AN ACT

DECLARING THE SICOGON ISLAND LOCATED IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CARLES, PROVINCE OF ILOILO, AN ECOTOURISM ZONE AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Sicogon Island Ecotourism Zone
 Act."
- 3 SEC. 2. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote a tourism industry
 4 that is ecologically sustainable, responsible, participative, culturally-sensitive, economically
 5 viable and equitably beneficial to local communities.

SEC. 3. The Sicogon Island, consisting of three (3) barangays, namely, Alipata,
Buaya, and San Fernando, all located in the Municipality of Carles, Province of Iloilo, is
hereby declared an ecotourism zone, to be known as the "Sicogon Island Ecotourism Zone".
As such, its development shall be prioritized by the Department of Tourism (DOT), subject
to the rules and regulations governing the development of ecotourism zones.

11 Within six (6) months from the approval of this Act, the DOT, in coordination with 12 the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), the Tourism Infrastructure 13 and Enterprise Zone Authority (TIEZA) and the municipal government of Carles, shall

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prepare and jointly implement the development plan for Sicogon Island and shall incorporate
 the same in the National Tourism Development Plan.

The DOT, in coordination with the DENR, the TIEZA, the municipal government of Carles, and other concerned agencies of government, shall delineate well-defined geographic areas within the Sicogon Island Ecotourism Zone and coordinate the integrated development of the area for the optimum use of natural assets and attractions. The development shall ensure the preservation of the flora and fauna and perpetuate the historic significance of the identified tourist attractions.

9 SEC. 4. The Secretaries of the DOT and the DENR shall include in their respective 10 Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included 11 in the annual General Appropriations Act, and shall augment such allocation with internally 12 generated funds of the DOT.

SEC. 5. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the
DOT, in consultation with the DENR, the TIEZA and the municipal government of Carles,
shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this
Act.

SEC. 6. All laws, rules, regulations, presidential decrees and other issuances
inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby deemed repealed or amended
accordingly.

SEC. 7. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official
 Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
