AN ACT MOVING THE OBSERVANCE OF RIZAL DAY FROM
DECEMBER 30 TO JUNE 19, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE
SECTION 26, CHAPTER 7, BOOK I OF EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.
292, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE
ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF 1987

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in
Congress assembled:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 26, Chapter 7, Book I of Executive Order No. 292,
2 as amended, otherwise known as the Administrative Code of 1987, is hereby
3 further amended to read as follows:

4 “SEC. 26. *Regular Holidays and Nationwide Special*
5 *Days.* – (1) Unless otherwise modified by law, order or
6 proclamation, the following regular holidays and special days
7 shall be observed in the country:

8 “a) Regular Holidays

9 New Year’s Day - January 1

10 Maundy Thursday - Movable Date

19 “c) In the event the holiday falls on a Wednesday, the holiday
 20 will be observed on the Monday of that week. If the holiday falls
 21 on a Sunday, the holiday will be observed on the Monday that
 22 follows:
