AN ACT SEPARATING THE TANAUAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL – TANAUAN SCHOOL OF CRAFTSMANSHIP AND HOME INDUSTRIES IN BARANGAY CANRAMOS, MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE FROM THE TANAUAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, CONVERTING IT INTO AN INDEPENDENT NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TO BE KNOWN AS THE TANAUAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. *Separation and Conversion into a National High School.* –
2 The Tanauan National High School – Tanauan School of Craftsmanship and
3 Home Industries in Barangay Canramos, Municipality of Tanauan, Province of
4 Leyte is hereby separated from the Tanauan National High School and
5 converted into an independent national high school to be known as the
6 Tanauan National High School of Science and Technology.

1 SEC. 2. *Transfer of Assets and Liabilities.* – All personnel, assets,
2 liabilities and records of the Tanauan National High School – Tanauan School
3 of Craftsmanship and Home Industries are hereby transferred to and absorbed
4 by the Tanauan National High School of Science and Technology.

5 SEC. 3. *Appropriations.* – The Secretary of Education shall
6 immediately include in the Department's program the operationalization of the
7 Tanauan National High School of Science and Technology, the initial funding
8 of which shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the
9 Tanauan National High School – Tanauan School of Craftsmanship and Home
10 Industries. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the continued operation of the
11 school shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

12 SEC. 4. *Implementation.* – The Secretary of Education shall issue such
13 rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.

14 SEC. 5. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
15 its publication in the *Official Gazette*.
