AN ACT GRANTING ADDITIONAL BENEFITS AND PRIVILEGES TO FORMER PRESIDENTS OF THE PHILIPPINES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Former Presidents of the Philippines, to a certain extent, still serve as a representation of the country. As former highest-ranking elected officials of the country, former Presidents are expected to contribute insights on nation building and pressing national issues which may require their expertise.

Despite the end of their term, they are also expected to perform postpresidential duties such as meeting with foreign and local dignitaries, and attending public events and other social engagements. These duties often require them to employ the services of personal staff and maintain private offices.

To maintain the dignity of the Office of the President and honor former Presidents of the Republic, this proposed measure seeks to grant them certain benefits and privileges that will allow them to perform the duties and functions often required of a former President. The bill also provides them and their immediate family security protection in order to thwart any attempt to harm them even after leaving public office.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Former Presidents
 Benefits Act of 2023."
- SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy*. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to maintain the dignity of the Office of the President and to honor former Presidents of the Republic by granting them certain benefits and privileges that will allow them to perform the duties and functions often required of a former President.
 - **SEC. 3.** *Eligibility.* All former Presidents shall be entitled to the benefits and privileges provided under this Act.
- 9 **SEC. 4.** *Benefits.* Each former President shall be entitled to the following, for the remainder of his/her life:
 - (a) Personal security and protection detail of at least three (3) personnel to be provided by the Presidential Security Group, and to be augmented by the Philippine National Police (PNP) as the need arises. The former President shall have the right to choose the head of his/her own security detail;
 - (b) Personal security and protection of at least two (2) personnel to be provided by the Presidential Security Group, and to be augmented by the Philippine

11	Philippines as the former President shall specify.

13	SEC. 5. Appropriations The amount necessary to implement the provisions of
14	this Act shall be included by the Department of Budget and Management in the
15	annual General Appropriations Act (GAA).

17	SEC. 6. Separability Clause Should any provision herein be declared
18	unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof that are not affected thereby
19	shall continue to be in full force and effect.
20	
21	SEC. 7. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations or
22	other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
23	repealed or modified accordingly.

25	SEC. 8. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its

publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
