## AN ACT

## ESTABLISHING A SPORTS ACADEMY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DIMASALANG, PROVINCE OF MASBATE TO BE KNOWN AS MASBATE SPORTS ACADEMY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Masbate Academy of
Sports for High School Students Act."

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is the declared policy of the State to promote the sustained development of young Filipinos whose skills in the field of sports shall be encouraged and honed through education and specialized training programs. To this end, the State shall establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education and training to advance the athletic talents and skills among the youth and promote the growth and development of young athletes nationwide.

SEC. 3. Establishment. - There is hereby established a sports academy for high school
in the Municipality of Dimasalang, Province of Masbate, to be known as the Masbate Sports
Academy.

15 The Masbate Sports Academy shall be administered by the Department of Education 16 (DepEd), in coordination with the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC), for policy and 17 program formulation and implementation.

SEC. 4. Purpose. – The Masbate Sports Academy shall offer secondary education purposely to develop the athletic skills and talents of high school students with considerable potential in sports in the Province of Masbate. The school curriculum shall place significant emphasis on developing the athletic skills of the students through subjects pertaining to physical education and sports.

SEC. 5. *Powers and Functions.* – The Masbate Sports Academy shall exercise the
following powers and functions:

(a) Formulate and implement policies, plans, and programs that shall promote the development and harness the potential of high school students;

1 2	(b)	Provide an integrated curriculum framework in order to optimize the potential of its students;
3	(c)	Establish sports programs and school facilities;
4	(d)	Promote strategic partnerships and alliances with local and international sports
5 6		organizations and educational training institutions to enhance the competitiveness of students and personnel;
7 8	(e)	Develop plans and programs that shall enhance the career advancement opportunities of school personnel;
9 10	(f)	Establish guidelines for public-private partnerships in the implementation of sports programs of the school; and

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14	SEC. 6. School Director The Masbate Sports Academy shall be headed by a School

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20	SEC. 7. Sectoral and Industry Task Forces The Masbate Sports Academy may
