Barangay captain shot dead in Comval town

A barangay captain was shot dead by unidentified armed men while on his way to attend a political meeting in Monkayo, Compostela Valley last Wednesday, reports reaching Camp Crame in Quezon City stated. Reports reaching the Philippine National Police (PNP) national headquarters in Quezon City identified the victim as Serio Apat. chairman of Barangay New Kapatagan, Monkayo. Police authorities said the victim sufferent parts of the body and died on the spot. The reports stated the victim was riding a motorcycle on his way to a political meeting at the barangay hall in Casoon when he was shot by armed men on the national highway in Monkayo. Investigation showed that Apat was a staunch supporter of Monkayo Mayor Manuel Brillantes. This caused suspicion that the killing was "election-related." 2 couples face off in Cotabato, Kabunsan

COTABATO CITY - Residents here COTABATO CITY - Residents here are expecting an exciting race between two couples for the mayorship here and for the lone congressional seat of this city and the new province of Shariff Kabunsuan.

"The couple versus couple fight is drawing attention from the voters and media people," a reporter of a weekly tabloid here said.

The couples are City Mayor Muslimin Sema and his wife, Bai Sandra, and incumbent Rep. Bai Zeny Dilangalen and her husband, the former three-term congressman of Maguindanao's first district (now Shariff Kabunsuan). Mayor Sema, who is seeking reelec-

tion, is being challenged by former Congressman Dilangalen. Sema's wife, Bai Sandra, is aspiring for the congressional seat. Dilangalen's wife, Zeny, is seeking reelection for the same congressional seat.

The Semas belong to the administration party coalition chaired by President Arroyo, while the Dilangalens are allied with the Partido ng Masang Pilipino of former President Joseph Estrada.

Bai Sandra, a former UN commissioner on education and education secretary of the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, lost to Bai Zeny, the incumbent lady solon, in the 2004 polls. But Bai Sandra is confident she

will make it this time with her enlarged mass base and the support of the administration.

Former congressman Dilangalen recalled that he and her wife won in the last four elections, saying they would make it for the fifth time because of their congressional projects.

In the city mayoralty race, Mayor Sema and Dilangalen are joined by Estrellita Juliano-Tamano, a businesswoman who had filed an election protest against Sema in connection with the last nayoralty election here.

Christian voters in this city consider Juliano-Tamano as the "candidate to reckon with." (Ali Macabalang)

Log smugglers active during long vacation

BUTUAN CITY — Forest officers of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) in Northeastern Mindanao have tightened their watch on forest products being transported in this city.

"Our close monitoring of the activities of timber poachers and illegal log and lumber traders will continue without letup even after the observance of the Holy Week." DENR Caraga Regional Executive Director (RED) Benjamin T. Tumaliuan said.

RED Tumaliuan issued a memorandum to his regional and provincial field forest officers, particularly to the four Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and 13 Community Environment Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and 14 Community Environment Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and 14 Community Environment Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and 14 Community Environment Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and

Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Officers (PENRO) and 13 Community Environment Natural Resources Officers (CENROs), directing them to keep a tight watch on forest products that are being moved during and after the Holy Week.

He specifically ordered PENRO Rosendo Asunto of Agusan del Norte and Butuan City CENR officer Achilles Ebron of Nasipit International Port in Nasipit, Agusan del Norte whose operation covers the eastern section of the province, and Cabadbaran CENR Officer Raul Rosales whose jurisdiction covers the western part of the province, to keep close monitoring of forest products passing through their respective jurisdictions.

RED Tumaliuan said log smugglers and poachers are usually active during long vacation such as the Holy Week break, noting that they transport illegally sourced forest products at night.

Meanwhile, PENRO Asunto and CENR Officers Ebron and Rosales said their teams of forest guards and officers have been placed on red alert since last Palm Sunday.

With the alert order, they said the personnel can still spend their time with their families. However, the DENR has to maintain a force to man the forest-monitoring checkpoints on highways as well as the Agusan River, they also said.

AN ACT TO STRENGTHEN THE OFFICE OF THE SOLICITOR GENERAL, BY EXPANDING AND STREAMLINING ITS BUREAUCRACY, UPGRADING EMPLOYEE SKILLS AND AUGMENTING BENEFITS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SEC. 4. Compensation. - The basic monthly compensation of the Solicitor General, Assistant Solicitors General, State Solicitors and

Subject to the availability of funds, the salaries and privileges of personne of the Office of the Solicitor General granted under this Act may be furthe increased to match any corresponding increase in salaries and privileges late granted to their respective counterparts in the Court of Appeals.

SEC. 6. Seminar and Other Professional Fees. – Subject to the availability funds, fees for relevant seminars, as well as professional membership fees lawyers, registration fees, and related miscellaneous expenses incurred completing the mandatory continuing legal education (MCLE) course shall borne by the office. SEC. 16. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is lared invalid or unconstitutional, the provisions not affected thereby ill continue to be in full force and effect.

SEC. 17. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15) days in its publication in two national newspapers of general circulation.
