AN ACT

**SEPARATING THE MARIANO PERALTA NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL – DATU DANWATA EXTENSION IN BARANGAY DATU DANWATA, MUNICIPALITY OF MALITA, PROVINCE OF DAVAO OCCIDENTAL FROM THE MARIANO PERALTA NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, CONVERTING IT INTO AN INDEPENDENT NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TO BE KNOWN AS GASPAR DANWATA NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

1           SECTION 1. The Mariano Peralta National High School – Datu Danwata Extension  
2 in Barangay Datu Danwata, Municipality of Malita, Province of Davao Occidental is hereby  
3 separated from the Mariano Peralta National High School and converted into an independent  
4 national high school to be known as Gaspar Danwata National High School.

6           SEC. 2. All personnel, assets, liabilities and records of the Mariano Peralta National  
7 High School – Datu Danwata Extension are hereby transferred to and absorbed by the Gaspar  
8 Danwata National High School.

10          SEC. 3. The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department's  
11 program the operationalization of the Gaspar Danwata National High School, the initial  
12 funding of which shall be charged against the current year's appropriation of the Mariano  
13 Peralta National High School – Datu Danwata Extension. Thereafter, the amount necessary  
14 for the continued operation of the school shall be included in the annual General  
15 Appropriations Act.

17          SEC. 4. Within sixty (60) days after the approval of this Act, the Secretary of  
18 Education shall promulgate the rules and regulations implementing the provisions of this Act.  
19

20          SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official*  
21 *Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
