AN ACT
PROVIDING FOR STIFFER PENALTIES FOR DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL, DANGEROUS DRUGS AND/OR OTHER SIMILAR SUBSTANCES, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10586, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE “ANTI-DRUNK AND DRUGGED DRIVING ACT OF 2013”

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 **SECTION 1.** Section 12 of Republic Act No. 10586 is hereby amended to read
2 as follows:

3 “SEC. 12. *Penalties.* – A driver found to have been driving a motor
4 vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, dangerous drugs and/or other
5 similar substances, as provided under Section 5 of this Act, shall be
6 penalized as follows:

7 a) If the violation of Section 5 did not result in physical injuries
8 or homicide, the penalty of [three (3)] SIX (6) months imprisonment and a
9 fine ranging from [Twenty] FIFTY thousand pesos [(Php20,000.00)]
10 (PHP50,000.00) to [Eighty] ONE HUNDRED thousand pesos
11 [(Php80,000.00)] (PHP100,000.00) shall be imposed;

1 b) If the violation of Section 5 resulted in physical injuries, the
2 penalty provided for in THE APPLICABLE PARAGRAPH OF Article 263
3 of the Revised Penal Code, IN ITS MAXIMUM PERIOD, or the penalty
4 provided for in the [next] IMMEDIATELY preceding paragraph, whichever
5 is higher, and a fine ranging from One hundred FIFTY thousand pesos
6 [(Php100,000.00)] (PHP150,000.00) to Two hundred FIFTY thousand
7 pesos [(Php200,000.00)] (PHP250,000.00) shall be imposed;

8 c) If the violation of Section 5 resulted in homicide, the penalty
9 provided in Article 249 of the Revised Penal Code, IN ITS MAXIMUM
10 PERIOD, and a fine ranging from Three hundred FIFTY thousand pesos
11 [(Php300,000.00)] (PHP350,000.00) to Five hundred FIFTY thousand
12 pesos [(Php500,000.00)] (PHP550,000.00) shall be imposed;

13 d) The non-professional driver's license of any person found to
14 have violated Section 5 of this Act shall also be confiscated and suspended
15 for a period of [twelve (12)] EIGHTEEN (18) months for the first conviction
16 and perpetually revoked for the second conviction. The professional
17 driver's license of any person found to have violated Section 5 of this Act
18 shall also be confiscated and perpetually revoked for the first conviction.
19 The perpetual revocation of a driver's license shall disqualify the person
20 from being granted any kind of driver's license thereafter."

21 **SEC. 2.** Section 16 of Republic Act No. 10586 is hereby amended to read as
22 follows:

23 "SEC. 16. *Review of Penalties.* – The LTO shall, after five (5) years
24 from the effectivity of this Act and every [five (5)] THREE (3) years
25 thereafter, review the applicability and enforcement of all foregoing
26 pecuniary penalties and shall initiate amendment and/or upgrade the same
27 as may be necessary, subject to the approval of the PRESIDENT OF THE
28 REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES UPON THE RECOMMENDATION
29 OF THE Secretary of [the DOTC] TRANSPORTATION."

30 **SEC. 3.** All laws, decrees, executive orders, presidential issuances and other
31 administrative rules and regulation or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the
32 provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

33 **SEC. 4.** This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the
34 *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
