- AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (TESDA) TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTER IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF NAVAL, PROVINCE OF BILIRAN, TO BE KNOWN AS THE NAVAL, BILIRAN TESDA TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTER, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the

2 "Naval, Biliran TESDA Training and Assessment Center Act".

SEC. 2. Establishment. - There is hereby established a 3 Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) 4 5 Training and Assessment Center in the Municipality of Naval, 6 Province of Biliran, under the supervision of the TESDA, to be 7 known as the Naval, Biliran TESDA Training and Assessment 8 Center: It shall be established in a highly accessible location in the 9 Municipality of Naval, Province of Biliran, pursuant to the purposes of this Act and to the mutual agreement between the TESDA and 10 the concerned local government units (LGUs). 11

SEC. 3. General Mandate. – The Naval, Biliran TESDA
 Training and Assessment Center, hereinafter referred to as the
 Center, shall primarily provide technical-vocational education and

training (TVET) programs to students and local residents from low-income families and out-of-school youths, including persons with disabilities and indigenous peoples, in the Municipality of Naval and neighboring localities in the Province of Biliran, to help them become productive, self-reliant and globally competitive labor assets.

7 The Center shall offer training programs on relevant skills 8 trade competencies, craftsmanship, and entrepreneurship activities 9 needed to deliver the effective employment interventions that will 10 hasten the development of the host area and adjacent localities in 11 the Province of Biliran into human resource and productivity hubs.

12 The Center shall serve as TESDA-accredited Assessment 13 Center for acquired competencies in TVET programs in the 14 Municipality of Naval and adjacent localities in the Province of 15 Biliran. It shall also provide teachers' training and curriculum 16 design assistance to the secondary schools offering the 17 technical-vocational livelihood (TVL) track under the K to 12 18 Program in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd) and the TESDA. 19

20 SEC. 4. Training Programs. - The Center shall offer 21 short-term certificate courses and modular trainings in preferred 22 technical-vocational skills and trades specialization. To this end, the 23 Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Department of 24 Trade and Industry (DTI), Department of Science and Technology 25 (DOST), Department of Agriculture (DA), Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), National Economic and 26 27 Development Authority (NEDA), business-industry partners, and other relevant agencies and instrumentalities, both local and 28 29 international, shall provide the necessary assistance to enable the

Center to develop skilled manpower to achieve a robust and
 inclusive economy in the host area and its adjacent localities.

The Center may establish research and technology hubs, 3 technology development farms, satellite or extension training 4 centers, and promote mobile training programs to strengthen 5 linkages among the industry partners, the academe, and the Center 6 geared towards the acquisition of practical livelihood, employable 7 skills, gainful employment, and entrepreneurship in priority areas 8 in the Municipality of Naval and neighboring localities in the 9 Province of Biliran. 10

The Center shall offer the following TVET programs with
competencies assessment leading to National Certification Levels
I-III:

(a) Skills training in industrial technology and hard trades
such as metal and steelwork, machine fabrication and operation,
heavy equipment operation, automotive mechanic, refrigeration and
air conditioning, electronics, and operation of power tools and
equipment for both medium skills grade and industrial purposes;

(b) Agriculture and aquaculture-related training and skills development in such areas as farming technology, fishing operations technology, backyard farming and home-based aquaculture and propagation innovations, mechanized farm, fishing tools and equipment operation, agribusiness, agri-aqua trade technology and innovations, and relevant farmers and fisherfolk's trainings for increased productivity and entrepreneurship;

(c) Livelihood skills development courses for preferred
skills employment and small-scale entrepreneurship, including
practical skills education in arts and crafts, workmanship and
design, high-speed sewing, dressmaking and tailoring, horticulture,

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livestock raising and breeding, food processing technology, home
 technology, culinary arts and commercial cooking, cosmetology, and
 health and wellness training;

4 (d) Basic business literacy training in financial management, 5 marketing, practical accountancy, bookkeeping, office procedures, 6 business processes and application procedures including registration. licensing, documentation, business patent and 7 intellectual property regulation, business financing and investment 8 9 opportunities sourcing, import-export accreditation, online home-10 based business operation, and use of social media business 11 marketing:

(e) Technical-vocational occupation and trades skills such as
carpentry, masonry, plumbing, welding, practical electricity and
installation, automotive servicing, electronics servicing, personal
computer (PC) servicing, and such other relevant practical skills
courses;

(f) Computer literacy and information technology (IT)-related
skills, digital technology, web design, animation, photoshop/online
photography, computer design, and advertising;

20 (g) Social communication skills and language proficiency
21 courses in English and other languages for business process
22 outsourcing employment and overseas job placement;

(h) Seminars on personality development, career counseling,job placement, and work ethic and values; and

(i) Other preferred skills and trades training that may
be needed by the people of the Municipality of Naval and adjacent
localities of the Province of Biliran to enhance their capacities for
practical livelihood, gainful employment, and entrepreneurial
activities.

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1 SEC. 5. Compliance with TESDA Requirements. - The 2 provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the Center shall become operational only upon the determination and certification by the 3 TESDA, through the issuance of a formal recommendation and 4 certificate of compliance, that the Center has satisfactorily 5 6 complied with the minimum requirements for quality standards 7 prescribed by the TESDA governing the following competency assessment: 8

9 (a) Standards procedures and guidelines for the 10 establishment and operation of a Center;

(b) Operational sustainability of the Center, in terms of
licensed faculty-trainers and personnel, equipment, training and
laboratory facilities, instructional materials, and other standard
requirements of a Center;

15 (c) Sustainable funding source and allocation of the16 budgetary requirement;

(d) Assurance that the training programs offered are fully
aligned with the minimum standards of competency-based quality
technical-vocational skills technology and the needs of the host area
and adjacent communities served in the context of the Association of
Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Integration and the Philippine
Qualifications Framework for TVET; and

(e) Compliance with such other TESDA conditionalities and
standards, as may be necessary and applicable in establishing a
Center.

26 SEC. 6. Administration. – The Center shall be headed by a 27 Technical-Vocational Administrator, under the supervision of the 28 TESDA, who shall render full-time service and be responsible for its 29 administration and operation.

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1 The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall be appointed by 2 the TESDA Director General in accordance with the rules and 3 regulations of the Civil Service Commission and the qualification 4 requirements for such office.

5 The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall enter into 6 agreements with locally-based private and public counterpart 7 agencies or instrumentalities and persons, subject to the approval of 8 the TESDA Director General, for such assistance as may be 9 necessary to effectively implement this Act.

SEC. 7. Appropriations. - The TESDA Director General
shall include in the Authority's program the operation of the Center,
the funding of which shall be included in the annual General
Appropriations Act.

14 The LGUs concerned, in consultation with the TESDA, shall 15 set aside from any available local revenue an amount deemed 16 appropriate as annual counterpart fund to support the operation of 17 the Center herein established.

18 SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within 19 ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act, the TESDA shall, in 20 coordination with the DOLE, DTI, DOST, DA, Department of 21 Budget and Management, DILG, NEDA, the concerned LGUs, and 22 such other relevant agencies and industry-business partners of the 23 host locality, prepare and issue the necessary rules and regulations 24 for the effective implementation of this Act.

25 SEC. 9. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any 26 section or provision of this Act shall be deemed unconstitutional or 27 invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof shall not be affected 28 and shall remain in force and effect. 1 SEC. 10. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders, 2 decrees, instructions, rules and regulations contrary to or 3 inconsistent with any provision of this Act are repealed or amended 4 accordingly.

5 SEC. 11. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen
6 (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a
7 newspaper of general circulation.
