AN ACT TO DECLARE THE CITY OF DAVAO AS THE CHOCOLATE AND CACAO PRODUCTION CAPITAL OF THE PHILIPPINES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Declaration of Policy – The State upholds as a goal of the national economy the sustained increase in the amount of goods and services produced by the nation for the benefit of the people, and recognizes that expanding productivity is the key to raising the quality of life for all, especially the underprivileged. The State shall promote industrialization and full employment based on sound agricultural development through industries that make full and efficient use of human and natural resources, and which are competitive in both domestic and foreign markets (Article XII, Section 1, Constitution).

Toward this end, the State recognizes the importance of cacao production as a driver of agricultural development and economic progress because of the tremendous potentials of cacao -as raw material for domestic production of diverse products that can Increase the country's export earnings, generate employment, increase incomes of farmers and improve the quality of life of Filipinos in the countryside.

Section 2. Cacao and Chocolate Production Capital.—The City of Davao is hereby declared as the cacao and chocolate production capital of the Philippines in recognition of its sterling achievement as the country's biggest producer of high quality cacao and its vital contribution to making the Philippines a world renowned producer of high quality chocolate products sought after by chocolate makers in the USA, Europe and Asia.

Section 3. Incentives. — The Department of Agriculture (DA) and the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) shall provide sustained programs for the grant of financial, technical, training, marketing and other necessary assistance to cacao farmers and entrepreneurs engaged in the production of chocolate products in Davao City and its contiguous localities.

Section 4. Effectivity. — This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
