AN ACT

ESTABLISHING A TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (TESDA) TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTER IN THE CITY OF MAASIN, PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE, TO BE KNOWN AS THE MAASIN CITY, SOUTHERN LEYTE TESDA TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT CENTER, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Maasin City, Southern
 Leyte TESDA Training and Assessment Center Act".

SEC. 2. Establishment. - There is hereby established a training and assessment center,
under the supervision of the TESDA, to be known as the Maasin City, Southern Leyte TESDA
Training and Assessment Center. It shall be located in a highly accessible area in the City of
Maasin, Province of Southern Leyte, pursuant to the purposes of this Act and to the agreement
between the TESDA and the concerned local government units (LGUs).

8 SEC. 3. General Mandate. – The Maasin City, Southern Leyte TESDA Training and 9 Assessment Center, hereinafter referred to as the Center, shall primarily provide technical-10 vocational education and training (TVET) programs to students and local residents from low-11 income families and out-of-school youths, including persons with disabilities and indigenous 12 peoples, in the City of Maasin and the neighboring localities in the Province of Southern Leyte, 13 to help them become productive, self-reliant and globally competitive labor assets.

14 The Center shall provide effective employment interventions through training programs 15 on relevant skills in trade competencies, craftsmanship, and entrepreneurship activities to help 16 hasten the development of the host area and the adjacent localities in the Province of Southern 17 Leyte into human resource and productivity hubs.

18 The Center shall serve as a TESDA-accredited Assessment Center for acquired 19 competencies in TVET programs in the City of Maasin and adjacent localities in the Province 20 of Southern Leyte. It shall also provide technical-vocational training for teachers and 21 curriculum design assistance to the secondary schools offering the technical-vocational

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livelihood track under the K to 12 Program, in coordination with the Department of Education
 and the TESDA.

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3 SEC. 4. Training Programs - The Center shall offer short-term certificate courses and modular trainings in preferred technical-vocational skills and trades specialization. To this end, 4 the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), 5 Department of Science and Technology (DOST), Department of Agriculture (DA), 6 Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), National Economic and 7 Development Authority (NEDA), business-industry partners, and other relevant agencies and 8 instrumentalities, both local and international, shall provide the necessary assistance to enable 9 the Center to develop skilled manpower to achieve a robust and inclusive economy in the host 10 11 area and its adjacent localities.

12 The Center may establish research and technology hubs, technology development 13 farms, satellite or extension training centers, promote mobile training programs, and strengthen 14 linkages among the industry partners, the academe, and the Center geared towards the 15 acquisition by residents of practical livelihood, employable skills, gainful employment, and 16 entrepreneurial capabilities in priority areas in the City of Maasin and neighboring localities in 17 the Province of Southern Leyte.

The Center shall offer the following TVET programs with competencies assessment
 leading to National Certification Levels I-III:

- (a) Skills training in industrial technology and hard trades such as metal and steelwork,
 machine fabrication and operation, heavy equipment operation, automotive
 mechanic, refrigeration and air conditioning, electronics, and operation of power
 tools and equipment for both medium skills grade and industrial purposes;
 (b) Agriculture and equipment is a standard to the standard trades such as metal and steelwork,
- (b) Agriculture and aquaculture-related trainings and skills development in such areas
 as farming technology, fishing operations technology, backyard farming and home based aquaculture and propagation innovations, mechanized farm, fishing tools and
 equipment operation, agribusiness, agri-aqua trade technology and innovations, and
 relevant farmers and fisherfolk's trainings for increased productivity and
 entrepreneurship;
- 30 (c) Livelihood skills development courses for preferred skills employment and small 31 scale entrepreneurship, including practical skills education in arts and crafts,
 32 workmanship and design, high-speed sewing, dressmaking and tailoring,
 33 horticulture, livestock raising and breeding, food processing technology, home
 34 technology, culinary arts and commercial cooking, cosmetology, and health and
 35 wellness training;
- 36 (d) Basic business literacy training in financial management and marketing, practical
 37 accountancy, bookkeeping and office procedures, business processes and

- application procedures including registration, licensing, documentation, business patent and intellectual property regulation, business financing and investment opportunities sourcing, import-export accreditation, online home-based business operation and social media business marketing;
 (e) Technical-vocational occupation and trades strills and
 - (e) Technical-vocational occupation and trades skills such as carpentry, masonry, plumbing, welding, practical electricity and installation, automotive servicing, electronics servicing, personal computer servicing, and such other relevant practical skills courses;
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(f) Computer literacy and information technology-related skills, digital technology, web design, animation, photoshop/online photography, computer design and advertising;

- (g) Social communication skills and language proficiency courses in English and other languages for business process outsourcing employment and overseas job placement;
 - (h) Seminars in personality development, career counseling, job placement, and work ethic and values; and
 - (i) Other preferred skills and trades training that may be needed by the people of the City of Maasin and of the other localities of the Province of Southern Leyte to enhance their capacities for practical livelihood, gainful employment, and entrepreneurial activities.

21 SEC. 5. Compliance with TESDA Requirements.- The provisions of this Act notwithstanding, the Center shall become operational only upon the determination and 22 certification by the TESDA, through the issuance of a formal recommendation and certificate 23 of compliance, that the Center has satisfactorily complied with the minimum standards of 24 quality prescribed by TESDA governing the following: (a) standard procedures and guidelines 25 for the establishment and operation of a Center; (b) operational sustainability of the Center, in 26 terms of licensed faculty-trainers and personnel, equipment, training and laboratory facilities, 27 instructional materials, and other standard requirements of a Center; (c) sustainable funding ° °, source and allocation of the budgetary requirement; (d) full alignment of the training programs 29 offered with the minimum standards of competency-based quality technical-vocational skills 30 technology and the needs of the host area and adjacent communities served within the context 31 of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) integration and the Philippine 32 33 for TVET; and e) compliance with such other TESDA Qualification Framework conditionalities and standards, as may be necessary and applicable in establishing a Center. 34 35

SEC. 6. Administration. - The Center shall be headed by a Technical-Vocational
 Administrator who shall render full-time service and be responsible for its administration and
 operation, under the supervision of the TESDA.

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The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall be appointed by the TESDA Director I General in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Civil Service Commission and the 2 qualification requirements for such office. 3

The Technical-Vocational Administrator shall enter into agreements with locally-based private and public counterpart agencies, instrumentalities 5 or persons, and seek such assistance as may be necessary to effectively implement this Act, subject to the approval of the 6 7 **TESDA Director General**.

8 SEC. 7. Appropriations. - The Director General of the TESDA shall include in the Authority's program the operation of the Center, the funding of which shall be included in the 9 annual General Appropriations Act. 10

11 The LGUs concerned, in consultation with the TESDA, shall set aside from any available local revenue an amount deemed appropriate as annual counterpart fund to support 12 the operation of the Center herein established. 13

14 SEC. 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - Within ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act, the TESDA shall, in coordination with the DOLE, DTI, DOST, DA, 15 Department of Budget and Management, DILG, NEDA, the concerned LGUs, and such other 16 relevant agencies and industry-business partners of the host locality, prepare and issue the 17 necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act. 1E

SEC. 9. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Act 19 shall be deemed unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions thereof shall not 20 be affected and shall remain in force and in effect. 21

SEC. 10. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders, decrees, instructions, rules 22 and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with any provision of this Act are repealed or 23 24 amended accordingly.

25 SEC. 11. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation. 26

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
