## AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7305, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA FOR PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

According to a Department of Health (DOH) presentation last September 2021, the Philippines' total number of Health Care Workers (HCWs) is at five hundred twenty-six thousand, seven hundred and twenty-seven (526,727). Of this number, four hundred sixty-two thousand, nine hundred fifty-five (462,955) HCWs are public health workers.

This is no small number. Over four hundred thousand health care workers who constantly devote themselves to the sacred duty of caring for others, at the risk of personal safety. Hence, this also means that over four hundred thousand public health workers in the Philippines are in constant need of good support from the government.

As part of fulfilling its duty to establish and maintain manpower development and research, the State must therefore secure the well-being of its public health care workers. Such is precisely what this bill intends to do.

Among the important features of this measure is to mandate the establishment of a new salary scale, following Republic Act No. 11466 or the Salary Standardization

Law of 2019, provided that the benchmark for the position of Rural Health Position shall be Salary Grade (SG) 24, while it shall be SG 16 for the position of Nurse I.

This measure also proposes several changes to the allowances to which our public health care workers are entitled. Among these changes is the addition of the following allowances: a Special Risk Allowance and a Rice Subsidy Allowance. Further, the allowance for Laundry shall now include clothing.

Under this bill, it is also provided that if a public health care worker contracts any disease or is injured in the performance of their duty, they shall be entitled to the amount of one hundred pesos (P100,000.00). On the other hand, in the unfortunate event that the worker dies in the course of fulfilling their duty, the amount of one million pesos (P1,000,000.00) shall be given.

Surely, one cannot put a price on the act of securing good health. At the same time, the value of our public health care workers' contribution cannot be quantified. Nevertheless, in the same way that our health care workers do not flee in the face of a health crisis, neither must lawmakers shirk away from the opportunity to ensure the establishment of a well-functioning healthcare system. For this reason, I earnestly seek the swift passage of this bill into law.

## AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7305 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA FOR PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

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NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LAW TO THE CONTRARY, PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS WHO MAY BE INJURED OR CONTRACT ANY DISEASE WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES SHALL BE ENTITLED TO AN AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00): PROVIDED, THAT THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION PESOS (P1,000,000.00) SHALL BE GIVEN TO PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS WHO MAY DIE WHILE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTY: PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT ENTITLEMENT TO COMPENSATION UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT PRECLUDE PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS TO CLAIM ANY OTHER BENEFITS FOR THE SAME INJURY PROVIDED FOR BY OTHER LAWS."

Sec. 11. Free Continuing Professional Development. – The Department of Health shall provide free Continuing Professional Development training for public health worker professionals who are required to undertake such program as a requirement for the renewal of their professional identification cards under the regulation of Professional Regulatory Commission as mandated by Republic Act No.

10912 or the "Continuing Professional Development Act of 2016".

Sec. 12. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* – The Secretary of Health after consultation with appropriate agencies of the Government as well as professional and health workers' organizations or unions, shall formulate and prepare the revised implementing rules and regulation of the Magna Carta for Public Health Workers in accordance with this Act.

Sec. 13. *Separability Clause*. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or any provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.

Sec. 14. *Repealing Clause*. - All other laws, decrees, executive orders and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Sec. 15. *Effectivity* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in one (1) newspaper of general circulation.
