- (1) Any person who shall induce another or conspire to commit any of the above acts or suffer their workers to commit any of the above acts; and
- (2) Any public officer or officer of the law, who, in dereliction of the duties of his office, shall maliciously refrain from instituting prosecution for the punishment of violators of the law or shall tolerate commission of the offense. Conviction for this offense shall also carry the penalty of perpetual disqualification from public office.
- SEC. 9. Special Prosecutor. Within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Justice shall appoint a special prosecutor to whom all cases of violations of laws, rules and regulations in the PA shall be assigned. Such special prosecutor shall coordinate with the PAMB and the PASu in the performance of his/her duties and assist in the training of wardens and rangers in arrest and criminal prosecution procedures.
- SEC. 10. The Salcedo Protected Area Fund. There is hereby established a trust fund to be known as the Salcedo Protected Area Fund for purposes of financing projects of the system. All income generated from the

operation of the system or management of wild flora and fauna in the PA shall accrue to the fund. These income shall be derived from visitors/tourist fees, fees from permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the PAs, proceeds from registration and lease of multiple-use areas, including tourism concessions, contributions from industries and facilities directly benefiting from the PA; and such other fees and income derived from the operation of the PA.

The fund may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various sources, domestic or foreign, for purposes related to their functions: *Provided*, That the fund shall be deposited as a special account in the National Treasury and disbursements therefrom shall be made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the system, and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with the existing accounting and budgeting rules and regulations: *Provided*, *further*, That the fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits, property tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities. Furthermore, LGUs may charge add-ons to fees imposed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That such add-ons shall be determined based on the contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance and protection of the PA.

SEC. 11. Utilization of Energy and Non-renewable Resources. – Any exploitation and utilization of energy and other non-renewable resources within the PA shall be allowed only through PAMB approval. In no case shall an exemption from the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) System be made for energy and non-renewable resources exploitation projects within the PA.

SEC. 12. Appropriations. — The Secretary of the DENR shall immediately include in the Department's program the implementation of this

- 1 Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General 2 Appropriations Act.
 - SEC. 13. Repealing Clause. Within the scope of the PA as herein specified, the prohibitions and the penalties under the NIPAS Act are hereby superseded. All other laws and rules and regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
 - SEC. 14. Separability Clause. If any part or section of this Act is declared by the court as unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the other parts or sections hereof.
 - SEC. 15. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a national newspaper of general circulation readily available in the PA. It shall be translated in Filipino and Ilocano and shall likewise be posted in the appropriate language in a conspicuous place in the municipal and barangay halls within the area as well as in three other places frequented by the public.
