**AN ACT  
CONVERTING THE MUNICIPALITY OF LA TRINIDAD, PROVINCE OF  
BENGUET INTO A COMPONENT CITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE  
CITY OF LA TRINIDAD**

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Municipality of La Trinidad is a first-class municipality in the Province of Benguet. It is composed of sixteen (16) barangays, the largest in the province, namely: Alapang, Alno, Ambiong, Bahong, Balili, Beckel, Betag, Bineng, Cruz, Lubas, Pico, Poblacion, Puguis, Shilan, Tawang, and Wangal. During the colonial era, La Trinidad is relatively the most developed settlement in the Benguet area as it served as the gateway from the Southern Lowlands in to the mountain region and the center of administration for colonizers. La Trinidad is well cultivated with rice, sweet potatoes, gabi, sugarcane by its original settlers.

La Trinidad is the Strawberry and Rosa Capital of the Philippines. On 18 March 2024, the municipality enters a larger Larger Giant Strawberry Cake into the Guinness Book of World Records. A year later, the record is confirmed with the title "Largest Fruit Shortcake". At present, La Trinidad is home to several higher learning institutions, a center for banking and finance, and an expanding area of socio-economic activities.

This bill seeks to convert the Municipality of La Trinidad into a component city of the Province of Benguet to be known as the City of La Trinidad. This will tap into the full economic potential of the Municipality of La Trinidad, Benguet, paving the way for additional development and services for the growing population.

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**CITY OF LA TRINIDAD**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

1           **SECTION 1. Short Title.** – This Act shall be known as the "*Charter of the City of*  
2 *La Trinidad*".

3  
4           **SEC. 2. City of La Trinidad.** – The Municipality of La Trinidad is hereby converted  
5 into a component city to be known as the City of La Trinidad, hereinafter referred to  
6 as the City, which shall comprise of the present territory of the Municipality of La  
7 Trinidad in the province of Benguet.

8  
9           La Trinidad is located 3 kilometers north of Baguio City and is 256 kilometers  
10 north of Manila. It is bounded on the north by the municipality of Tublay, on the south  
11 by the City of Baguio, on the west by Sablan and Tuba. Its geographical coordinates  
12 are 16°21" north latitude 120°35" east longitude.

13           The foregoing provision shall be without prejudice to the resolution of  
14 appropriate agency or forum of existing boundary disputes or cases involving questions  
15 of territorial jurisdiction between the Municipality of La Trinidad and the adjoining local  
16 government units. *Provided,* That the territorial jurisdiction of the disputed area or  
17 areas shall remain with the local government unit the final resolution of the case.

18  
19           **SEC. 3. Corporate Powers of the City.** – The City constitutes a political body that  
20 is corporate in nature and as such is endowed with the attributes of perpetual

1 succession and possessed the powers which pertain to a municipal corporation to be  
2 exercised in conformity corporate powers:

- 3  
4 a. To have a continuous succession in its corporate name;  
5 b. To sue and be sued;  
6 c. To have and use a corporate seal;  
7 d. To acquire, hold and convey real or personal;  
8 e. To enter into any contracts or agreements; and  
9 f. To exercise such other powers, prerogatives or authority subject to the  
10 limitations provided under this Act or in existing laws.

11  
12 **SEC. 4. *General Powers of the City.*** – The City shall have a common seal and  
13 may alter the same at pleasure. *Provided,* That any change of corporate seal shall be  
14 registered with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG). It shall  
15 exercise the power to levy taxes; to close and open roads, streets, alleys, parks or  
16 squares; to take, purchase, receive, hold lease, convey and dispose of real and personal  
17 property for public use; to contract and be contracted with; to sue and be sued; to  
18 prosecute and defend to final judgment and execution suits wherein the City is involved  
19 or interested in and to exercise all powers as are granted to corporations or as  
20 hereinafter conferred.

21  
22 **SEC. 5. *Liability for Damages.*** – The City and its officials shall not be exempt  
23 from liability for death or injury to persons or damage to property.

24  
25 **SEC. 6. *Jurisdiction of the City.*** – The jurisdiction of the City of La Trinidad for  
26 police purposes only, shall be coextensive with its territorial jurisdiction and, for  
27 purposes of protecting and ensuring the purity of water supply of the City, such police  
28 jurisdiction shall also extend over all the territory within the drainage area of such water  
29 supply, or within one hundred meters (100 m.) of any reservoir, conduit, canal,  
30 aqueduct or pumping station used in connection with the city water service.

31  
32 The regional trial courts and the city courts of the City of La Trinidad shall have  
33 concurrent jurisdiction with the regional trial courts and the metropolitan trial courts or  
34 city or municipal trial courts of the adjoining municipalities or cities to try crimes and  
35 misdemeanors committed within said drainage area or within said spaces of one  
36 hundred meters.

37  
38 The court first taking cognizance of such an offense shall have jurisdiction to try  
39 cases to the exclusion of others. The police forces of the municipalities and cities  
40 concerned shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the police forces of the City for the  
41 maintenance of good order and enforcement of ordinances throughout the said zone,  
42 area or space shall be granted by the proper authorities of the city or municipality  
43 concerned, and the fees arising therefrom shall accrue to the treasury of the said city  
44 or municipality concerned and not the City.

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## CHAPTER II

### CITY OFFICIALS IN GENERAL

**SEC. 7.** *The Officials of the City of La Trinidad.* – a. There shall be in the City: A City Mayor, City Vice Mayor, *Sangguniang Panlungsod* Members, Secretary to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, a City Treasurer and an Assistant City Treasurer, a City Assessor, a City Accountant, a City Budget Officer, a City Planning and Development Coordinator, a City Engineer, a City Health Officer, a City Civil Registrar, a City Administrator, a City Legal Officer, a City Veterinarian, a City Social Welfare and Development Officer and a City General Services Officer;

a. In addition thereto, the City Mayor may appoint a City Architect, a City Population Officer, a City Information Officer, a City Environment and Natural Resources Officer, a City Agriculturist and a City Cooperatives Officers;

b. There shall established in the City a City Fire Station to be headed by a City Fire Marshall, a City Jail to be headed by a City Jail Warden, a City Schools Division to be headed by a City Schools Division Superintendent and a City Prosecution Service to be headed by a City Prosecutor; and

c. The *Sangguniang Panlungsod* may:

b. Maintain existing offices which are not included in subsections (a) and (b) hereof;

c. Create such other offices as maybe necessary to carry-out the purposes of the City; or

d. Consolidate the functions of any office with those of another in the interest of efficiency and economy.

d. Unless otherwise provided herein, the heads of departments and offices shall be appointed by the City Mayor with concurrence of the majority of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, subject to civil service laws, rules and regulations. The *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall act on the appointment within fifteen (15) days from the day of its submission, otherwise the same shall be deemed confirmed.

e. Elective and appointive city officials shall receive compensation, allowances and other emoluments as may be determined by law or ordinance, subject to the budgetary limitations on personal services prescribed under Title Five, Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended: *Provided*, That no increase in the compensation of the City Mayor, City Vice Mayor and *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member shall take effect until after the expiration of the full term of the local officials approving the increase.



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## CHAPTER III

### THE CITY MAYOR AND VICE MAYOR

**SEC. 8. *The City Mayor.*** – a. The City Mayor shall be the Chief Executive of the City and shall be elected at large by qualified voters of the City. No person shall be eligible for the position of City Mayor unless at the time of election, that the person is a citizen of the Philippines, at least Twenty-one (21) years of age, a resident of the City for at least one (1) year prior to the elections and qualified voter therein and is able to read and write Filipino or any other language or dialect. The City Mayor shall hold office for three (3) years, unless sooner removed, but shall serve for not more than three (3) consecutive terms in the same position. The City Mayor shall receive a minimum monthly compensation corresponding to Salary Grade 30 as prescribed under Republic Act No. 6758, as amended, otherwise known as the "Compensation and Position Classification Act of 1989", and the Implementing Guidelines issued pursuant thereto.

The City Mayor as the Chief Executive of the City Government, shall exercise such powers and perform such duties and functions as provided herein

b. For efficient, effective and economical governance, the purpose pf which is the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants, the City Mayor shall:

- I. 1. Exercise general supervision and control over all programs, projects, services and activities of the city government and, in this connection shall:
- i. i. Determine the guidelines of city policies and be responsible to *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, implement the same;
  - ii. ii. Direct the formulation of the City Development Plan, with the assistance of the city development council and upon approval thereof by the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, implement the same;
  - iv. iii. Present the Program of Government and propose policies and projects for the consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* at the opening of the regular session of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* every calendar year and as often as may be deemed necessary as the general welfare of the inhabitants and the needs of the City government may require;
  - vi. iv. Initiate and propose legislative measures to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and as often as may be deemed necessary provide such information and data needed or requested by the said *Sangguniang Panlungsod* in the performance of its legislative functions;
  - viii. v. Appoint all officials and employees whose salaries and wages are wholly or mainly paid out of City funds and whose appointments are not otherwise
  - ix.

1 provided for in the Act, and those whose appointment may be under other  
2 laws;

3 x.

4 xi. vi. Represent the City in all its business transactions and sign on its behalf  
5 bonds, contracts, obligations and such other documents with authority  
6 from the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* or pursuant to law or ordinance;

7 xii.

8 xiii. vii. Carry-out such emergency measures as may be necessary during and  
9 in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;

10 xiv.

11 xv. viii. Determine the time, manner and place of payment of salaries and  
12 wages of officials and employees, in accordance with law or ordinance;

13 xvi.

14 xvii. ix. Allocate and assign office space to City officials and employees who, by  
15 law or ordinance, are entitled to such space in the City Hall, and other  
16 building owned or leased by the city government;

17 xviii.

18 x. Ensure that all executive officials and employees of the City faithfully  
19 discharge their duties and functions as provided for the law and the Local  
20 Government Code of 1991, as amended, and cause to be instituted  
21 administrative or judicial proceedings against any official or employee of  
22 the City who may have committed an offense in the performance of his  
23 official duties

24 xi. Examine the books, records and other documents of all offices, officials,  
25 agents or employees of the City and, in aid of executive powers and  
26 authority, require all national officials and employees stationed in or  
27 assigned to the City to available books, records and other documents in  
28 their custody except those classified by law as confidential;

29 xii. Furnish copies of Executive Orders issued by him to the Office of  
30 the Governor of the Province of Benguet within seventy-two (72) hours  
31 upon issuance;

32  
33 II. xiii. Visit component barangays of the City at least once every six (6)  
34 months to deepen understanding of the problems and conditions, listen  
35 and give appropriate counsel to local officials and inhabitants, inform the  
36 component barangay officials and inhabitants of general laws and  
37 ordinance which especially concern them, and otherwise conduct visits  
38 and inspections to ensure that the governance of the City will improve the  
39 quality of life of the inhabitants;

40 III. xiv. Act on leave application of officials and employees appointed and on  
41 the commutation of monetary value of their leave credits in accordance  
42 with law;

43 IV. xv. Authorized official trips of officials and employees outside of the City  
44 for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days. *Provided*, That trips abroad for

1 a longer period may be authorized in accordance with the Local  
2 Government Code of 1991, as amended.

- 3 V. xvi. Call upon any national official or employee stationed in or assigned to  
4 the City to advise him on matters affecting the City and to make  
5 recommendations thereon; coordinate with the said officials and  
6 employees in the formulation and implementation of plans, programs and  
7 projects; and when appropriate, initiate administrative or judicial action  
8 against national government official or employee who may have committed  
9 and offense in the performance of his official duties while stationed in or  
10 assigned to the City;
- 11 VI. xvii. Authorize the payment of medical care, necessary transportation,  
12 subsistence, medical or hospital fees of City officials and employees who  
13 are injured while in the availability of funds;
- 14 VII. xviii. Solemnize marriages, any provision of law to the contrary  
15 notwithstanding;
- 16 VIII. xix. Conduct an annual *palarong panlungsod* which shall feature traditional  
17 sports and disciplines included in national and international games in  
18 coordination with the Department of Education; and
- 19 IX. xx. Submit to the provincial governor the following reports: an Annual  
20 Report containing a summary of all matters pertinent to the management,  
21 administration and development of the City and all information and data  
22 relative to its political, social and economic conditions; supplemental  
23 reports when unexpected events or situations arise at any time during the  
24 year, particularly when man-made or natural disasters or calamities affect  
25 the general welfare of the City.
- 26
- 27 2. Enforce all laws and ordinances relative to the governance of the City and in the  
28 exercise of its appropriate powers as well as implement all approved policies,  
29 programs, projects, services and activities of the City and in addition shall:
- 30 I. i. Ensure that acts of the City's component barangays and its officials and  
31 employees are within the scope of their prescribed powers, duties and functions;
- 32 II. ii. Call conventions, conferences, seminars or meetings of elective or appointive  
33 officials of the City, at such time and place and on such subject he may deem  
34 important for the promotion of general welfare of the local government unit and  
35 its inhabitants;
- 36 III. iii. Issue such Executive Orders for the faithful and appropriate enforcement and  
37 execution of laws and ordinances;
- 38 IV. iv. Be entitled to carry the necessary firearms within his territorial jurisdiction;
- 39 V. v. Act as the deputized representatives of the National Police Commission,  
40 formulate the peace and order plan of the City; upon its approval, implement  
41 the same; and as such exercise general and operational control over police  
42 forces in the City in accordance with Republic Act No. 6975, otherwise known as  
43 the "Department of Interior and Local Government Act of 1990"; and



- 1 VI. vi. Call upon the appropriate law enforcement agencies to suppress disorder,  
2 riot, lawless violence, rebellion or seduction or apprehend violators of the law  
3 when public interest so requires and the city police forces are inadequate to  
4 cope with the situation or the violators;  
5
- 6 3. Initiate the maximize the generation of resources and revenues, the  
7 implementation development plans, program objectives and priorities,  
8 particularly the resources and revenues programed for agro-industrial  
9 development and countryside growth and progress, and relative thereto, shall:  
10 i. Require each head of an office or department to prepare and submit and  
11 estimate of appropriations for the calendar year in accordance with the  
12 budget preparation process enshrined under Republic Act No. 7160, as  
13 amended, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991";  
14 ii. Prepare and submit to the *Sanggunian* for approval the executive and  
15 supplemental budgets of the City for the ensuing calendar year in the manner  
16 provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;  
17 iii. Ensure that all taxes and revenues of the City are collected and the City funds  
18 are applied to the payment of expenses and the settlement of obligations of  
19 the City, in accordance with law or ordinance;  
20 iv. Issue licenses and permits and suspend or revoke the same for any violation  
21 of the condition upon which said licenses or permits had been issued  
22 pursuant to law or ordinance;  
23 v. Issue permits without need of approval from any national agency, for the  
24 holdings and activities for any charitable or welfare purpose, excluding  
25 prohibited games or shows contrary to law, public policy morals;  
26 vi. Require owners of illegally constructed houses, buildings or structures to  
27 obtain the necessary permit, subject such fines and penalties as ay be  
28 imposed by law or ordinance, or to order the demolition or removal of said  
29 house, building or structure within the period prescribed by law or ordinance;  
30 vii. Adopt adequate measures to safeguard and conserved land, mineral, forest,  
31 marine and other sources of the City;  
32 viii. Provide efficient and effective property and supply management in the City  
33 and protect the funds, credits, rights and other properties of the City; and  
34 ix. Institute or cause to be instituted administrative or judicial proceedings for  
35 the violation of ordinance in the collection of taxes, fees or charges, and for  
36 the recovery of funds and property; and cause the City to be defended  
37 against all suits to ensure that its interest, resources and rights shall be  
38 adequately protected.  
39
- 40 4. Ensure the delivery of basic services and the provision of adequate  
41 facilities and in addition thereto, shall;  
42 i. Ensure that the construction of roads and highways funded by the national  
43 government shall be, as far as practicable, carried out in a spatially



1 contiguous manner and in coordination with the construction and repair of  
2 the roads and bridges of the City; and  
3 ii. Coordinate the implementation of technical services including public works  
4 and infrastructure programs, rendered by the national offices.

5  
6 5. Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
7 provided for under Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as the Local  
8 Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those that are prescribed by law  
9 or ordinance.

10  
11 c. During the incumbency of the City Mayor, he shall hold office in the city  
12 hall.

13  
14 **SEC. 9. The City Vice Mayor.** – a. There shall be a City Vice Mayor who shall be  
15 elected in the same manner as the City Mayor and at the time of his election shall  
16 possess the same qualification as the City Mayor. The City Vice Mayor shall hold office  
17 for a term of three (3) years, unless sooner removed, and shall receive a monthly  
18 compensation corresponding Salary Grade Twenty-six (26) as prescribed under  
19 Republic Act No. 6758, otherwise known as the "Compensation and Position  
20 Classification Act of 1989", as amended, and the implementing guidelines issued  
21 pursuant thereto.

22  
23 b. The City Vice Mayor Shall:

- 24 1. Act as the presiding officer of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and sign  
25 all warrants drawn on the City Treasury for all expenditures  
26 appropriated for the operations of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*;  
27 2. Subject to civil service law, rules and regulations, appoint all officials  
28 and employees of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, except those who  
29 manner of appointment is specifically provided under the Local  
30 Government Code of 1991, as amended;  
31 3. Assume the office of the City Mayor for the unexpired term of the latter  
32 in the event of the permanent vacancy;  
33 4. Exercise the powers and perform the duties functions of the city Mayor  
34 in case of temporary vacancy; and  
35 5. Perform other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
36 provided for under Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the  
37 Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.

40 **CHAPTER IV**  
41 **THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD**

42  
43 **SEC. 10. Composition.** – a. The *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, the legislative body  
44 of the City, shall be composed of the City Vice Mayor as presiding officer, the ten (10)

1 Sanggunian members, the President of the City Chapter of the Liga ng mga Barangay,  
2 the President of the Panlungsod na Pederasyon ng mga Sangguniang Kabataan and  
3 the three (3) sectoral representatives, who shall come from the following sectors, as  
4 members; one (1) from the women sector; and, as shall be determined by the  
5 Sangguniang Panlungsod within the ninety (90) days prior to the holding of local  
6 elections; one (1) from the agricultural or industrial workers sector; and one (1) from  
7 the other sectors, including urban poor, indigenous cultural communities or persons  
8 with disabilities (PWDs).

9  
10 b. The regular members of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and the Sectoral  
11 Representatives shall be elected in the manner as may be provided by law.

12  
13 c. The members of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall receive a minimum monthly  
14 compensation corresponding to Salary Grade Twenty-five (25) as prescribed  
15 under the "Compensation and Position Classification Act of 1989", as amended,  
16 and the implementing guidelines issued pursuant thereto.

17  
18 **SEC. 11. Powers, Duties, Functions and Compensation.** – The *Sangguniang*  
19 *Panlungsod*, as a legislative body of the City, shall enact ordinances, approve  
20 resolutions and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the City and its inhabitants  
21 pursuant to Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and in the  
22 proper exercise of the corporate powers of the City as provided under Section 23 of  
23 the Local Government Code of 199, as amended and shall:

24  
25 a. Approve ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an efficient and effective  
26 city government and in this connection shall:

27 1. Review all ordinances approved by the *Sangguniang Barangay* and Executive  
28 Orders issued by the *Punong Barangay* to determine whether these are within  
29 the scope of the prescribed powers of the *Sangguniang Barangay* and of the  
30 *Punong Barangay*;

31 2. Maintain peace and order by enacting measure to prevent and suppress  
32 lawlessness, disorder, riot, violence, rebellion or sedition and impose penalties  
33 for the violation of said ordinances;

34 3. Approve ordinances imposing a fine not exceeding five thousand pesos (P  
35 5,000.00) or an imprisonment for a period not exceeding one (1) year, or both  
36 at the discretion of the court, for violation of a city ordinance;

37 4. Adopt measure to protect the inhabitants of the City on the harmful effects of  
38 man-made or natural disasters and calamities, and to provide relief services and  
39 assistance for victims during and in the aftermath of said disasters or calamities  
40 and in their return to productive livelihood following said events;

41 5. Enact ordinances intended to prevent, suppress and impose appropriate  
42 penalties for habitual drunkenness in public places, vagrancy, mendicancy,  
43 prostitution, establishment and maintenance of houses of ill repute, gambling  
44 and other prohibited games if chance, fraudulent devices and ways to obtain

1 money or property, drug addiction, maintenance of drug dens, drug pushing,  
2 juvenile delinquency, the printing or distribution or exhibition of obscene or  
3 pornographic materials or publications, and such other activities inimical to the  
4 welfare and morals of the inhabitants of the City;

5 6. Protect the environment and impose appropriate penalties for acts which  
6 endanger the environment, such as dynamite fishing and other forms of  
7 destructive fishing, illegal logging, smuggling of logs, smuggling of natural  
8 resources products and of endangered species of flora and fauna, slash-and-  
9 burn farming and such other activities which result in pollution, acceleration of  
10 eutrophication of rivers and lakes or of ecological imbalance;

11 7. Subject to the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended  
12 and the pertinent laws, determine the powers and duties of officials and  
13 employees of the City;

14 8. Determine the positions and the salaries, wages, allowances and other  
15 emoluments and benefits of officials and employees paid wholly or mainly from  
16 city funds and provide expenditures necessary for the proper conduct of  
17 programs, projects, services and activities of the city government

18 9. Authorize the payment of compensation to a qualified person not in the  
19 government service who fills up a temporary vacancy or grant honorarium to  
20 any qualified official or employee designated to fill a temporary vacancy in a  
21 concurrent capacity at the rate authorized by law;

22 10. Provide a mechanism and appropriate funds thereof, to ensure the safety and  
23 protection of all city government property, public documents, or records such as  
24 those relating to property inventory, land ownership, record of births marriages,  
25 deaths, assessments, taxation, accounts, business permits and such other  
26 records and documents of public interest in the offices and departments of the  
27 city government;

28 11. When the finances of the city government allow, provide for additional  
29 allowances and other benefits to judges, prosecutors, public elementary and  
30 high school teachers, and other national government officials stationed in or  
31 assigned to the City;

32 12. Provide legal assistance to Barangay officials, who, in the performance of their  
33 official duties or on the occasion thereof, have to initiate judicial proceedings or  
34 defend themselves against legal actions; and

35 13. Provide for a group insurance or additional insurance coverage for all officials,  
36 including members of *barangay tanod* brigaders and other service units, with  
37 public or private insurance companies, when the finances of the city government  
38 allows said coverage.

39  
40 b. Generate and maximize the use of resources and revenues for the development  
41 plans, program objectives and priorities of the City, with particular attention to  
42 agro-industrial development and city-wide growth and progress, relative thereto,  
43 shall:



- 1 1. Approve the annual and supplemental budgets of the city government and  
2 appropriate funds for specific programs, projects, services and activities of  
3 the City, or for other purposes not contrary to law in order to promote the  
4 general welfare of the City and its inhabitants;
- 5 2. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991,  
6 as amended, and other applicable laws and upon majority vote of all the  
7 members of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, enact ordinances levying taxes,  
8 fees and charges, prescribing the rates thereof for general and specific  
9 purposes and granting tax exemption, incentive or reliefs;
- 10 3. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991,  
11 as amended, and upon the majority vote of all the members of the  
12 *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, authorize the City Mayor to negotiate and contact  
13 loans and other forms of indebtedness;
- 14 4. Subject to the provisions of Book of the Local Government code of 1991, as  
15 amended, and applicable laws and upon the majority vote of all the members  
16 of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, enact ordinances authoring the floating of  
17 bonds and other instrument of indebtedness, for the purpose of raising funds  
18 to finance development projects;
- 19 5. Approprate funds for the construction and maintenance or rental of buildings  
20 for the use of the City; and upon the majority vote of all the members of the  
21 *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, authorize the City Mayor to lease to private parties  
22 such as buildings held in a propriety capacity, subject to existing laws, rules  
23 and regulations;
- 24 6. Prescribe reasonable limits and restraints on the use of property within the  
25 jurisdiction of the City;
- 26 7. Adopt a comprehensive land use plan for the City and ensure that the  
27 formulation, adoption or modification of the said plan shall be in coordination  
28 with the approved provincial comprehensive land-use plan;
- 29 8. Reclassify land within the jurisdiction of the City subject to pertinent  
30 provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;
- 31 9. Enact integrated zoning ordinances in consonance with the approved  
32 comprehensive land-use plan, subject existing laws, rules and regulations,  
33 establish fire limits or zones, particularly in populous centers, and regulate  
34 the construction, repair or modification of buildings within said fire limits or  
35 zones in accordance with the provisions of the Fire Code of the Philippines;
- 36 10. Subject to national law, process and approve subdivision plans for residential,  
37 commercial or industrial purposes and other development purposes, and to  
38 collect processing fees and other charges, the proceeds of which shall accrue  
39 entirely to the City; Provided, however, That where the approval of a national  
40 agency or office is required, said approval shall not be withheld for more than  
41 thirty (30) days from receipt of application. Failure to act on the application  
42 within the period stated shall be deemed as approved thereof;
- 43 11. Subject to the provision of Book II of the "Local Government Code of 1991",  
44 as amended, grant exclusive privilege of constructing fish corrals or fish pens,



- 1 or taking or catching of bangus fry, prawn fry or *kawag-kawag*, or fry of any  
2 species or fish within city waters;
- 3 12. With the concurrence of at least two (2/3) of all the members of the  
4 *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, grant tax exemptions, incentives or relief to  
5 entities engaged in community growth-inducing industries, subject the  
6 provisions of the "Local Government Code of 199", as amended;
- 7 13. Grant loans or provide grants to other local government units or to national,  
8 provincial and city charitable, benevolent or educational institutions;  
9 *Provided*, That said institutions are operated and maintained within the City;
- 10 14. Regulate the numbering of residential, commercial and other building; and  
11 15. Regulate inspection, weighing and measuring articles of commerce

- 12
- 13 c. Subject to the provisions of Book II of the "Local Government Code of 1991", as  
14 amended, enact ordinances granting franchises and authorizing the issuance of  
15 permits or licenses, upon such conditions and for purposes intended to promote  
16 the general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and pursuant to this legislative  
17 authority, shall;
- 18 1. Fix and impose reasonable fees and charges for all services rendered by the  
19 city government to private persons or entities;
- 20 2. Regulate or fix license fees for any business or practice of profession within  
21 the City and the conditions under which the license for the said business or  
22 practice of profession may be revoked and enact ordinances levying taxes  
23 thereon;
- 24 3. Provide for and set terms and conditions under which public utilities owned  
25 by the City shall be operated by the city government, and prescribe the  
26 conditions under which the same may be leased to private persons or  
27 entities, preferably cooperatives;
- 28 4. Regulate the display of and fix the license fees for signs and signboards or  
29 billboards at the place or places where the profession or business advertised  
30 thereby is, in whole or in part, conducted;
- 31 5. Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, authorize and license the  
32 establishment, operation and maintenance of cockpits, and regulate cock  
33 fighting and commercial breeding of gamecocks: *Provided*, That the existing  
34 rights should not be prejudiced;
- 35 6. Subject to the guidelines prescribed by the Department of Transportation  
36 (DOTr), regulate the operation of tricycles and grant franchises for the  
37 operation thereof within the territorial jurisdiction of the City; and
- 38 7. Upon approval by a majority vote of all the members if the *Sangguniang*  
39 *Panlungsod*, grant franchise to any person, partnership, corporation, or  
40 cooperatives to do business within the City; establish, construct, operate and  
41 maintain ferries, wharves, markets or slaughterhouses; or undertake such  
42 other activities within the City as may be allowed by existing laws; *Provided*,  
43 That cooperatives shall be given preference in the grant of such franchise.
- 44

- 1 d. Regulate activities relative to the use of land, buildings and structures within the  
2 City in order to promote the general welfare and for the said purpose, shall:  
3  
4 1. Declare, prevent or abate any nuisances;  
5 2. Require that buildings and the premises thereof and any land within the City  
6 be kept and maintained in a sanitary condition; impose penalties for any  
7 violation thereof; or upon failure to comply with said requirement, have the  
8 work done at the expense of the owner, administrator or tenant concerned  
9 require the filling up of any land or premises to a grade necessary for proper  
10 sanitation;  
11 3. Regulate the disposal of clinical and other wastes from hospitals, clinics and  
12 other similar establishments;  
13 4. Regulate the disposal of clinical and other wastes from hospitals, clinic and  
14 other similar establishments;  
15 5. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of cafes,  
16 restaurants, beerhouses, hotels, motels, inns, pension houses, lodging  
17 houses and other similar establishments,  
18 6. Regulate the sale, giving away or dispensing of any intoxication malt, vino,  
19 mixed or fermented liquor at any retail outlet;  
20 7. Regulate the establishment and provide for the inspection of steam boilers  
21 or any heating devise in buildings and the storage of inflammable and highly  
22 combustible materials within the City;  
23 8. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of any  
24 entertainment or amusement facility, including the theatrical performances,  
25 circuses, billiard pools, public dancing schools, public dance halls, sauna  
26 baths, massage parlors and other places for entertainment or amusement or  
27 entertainment, particularly those which tend to disturb the community or  
28 annoy the inhabitants, or require the suspension or suppression of the same;  
29 or prohibit certain forms of amusement or entertainment in order to protect  
30 the social and moral welfare of the community;  
31 9. Regulate the establishment, operation and maintenance of funeral parlors  
32 and the burial or cremation of the dead, subject to existing laws, rules and  
33 regulations; and  
34 10. Provide for the impounding of stray animals; regulate the keeping of animals  
35 in homes or as part of business, and the slaughter, sale or disposition of the  
36 same; and adopt measures to prevent or penalize cruelty to animals;  
37  
38 e. Approve ordinances which shall ensure the efficient and effective delivery of the  
39 basic services and facilities as provided for under the "Local Government Code  
40 of 1991", as amended, and in addition to said services and facilities, shall:  
41 1. Provide for the establishment, maintenance, protection and conservation of  
42 communal forest and watersheds, tree parks, greenbelts, mangroves and  
43 other similar forest development projects;

- 1           2. Establish markets, slaughterhouses or animal corrals and authorize the  
2           operation thereof by the city government; and regulate the construction and  
3           operation of private markets, *talipapas* or other similar buildings and  
4           structures;
- 5           3. Authorize the establishment, maintenance and operation by the city  
6           government of ferries, wharves, and other structures intended to accelerate  
7           productivity related to marine life in the preservation thereof;
- 8           4. Regulate the preparation and sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, fruits,  
9           fresh dairy products, and other food stuffs for public consumption;
- 10          5. Regulate the use of streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, parks and other  
11          public places and approve the construction, improvement, repair and  
12          maintenance of the same; establish bus and vehicle stops and terminals or  
13          regulate the use of the same by privately-owned vehicles which serve the  
14          public; regulate garages and operation of conveyances for hire; designate  
15          stands to be occupied by public vehicles when not in use; regulate putting  
16          up of signs, signposts, awnings and awning posts in the streets; and provide  
17          for the lighting, cleaning and sprinkling of streets and public places;
- 18          6. Regulate traffic on all streets and bridges; prohibit encroachments or  
19          obstacles thereon and, when necessary, in the interest of public welfare,  
20          authorize the removal of encroachments and illegal constructions in public  
21          places;
- 22          7. Subject to existing laws, establish and provide for the maintenance, repair  
23          and operation of an efficient waterworks system to supply water for the City's  
24          inhabitants and to purify the source of the water supply; regulate the  
25          construction, maintenance, repair and use of hydrants, pumps, cisterns and  
26          reservoirs; protect the purity and quantity of the water supply of the City  
27          and, for this purpose, extend the coverage of appropriate ordinances over all  
28          territory within the drainage area of the said water supply and within one  
29          hundred meters (100 m.) of the reservoir, canal, conduit, aqueduct, pumping  
30          station, or watershed used in connection with the water service; and regulate  
31          the consumption, use or wastage of water and fix and collect charges  
32          thereof;
- 33          8. Regulate the drilling and excavation of the ground for the laying of water,  
34          gas, sewer, and other pipes and the construction, repair and maintenance of  
35          public drains, sewers, cesspools, tunnels and similar structures; regulate the  
36          placing of poles and the use of crosswalks, curbs and gutters; adopt  
37          measures to ensure public safety against open canals, manholes, lives wires  
38          and other similar hazards to life and property; and regulate the construction  
39          and use of water closets, privies and other similar structures in buildings and  
40          homes;
- 41          9. Regulate the placing, stringing, attaching, installing, repair and construction  
42          of all gas mains, electric telegraph and telephone wires, conduits, meters and  
43          other apparatus; and provide for the correction, condemnation or removal of  
44          the same when found to be dangerous to the welfare of City's inhabitants;



- 1 10. Subject to the availability of fund and the existing laws, rules, and  
2 regulations, establish and provide for the operation of vocational and  
3 technical schools and similar post-secondary institutions and, with the  
4 approval of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority  
5 (TESDA) and subject to existing laws on tuition fees, fix and collect  
6 reasonable tuition fees and other school charges in educational institutions  
7 supported by the city government;  
8 11. Establish a scholarship fund for poor but deserving students in schools  
9 located within its jurisdiction or for students residing within the City;  
10 12. Approve measures and adopt quarantine regulations to prevent the  
11 introduction and spread of diseases;  
12 13. Provide for an efficient and effective system of solid waste and garbage  
13 collection and disposal and prohibit littering and the placing or throwing of  
14 garbage, refuse and other filth wastes;  
15 14. Provide for the care of PWSs, paupers, the elderly, the sick persons of  
16 unsound mind, abandoned minors, juvenile delinquents, drug dependents,  
17 abused children and the youth below eighteen (18) years of age and, subject  
18 to the availability of funds, establish and provide for the operation of centers  
19 and facilities for the said needy and disadvantaged persons;  
20 15. Establish and provide for the maintenance and improvement of jails and  
21 detention centers, institute a sound jail management program, and  
22 appropriate funds for the subsistence of detainees and convicted prisoners  
23 in the City;  
24 16. Establish a city council whose purpose is the promotion of culture and the  
25 arts, coordinate with government agencies and non-government  
26 organizations and, subject to the availability of funds, appropriate funds for  
27 the support and development of the same; and  
28 17. Establish a city council for the elderly and senior citizen which shall formulate  
29 policies and adopt measure mutually beneficial to the elderly and to the  
30 community; provide incentive for non-governmental entities and, subject to  
31 the availability of funds, appropriate funds to support programs and projects  
32 for the benefit of the elderly.  
33  
34 f. Perform other duties and functions and exercise such powers as provided for  
35 under Republic Act No. 7160, as amended, and those that are prescribed by law  
36 or ordinance.  
37  
38

39 **CHAPTER V**  
40 **PROCESS OF LEGISLATION**  
41

42 **SEC. 12. Internal Rules of Procedure.** – a. On the First Regular session following  
43 the election of its members and within ninety (90) days thereafter, the *Sangguniang*  
44 *Panlungsod* shall adopt or update its existing Rules of Procedure.



1  
2 b. The Rules of Procedure shall provide the following:

- 3 1. The organization of the *Sanggunian* and the election of its officers as well as  
4 the creation of standing committees which shall include, but shall not be  
5 limited to , the committees on appropriations, revenues, engineering and  
6 public works, education and health, women and family, human rights, youth  
7 and sports development, environmental protection, peace and order and  
8 traffic, and cooperatives; the general jurisdiction of each committee; and the  
9 election of the chairperson and members of each committee;  
10 2. The order and calendar of business of each session;  
11 3. The legislative process;  
12 4. The parliamentary procedures which include the conduct of members during  
13 sessions;  
14 5. The discipline of members for disorderly behavior and absences without  
15 justifiable cause for four (4) consecutive sessions for which they may be  
16 censured, reprimanded, or excluded from the session, suspended for not  
17 more than sixty (60) days, or expelled. *Provided*, That the penalty of  
18 suspension or expulsion shall require the concurrence of at least two thirds  
19 (2/3) vote of all the *Sanggunian* members; *Provided, further*, That the  
20 member convicted by final judgment to imprisonment or at least one (1) year  
21 for any crime involving moral turpitude shall be automatically expelled from  
22 the *Sanggunian*; and  
23 6. Such other rules as the *Sanggunian* may adopt.

24  
25 **SEC. 13. Full Disclosure of Financial and Business Interest of Sangguniang**  
26 *Panlungsod Members.* – (a) Every *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member shall, upon  
27 assumption to office, make full of his business and financial interests. They shall also  
28 disclose any business, financial, professional relationship or any relation by affinity or  
29 consanguinity within the fourth civil degree with any person, firm or entity affected by  
30 any ordinance or resolution under consideration by the *Sanggunian*, *which* relationship  
31 may result in conflict of interests. Such relationship shall include:

- 32 1. Ownership of stock or capital, or investment in the entity or firm to which  
33 the ordinance or resolution may apply; and  
34 2. Contracts or agreements with any person or entity which the ordinance or  
35 resolution under consideration may affect.

36 In the absence of a specific constitutional or statutory provisions applicable to  
37 this situation of a specific constitutional or statutory provisions applicable to this  
38 situation, "conflict of interest" refers, in general, to one where it may be  
39 reasonably deduced that a member of the *Sanggunian* may not act in the public  
40 interest due to some private, pecuniary or other personal considerations that  
41 may affect the exercise of judgment to the prejudice of the service or the public.

- 42  
43 b. The disclosure required under this Act shall be made in writing and shall be  
44 submitted to the Secretary of the *Sanggunian* or the secretary of the committee

1 of membership. The disclosure shall, in all cases, form part of the record of the  
2 proceedings and shall be made in the following manner:

- 3 1. The disclosure shall be made before the member participates in the deliberations  
4 on the ordinance or resolution under consideration: *Provided*, That if the member  
5 did not participate during the deliberations, the disclosure shall be made before the  
6 voting on the ordinance or resolution on second and third readings; and  
7 2. Disclosure shall be made when a member takes a position or makes a privilege  
8 speech on a matter that may affect the business interest, financial connection, or  
9 professional relationship described herein.

10  
11 **SEC. 14. Sessions.** – (a) On the first day of the session immediately following  
12 the election of its members, the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall, by resolution, fix the  
13 day, time and place of its sessions. The minimum number of regular sessions shall be  
14 once a week for the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and twice a month for the *Sangguniang*  
15 *Barangay*.

16  
17 b. When the public interest so demands, special sessions may be called  
18 by the City Mayor or by a majority of the members of the Sanggunian.

19  
20 c. All Sanggunian sessions shall be open to the public unless a closed-  
21 door session is ordered by an affirmative vote of a majority of the  
22 members present, there being a quorum, in the public interest or for  
23 reasons of security, decency or morality. No two (2) sessions, regular  
24 or special may be held in a single day.

25  
26 d. In the case of special sessions of the Sanggunian, a written notice to  
27 the members shall be served personally at the members' usual place  
28 of residence at least twenty-four (24) hours before the special session  
29 is held.

30  
31 Unless otherwise concurred in by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the  
32 Sanggunian members present, there being a quorum, no other  
33 matters may be considered at a special session except those stated in  
34 the notice.

35  
36 e. The Sanggunian Panlungsod shall keep a journal and record of its  
37 proceedings, which may be published upon resolution of the majority  
38 of the members.

39  
40 **SEC. 15. Quorum.** – a. A majority of all the members of the Sanggunian who  
41 have been elected and qualified shall constitute a quorum to transact official business.  
42 Should a question of quorum be raised during a session, the presiding officer shall  
43 immediately proceed to call the roll of members and thereafter announce the results.  
44

1 b. Where there is no quorum, the presiding officer may declare a recess until such  
2 time as a quorum is constituted, or a majority of the members present may  
3 adjourn from day to day and may compel the immediate attendance of any  
4 member absent without justifiable cause by designating a member of the  
5 Sanggunian to be assisted by a member or members of the police force assigned  
6 in the territorial jurisdiction of the City of La Trinidad, to arrest the absent  
7 member and present him at the session.

8  
9 c. If there is still no quorum despite the enforcement of the immediately preceding  
10 subsection, no business shall be transacted. The presiding officer, upon proper  
11 motion duly approved by the members present, shall then declare the session  
12 adjourned for lack of quorum.

13  
14 **SEC. 16. Approval of Ordinances.** – a. Every ordinance enacted by the  
15 *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall be presented to the City Mayor. If the City Mayor  
16 approves the same, the signature shall be affixed on each and every page thereof;  
17 otherwise, he shall veto it and return the same with his objections to the Sanggunian,  
18 which may proceed to reconsider the same. The Sanggunian may override the veto of  
19 the City Mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all its members, thereby making the  
20 ordinance or resolution effective for all legal intents and purposes.

21  
22 b. The veto shall be communicated by the City Mayor to the Sanggunian within ten  
23 (10) days, otherwise, the ordinance shall be deemed approved as if it had been.

24  
25 **SEC. 17. Veto Power of the City Mayor.** – a. The City Mayor may veto any  
26 ordinance of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* on the ground that it is ultra vires or  
27 prejudicial to the public welfare, stating his reasons thereof in writing.

28  
29 b. The City Mayor shall have the power to veto any particular item or items of an  
30 appropriations ordinance, an ordinance or resolution adopting a local  
31 development plan, any public investment program or an ordinance directing the  
32 payment of money or creating liability. In such case, the vetoed item or items  
33 shall not affect the item or items which are not objected to. The vetoed item or  
34 items shall not take effect unless the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* overrides the  
35 veto in the manner herein provided; otherwise, the item or items in the  
36 appropriations ordinance of the previous year corresponding to those vetoed, if  
37 any, shall be deemed enacted.

38  
39 c. The City Mayor may veto an ordinance or resolution only once. The Sanggunian  
40 may override the veto of the City Mayor by two-thirds (2/3) vote of all its  
41 members, thereby making the ordinance effective without the approval of the  
42 City Mayor.



1           **SEC. 18. Review of City Ordinance by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.** – (a)  
2     Within three (3) days after the approval, the Secretary to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
3     shall forward to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for review, copies of the approved  
4     ordinances and the resolutions approving the local development plans and public  
5     investment programs formulated by the local development councils.

6  
7           (b) Within thirty (30) days after receipt of copies of such ordinances and  
8     resolutions, the *Sangguniang Panlalawigan* shall examine the documents or transmit  
9     them to the provincial attorney or provincial prosecutor for prompt examination. The  
10    provincial attorney or the provincial prosecutor shall, within a period of ten (10) days  
11    from receipt of the documents, inform the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in writing of his  
12    comments and recommendations., which may be considered by the Sangguniang  
13    Panlalawigan in making its decision.

14  
15          (c) If the *Sangguniang Panlalawigan* finds that such an ordinance or resolution  
16    is beyond the power conferred upon *the Sangguniang Panlungsod* concerned, it shall  
17    declare such ordinance or resolution invalid in whole or in part. The *Sangguniang*  
18    *Panlalawigan* shall enter its action in the minutes and shall advise the corresponding  
19    city authorities of the action it has taken.

20  
21          (d) If no action has been taken by the *Sangguniang Panlalawigan* within thirty  
22    (30) days after submission of such an ordinance or resolution, the same shall be  
23    presumed consistent with law and therefor valid.

24  
25           **SEC. 19. Review of Barangay Ordinances by the Sangguniang Panlungsod.** –  
26    (a) Within ten (10) days after its enactment, the Sangguniang Barangay shall furnish  
27    copies of all barangay ordinances to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* for review as to  
28    whether the ordinances are consistent with law or city ordinances.

29  
30          (b) If the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* fails to take action on barangay ordinances  
31    within thirty (30) days from receipt thereof, the same shall be deemed approved.

32  
33          (c) If the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* finds a barangay ordinance inconsistent with  
34    law or city ordinances, the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall, within thirty (30) days from  
35    receipt thereof, return the same with its comments and recommendations to the  
36    Sangguniang Barangay concerned for adjustment, amendment or modification; in  
37    which case, the effectivity of the barangay ordinance is suspended until such time as  
38    the revision called for is effected.

39  
40           **SEC. 20. Enforcement of Disapproved Ordinances or Resolutions.** – Any attempt  
41    to enforce any ordinance or any resolution approving the local development plan and  
42    public investment program, after the disapproval thereof, shall be sufficient ground for  
43    the suspension or dismissal of the official or employee concerned.



1           **SEC. 21. Effectivity of Ordinances or Resolutions.** – (a) Unless otherwise stated  
2 in the ordinance or the resolution approving the local development plan and public  
3 investment program, the same shall take effect after ten (10) days from the date a  
4 copy thereof is posted in a bulletin board at the entrance of the city hall of La Trinidad,  
5 and in at least two (2) other conspicuous places in the City of La Trinidad not later than  
6 five (5) days after approval thereof.

7  
8           (b) The Secretary of the *Sanggunian Panlungsod* shall cause the posting of an  
9 ordinance or resolution in the bulletin board at the entrance of the city hall and in at  
10 least two (2) conspicuous places in the City not later than five (5) days after the  
11 approval thereof. The text of the ordinance or resolution shall be disseminated and  
12 posted in Filipino or English and the Secretary of the *Sanggunian Panlungsod* shall  
13 record such fact in a book kept for the purpose, stating the dates of approval and  
14 posting.

15  
16           (c) The main feature of the ordinance or resolution duly enacted or adopted  
17 shall, in addition to being posted, be published once in a local newspaper of general  
18 circulation within the City: *Provided*, That in the absence thereof, the ordinance or  
19 resolution shall be published in any newspaper or general circulation: *Provided*, further,  
20 That the gist of all ordinances with penal sanctions shall also be published in a  
21 newspaper of general circulation.

22  
23  
24                                   **CHAPTER VI**  
25                                   **DISQUALIFICATION AND SUCCESSION FOR**  
26                                   **ELECTIVE CITY OFFICIALS**

27  
28           **SEC. 22. Disqualifications for Elective Public City Officials.** – The following  
29 persons are not qualified from running for any elective position in the City:

- 30  
31           a. Those sentenced by final judgment for an offense involving moral  
32 turpitude or an offense punishable by one (1) year or more of  
33 imprisonment within two (2) years after serving the sentence;  
34           b. Those removed from office as a result of an administrative case;  
35           c. Those convicted by final judgment for violating the oath of allegiance  
36 to the Republic of the Philippines;  
37           d. Those with dual citizenship;  
38           e. Fugitives from justice in criminal or nonpolitical cases here and  
39 abroad;  
40           f. Permanent residents in a foreign country or those who have acquired  
41 the right to reside abroad and continue to avail of the same right after  
42 the effectivity of the Local Government Code of 199, as amended; and  
43           g. The insane and feeble-minded.  
44

1           **SEC. 23. Permanent Vacancy in the Office of the City Mayor and City Vice Mayor.**

2   – (a) If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the City Mayor, the City Vice Mayor  
3 concerned shall become the City Mayor. If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of  
4 the City Vice Mayor, the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member or, in a case  
5 of his or her permanent incapacity, the second highest ranking *Sangguniang*  
6 *Panlungsod* member becomes the City Mayor or the City Vice Mayor, as the case may  
7 be. Subsequent vacancies in the said offices shall be filled automatically by the other  
8 *Sanggunian* members according to their ranking as defined herein

9  
10           (b) If a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of the Punong Barangay, the  
11 highest ranking *Sangguniang* Barangay member or, in case of his or her permanent  
12 incapacity, the second highest ranking *Sanggunian* member shall become the Punong  
13 Barangay.

14  
15           (c) A tie between or among the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
16 members shall be resolved by drawing of lots.

17  
18           (d) The successor as defined herein shall serve only the unexpired terms of their  
19 predecessors.

20  
21           (e) For purposes of this Act, a permanent vacancy arises when an elective local  
22 official fills a higher vacant office, refuses to assume office, fails to qualify, dies, is  
23 removed from office, voluntarily resigns or is otherwise permanently incapacitated to  
24 discharge the functions of his or her office.

25  
26           (f) For purposes of succession as provided in this Act, ranking in the *Sanggunian*  
27 shall be determined on the basis of proportion of votes obtained by each winning  
28 candidate to the total number of registered voters in the City immediately preceding  
29 local election.

30  
31           **SEC. 24. Permanent Vacancies in the Sanggunian Panlungsod.** – Permanent  
32 vacancies in the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* where automatic succession as provided  
33 above does not apply shall be filled by appointments in the following manner:

34           (a) The Provincial Governor shall make the aforesaid appointments;

35  
36           (b) Only the nominee of the political party under which the *Sanggunian* member  
37 concerned had been elected shall be appointed in the manner herein provided. The  
38 appointee shall come from the same political party as that of the *Sanggunian* member  
39 who caused the vacancy and shall serve the unexpired term of the vacant office.  
40

41  
42           In the appointment herein mentioned, a nomination and a certificate of  
43 membership of the appointee from the highest official of the political party concerned  
44 are conditions sine qua non, and in any appointment without such nomination and

1 certification shall be null and void *ab initio* and shall be a ground for administrative  
2 action against the official responsible therefor;

3  
4 (c) In case the permanent vacancy is caused by a *Sangguniang* member who  
5 does not belong to any political party, the City Mayor shall, upon recommendation of  
6 the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy; and

7  
8 (d) In case of vacancy in the representation of the youth and the barangay in  
9 the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, said vacancy shall be filled automatically by the official  
10 next-in-rank of the *Sangguniang Kabataan* or barangay concerned.

11  
12 **SEC. 25. Temporary Vacancy in the Office of the City Mayor.** – (a) When the  
13 City Mayor is temporarily incapacitated to perform his duties for physical or legal  
14 reasons, including leave of absence, travel abroad and suspension from office, the City  
15 Vice Mayor of the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member shall automatically  
16 exercise the powers and perform the duties and functions of the City Mayor, except the  
17 power to appoint, suspend, or dismiss employees which only be exercised if the period  
18 of temporary incapacity exceeds thirty (30) working days.

19  
20 (b) Said temporary incapacity shall terminate upon submission the *Sangguniang*  
21 *Panlungsod* of a written declaration by the City Mayor of having reported back to office.  
22 In case where the temporary incapacity is due to legal cause, the City Mayor shall also  
23 submit necessary documents showing the said legal cause no longer exist.

24  
25 (c) When the City Mayor is travelling within the country but outside CLLA OL  
26 territorial jurisdiction for a period not exceeding three (3) consecutive BEGNE days, the  
27 City Mayor may designate in writing the officer-in-charge of the office. The  
28 authorization shall specify the powers and functions that the local official concerned  
29 shall exercise in the absence of the City Mayor, except the power to appoint, suspend  
30 or dismiss employees.

31  
32 (d) In the event, however, that the City Mayor fails or refuses to issue such  
33 authorization, the City Vice Mayor or the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
34 member shall have the right to assume the powers, duties and functions of the office  
35 on the fourth (4th) day of absence of the City Mayor, subject to the limitations provided  
36 in subsection (c) hereof.

37  
38 (e). Except as provided above, the City Mayor shall, in no case, authorize any  
39 local official to assume the powers, duties and functions of the office, other than the  
40 City Vice Mayor or the highest ranking *Sangguniang Panlungsod* member, as the case  
41 may be.



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**CHAPTER VII**  
**THE APPOINTIVE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY**

**SEC. 26.** *The Secretary of the Sangguniang Panlungsod.* – (a) There shall be a secretary of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* who shall be a career official with the rank and salary equal to a head of a department or office.

(b) No person shall be appointed secretary to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* unless one is a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in law, commerce or public administration from a recognized college or university, and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent.

(c) The secretary to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall receive compensation, emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

(d) The secretary to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* shall take charge of the office of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, and shall:

(1) Attend meetings of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and keep a journal of its proceedings;

(2) Keep the seal of the City and affix it with one's signature to all ordinances, resolutions, and other official acts of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and present these for signature to the pre presiding officer;

(3) Forward to the City Mayor for approval, copies of ordinances enacted by the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and duly certified by the presiding officer in a manner provided in Section 54 of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;

(4) Forward to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) copies of the appropriations ordinance passed by the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* as provided under Section 326, Book II of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;

(5) Forward to the *Sangguniang Panlalawigan* copies of duly approved ordinances in the manner provided in Section 56 and 57 of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;

(6) Furnish, upon requests of any interested party, certified copies of records of public character in one's custody, upon payment to the City Treasurer of such fees as may be prescribed by ordinance;

(7) Record in a book kept for the purpose, all ordinances and resolutions enacted or adopted by the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*, with the dates of passage and publication thereof;

(8) Keep in the office all nonconfidential records therein open to the public during usual business hours;

(9) Translate into the dialect used by the majority of the inhabitants all ordinances and resolutions immediately after their approval and cause their publication together with the original version in the manner provided under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;



1 (10) Take custody of the local archives and where applicable, the local library  
2 and annually account for the same; and

3 (11) Perform other duties and function and exercise such other powers as  
4 provided under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those  
5 that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

6  
7 **SEC. 27. *The City Treasurer.*** – (a) The City Treasurer shall be appointed by the  
8 Secretary of the Department of Finance (DOF) from a list of at least three (3) ranking  
9 eligible recommends of the City Mayor, subject to the civil service law, rules and  
10 regulations.

11  
12 (b) The City Treasurer shall be under the administrative supervision of the City  
13 Mayor whom one shall report regularly on the tax collection effort of the City.

14  
15 (c) No person shall be appointed Treasurer unless he is a citizen of the  
16 Philippines, a resident of the City of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of  
17 a college degree in commerce, public administration or law obtained from a recognized  
18 college or university and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent and must  
19 have acquired experience in treasury or accounting service for at least five (5) years.

20  
21 (d) The City Treasurer shall receive compensation, emoluments and allowances  
22 as may be determined by law.

23  
24 (e) The City treasurer shall take charge of the City Finance Department, and  
25 shall:

- 26 1) Advise the City Mayor, the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and other local government  
27 and national officials concerned regarding disposition of local government funds  
28 on such other matters relative to public finance;
- 29 2) Take custody of and exercise proper management of the funds of the City;
- 30 3) Take charge of the disbursement of all funds of the City and other funds, the  
31 custody of which has been entrusted by law or other competent authority;
- 32 4) Inspect private commercial and industrial establishments within the jurisdiction  
33 of the City in relation to the implementation of tax ordinances pursuant to the  
34 provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended;
- 35 5) Maintain and update the tax information system of the City; and
- 36 6) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
37 provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those  
38 that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

39  
40 **SEC. 28. *The City Assessor.*** – (a) The City Assessor must be a citizen of the  
41 Philippines, a resident of the City of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of  
42 a college degree preferably in civil or mechanical engineering, commerce, or any other  
43 related course from a recognized college or university, and a first grade eligible or its  
44 equivalent and must have acquired experience in real property assessment work or in

1 any related field for at least five (5) years immediately preceding the date of  
2 appointment.

3  
4 (b) The City Assessor shall receive such compensation, emoluments and  
5 allowances as may be determined by law.

6  
7 (c) The City Assessor shall take charge of the City Assessor's Department, and  
8 shall"

9 (1) Ensure that all laws and policies governing the appraisal and assessment of  
10 real properties for taxation are properly executed;

11 (2) Initiate, review and recommend changes in policies and objectives, plans  
12 and programs, techniques, procedures and practices in the evaluation and  
13 assessment of real properties for taxation purposes;

14 (3) Establish a systematic method of real property assessment;

15 (4) Install and maintain a real property identification and accounting systems;

16 (5) Prepare, install and maintain a system of tax mapping, showing graphically  
17 all properties subject to assessment and gather all data concerning the same;

18 (6) Conduct frequent physical surveys to verify and determine whether all real  
19 properties with the City are properly listed in assessment of rolls;

20 (7) Exercise the functions of appraisal and assessment primarily for taxation  
21 purposes of all real properties in the City;

22 (8) Prepare a schedule of the fair market value of the different classes of real  
23 properties in accordance with the provisions of Local Government Code of 1991,  
24 as amended;

25 (9) Issue, upon request of any interested party, certified copies of assessment  
26 records of real properties on all other records relative to its assessment, upon  
27 payment of as service charge or fee to the City Treasurer;

28 (10) Submit every semester a report of all assessments, as well as cancellations  
29 and modifications of assessments to the City Mayor and the *Sangguniang*  
30 *Panlungsod*; and

31 (11) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
32 provided for under Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local  
33 Government Code of 1991", as amended, and those that are prescribed by law  
34 or ordinance.

35  
36 **SEC. 29. The City Accountant.** – (a) The City Accountant must be a citizen of  
37 the Philippines, a resident of the City of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a Certified  
38 Public Accountant and must have acquired experience in the treasury or accounting  
39 service for at least five (5) years immediately preceding the date of appointment.

40  
41 (b) The City Accountant shall receive compensation, emoluments and allowances  
42 as may be determined by law,  
43

1 (c) The City Accountant shall take charge of both the Accounting and Internal  
2 Audit Services, and shall:

3 (1) Install and maintain an internal audit system in the City

4 (2) Prepare and submit financial statements to the City Mayor and to the  
5 *Sangguniang Panlungsod*;

6 (3) Appraise the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and other officials on the financial  
7 condition and operations of the City;

8 (4) Certify the availability of budgetary allotment to which expenditures and  
9 obligations may be properly charged;

10 (5) Review supporting documents before the preparation of vouchers to  
11 determine completeness of requirements;

12 (6) Prepare statements of cash advances, liquidations, salaries, allowances,  
13 reimbursement and remittances pertaining to the City;

14 (7) Prepare statements of journal vouchers and their liquidations and other  
15 adjustments related thereto;

16 (8) Post individual disbursements to the subsidiary edger and index cards;

17 (9) Maintain individual ledgers for officials and employees of the City pertaining  
18 to payrolls and deductions;

19 (10) Record and post in index cards details of purchases furniture, fixtures and  
20 equipment, including disposal thereof, if any;

21 (11) Account for all issued requests for obligations and maintain and keep all  
22 records and reports related thereto;

23 (12) Prepare journals and the analysis of obligations and maintain and keep all  
24 records and reports related thereto; and

25 (13) Perform such the duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
26 provided for under the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and those  
27 that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

28  
29 **SEC. 30. *The City Budget Officer.*** – (a) The City Budget Officer must be a good  
30 citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of La Trinidad, of good moral character,  
31 a holder of a college degree preferably in accounting, economics, public administration,  
32 or any related course obtained from a recognized college or university, a first grade  
33 civil service eligible or its equivalent and must have acquired experience in government  
34 budgeting or in any related field for at least five (5) years immediately preceding the  
35 date of appointment.

36  
37 (b) The City Budget Officer shall receive compensation, emoluments and  
38 allowances as may be determined by law.

39  
40 (c) the City Budget Officer shall take charge of the City Budget Department, and  
41 shall:

42 (1) Prepare forms, order and circulars embodying instructions on budgetary and  
43 appropriation matters for signature of the City Mayor;



- 1 (2) Review and consolidate the budget proposals of different departments and  
2 offices of the City;
- 3 (3) Assist the City mayor in the preparation of the budget and during budget  
4 hearings;
- 5 (4) Study and evaluate budgetary implications of proposed legislation and  
6 submit comments and recommendations thereon;
- 7 (5) Submit periodic budgetary reports to the Department of Budget and  
8 Management (DBM);
- 9 (6) Coordinate with the City Treasurer, the City Accountant and the City Planning  
10 and Development Coordinator for the purpose of budgeting;
- 11 (7) Assist the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* in reviewing the approved budgets for  
12 the component barangays;
- 13 (8) Coordinate with the City Planning and Development Coordinator in the  
14 formulation of the development plan of the City; and
- 15 (9) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise other powers as  
16 provided under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and those  
17 that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

18  
19 **SEC. 31.** *The City Planning and Development Officer.* – (a) The City Planning  
20 and Development Officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of  
21 La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in urban  
22 planning, development studies, economics, public administration, or any related course  
23 obtained from a recognized college or university, a first grade civil service eligible and  
24 must have acquired experience in development planning or in any related field for at  
25 least five (5) years immediately preceding the date of appointment.

26  
27 (b) The City Planning and Development Officer shall receive compensation,  
28 emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

29  
30 (c) The city planning and Development Officer shall take charge of the City  
31 Planning and Development Coordinating Office, and shall:

- 32 (1) Formulate integrated economic, social, physical and other development plans  
33 and policies for consideration of the City;
- 34 (2) Conduct continuing studies, researches, and training programs necessary to  
35 evolve plans and programs for implementation;
- 36 (3) Integrate and coordinate all sectoral plans and studies undertaken by the  
37 different functional groups and agencies;
- 38 (4) Monitor and evaluate the implementation of the different development  
39 programs, projects and activities in the City in accordance with the approved  
40 development plan;
- 41 (5) Prepare comprehensive plans and other development planning documents  
42 for the consideration of the Local Development Council;

- 1 (6) Analyze the income and expenditure patterns, and formulate and  
2 recommend fiscal plans and policies for consideration of the finance committee  
3 of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*;  
4 (7) Promote people's participation in development planning within the City;  
5 (8) Exercise supervision and control over the secretariat of the Local  
6 Development Council; and  
7 (9) Perform such other functions and duties and exercise such other powers as  
8 provided for under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and  
9 those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

10  
11 **SEC. 32. *The City Engineer.*** —  
12

- 13 a. The City Engineer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City  
14 of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a licensed civil engineer and must  
15 have acquired experience in the practice of the profession for at least five (5)  
16 years immediately preceding the date of appointment.  
17 b. The City Engineer shall receive such compensation, emoluments and  
18 allowances as may be determined by law.  
19 c. The City Engineer shall take charge of the City Engineering Office, and shall:  
20 (1) Initiate, review and recommend changes in policies and objectives, plans  
21 and programs, techniques, procedures and practices in infrastructure  
22 development and public works in general of the City;  
23 (2) Advise the City Mayor on infrastructure, public works and other engineering  
24 matters.  
25 (3) Administer, coordinate, supervise and control the construction, maintenance,  
26 improvement and repair of roads, bridges, and other engineering and public  
27 works projects of the City;  
28 (4) Provide engineering services to the City, including investigation and survey,  
29 engineering designs, feasibility studies and project management; and  
30 (5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
31 may be provided for under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended,  
32 and those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.

33  
34 **SEC. 33. *The City Health Officer.*** —  
35

- 36 a. The City Health Officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the  
37 City of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a licensed medical practitioner  
38 that must have acquired experience in the practice of the profession for at least  
39 five (5) years immediately preceding the date of appointment.  
40  
41 b. The City Health Officer shall receive such compensation, emoluments and  
42 allowances as may be determined by law.  
43

1 c. The City Health Officer shall take charge of the Office of the Health Services, and  
2 shall:

3 (1) Supervise the personnel and staff of the said office, formulate program  
4 implementation guidelines and rules and regulations for the operation of the said  
5 office for the approval of the City Mayor in order to assist him in the efficient,  
6 effective and economical implementation of health service programs geared to  
7 implement health-related projects and activities;

8 (2) Formulate measures for the consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
9 and provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out  
10 activities to ensure the delivery of basic services and provision of adequate  
11 facilities relative to health services provided under Section 17 of the "Local  
12 Government Code of 1991", as amended;

13 (3) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor,  
14 implement these health programs and projects which the City Mayor is  
15 empowered to implement and which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is empowered  
16 to provide under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended;

17 (4) In addition to the foregoing duties and functions, the City Health Officer  
18 shall:

19 (i) Formulate and implement policies, plans and projects to promote the  
20 health of the people in the City;

21 (ii) Advise the City Mayor and the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* on matters  
22 pertaining to health;

23 (iii) Execute and enforce all laws, ordinances and regulations relating to  
24 public health;

25 (iv) Recommend to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* through the Local  
26 Health Board, the passage of the ordinance as may be deemed necessary  
27 for the preservation of public health;

28 (v) Recommend the prosecution of any violation of sanitary laws,  
29 ordinances and regulations;

30 (vi) Direct the sanitary inspection of all business establishments, stores  
31 selling food items or providing accommodations such as hotels, motels,  
32 lodging houses, pension house, and the like, in accordance with the  
33 Sanitation Code of the Philippines; and

34 (vii) Conduct health information campaigns and render health intelligence  
35 services;

36 (viii) Coordinate with other government agencies and nongovernment  
37 organizations involved in the promotion and delivery of health services;

38 (ix) Be in the frontline of the delivery of health services, particularly during  
39 and in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;  
40 and

41 (5) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
42 provided for under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and  
43 those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.  
44



1           **SEC. 34. The City Civil Registrar . —**  
2

- 3     a. The City Civil Registrar must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City  
4     of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree obtained from  
5     a recognized college or university, a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent  
6     and must have acquired experience in civil registry work for at least five (5) years  
7     immediately preceding the date of appointment.  
8
- 9     b. The City Civil Registrar shall receive such compensation, emoluments and  
10    allowances as may be determined by law.  
11
- 12    c. The City Civil Registrar shall be responsible for the civil registration program in the  
13    City of La Trinidad, pursuant to the Civil Registry Law, the Omnibus Election Code,  
14    and the other pertinent laws, rules and regulations issued to implement them.  
15
- 16    d. The City Civil registrar shall take charge of the City Civil Registry, and shall:  
17       (1) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor,  
18       implement the same, particularly those which have to do with the civil registry  
19       programs and projects which the City mayor is empowered to implement and  
20       which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is empowered to provide under the "Local  
21       Government Code of 1991", as amended.  
22       (2) In addition to the foregoing duties and functions, the City Civil Registrar  
23       shall.  
24           (i) Accept all registrable documents and judicial decrees affecting the civil  
25           status of persons;  
26           (ii) File, keep and preserve in a secure place the books required by law;  
27           (iii) Transcribe and enter immediately upon receipt all registrable  
28           documents and judicial decrees affecting the civil status of persons in the  
29           appropriate civil registry books;  
30           (iv) Transmit to the Office of the Civil Registrar-General within the  
31           prescribed period, duplicate copies of the registered documents required  
32           by law;  
33           (v) Issued certified transcripts or copies of any certificate or registered  
34           document upon payment of the required fees to the City Treasurer;  
35           (vi) Receive applications for the issuance of a marriage license and, after  
36           determining that the requirements and supporting certificates and  
37           publication thereof for the prescribed period have been complied with,  
38           issue the license upon payment of authorized fee to the City Treasurer;  
39           and  
40           (vii) Coordinate with the National Statistics Office in conducting  
41           educational campaigns for vital registration and assist in the preparation  
42           of demographic and other statistics for the City of La Trinidad.

1 (3) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
2 provided for the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and those that  
3 are prescribed by law or ordinance.  
4

5 **SEC. 35. The City Administrator —**  
6

7 a. The City Administrator must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City of  
8 La Trinidad, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree preferably in public  
9 administration, law or other related course obtained from a recognized college or  
10 university, a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent and must have acquired  
11 experience in management and administrative work for at least five (5) years  
12 immediately preceding the date of appointment.  
13

14 b. The term of the City Administrator is co-terminus with that of the appointing  
15 authority.  
16

17 c. The City Administrator shall receive compensation, emoluments and allowances as  
18 may be determined by law;  
19

20 d. The City Administrator shall take charge of the City Administrator's Office, and shall:  
21 (1) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof and upon approval  
22 thereof by the City Mayor, particularly those which have to do with the  
23 management and administration-related programs and projects which the City  
24 mayor is empowered to implement and which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is  
25 empowered to provide under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as  
26 amended;  
27 (2) Assist in the coordination of the work of all officials of the local government  
28 unit, under the supervision, direction and control of the City Mayor and, for this  
29 purpose, convene the chiefs of offices and other officials of the local government  
30 unit;  
31 (3) Establish and maintain a sound personnel program for the local government  
32 unit designed to promote career development and uphold the merit principle in  
33 the local government service;  
34 (4) Conduct a continuing organizational development of the local government  
35 unit with the end view of instituting effective administrative reforms;  
36 (5) Be in the frontline of the delivery of administrative support services,  
37 particularly those related to situations during and in the aftermath of man-made  
38 and natural disasters and calamities; and  
39 (6) Recommend the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and advise the City mayor on all  
40 matters relative to the management and administration of the City.  
41

42 (e) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
43 provided for the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and those that are  
44 prescribed by law or ordinance.

2       **SEC. 36. The City Legal Officer —**

- 4       a. The City Legal Officer must be a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the City  
5       of La Trinidad, of good moral character, a member of the Philippine Bar and

22 practice of social work for at least five (5) years immediately preceding the date of

25 b. The City Social Welfare and Development Officer shall receive compensation,  
26 emoluments and allowances as may be determined by law.

28 c. The City Social Welfare and Development Officer shall take charge of the Office of

38 (b) The City Cooperatives Officer shall receive compensation, emoluments and  
39 allowances as may be determined by law.

41 (c) The City Cooperatives Officer shall take charge of the Office for the  
42 Development of Cooperatives and shall:

43 (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
44 and provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out



1 measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and provision of facilities  
2 through the development of cooperatives and in providing access to such  
3 services and facilities;

37 allowances as may be determined by law.

39 (c) The City Population Officer shall take charge of the Office of Population  
40 Development and shall:

41 (1) Formulate measures for the consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*  
42 and provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out  
43 measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and provisions for adequate

1 facilities relative to the integration of the population development, principles and  
2 providing access to said services and facilities;

3 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor,  
4 implement these with the integration of population development principles and  
5 methods in programs and projects which the City Mayor is empowered to  
6 implement and which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod*;

7 (3) Assist the City Mayor in the implementation of the Constitutional provisions  
8 relative to population development and the promotion of responsible  
9 parenthood;

10 (4) Establish and maintain an updated data bank for program operations,

13 (5) Implement appropriate training programs responsive to the cultural heritage

21 Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and must have practiced the profession at least three (3)  
22 years immediately preceding the date of appointment.

24 (b) The City Veterinarian shall receive compensation, emoluments and  
25 allowances as may be determined by law.

27 (c) The City Veterinarian shall take charge of the Office of Veterinary Services,  
28 and shall:

29 (1) Formulate measures for consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and  
30 provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out  
31 measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and provision of adequate  
32 facilities;

33 (2) Develop plans and strategies, and upon approval thereof by the City mayor,  
34 implement the same, particularly those which have to do with veterinary-related  
35 activities which the City Mayor is empowered to implement and which the  
36 *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is empowered to provide;

37 (3) Advise the City Mayor on all matters pertaining to the slaughter of animals  
38 for human consumption and the regulation of slaughterhouses;

39 (4) Regulate the keeping of domestic animals;

40 (5) Regulate and inspect poultry, milk and dairy products for human  
41 consumption;

42 (6) Enforce all laws and regulations for the prevention of cruelty of animals;

43 (7) Take the necessary measures to eradicate, prevent or cure all forms of

1 (8) Be in the frontline veterinary-related activities, such as the outbreak of highly  
2 contagious and deadly diseases and in situations resulting in the depletion of  
3 animals for work and in human consumption, particularly those arising from and  
4 in the aftermath of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;  
5 (9) Recommend to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and advise the City Mayor on  
6 all matters relative to veterinary services which will increase the number and  
7 improve the quality of livestock, poultry and other domestic animal used for work

20 solid waste disposal, and general sanitation for at least five (5) years immediately  
21 preceding the date of appointment.

23 (b) The City General Services Officer shall receive compensation, emoluments  
24 and allowances as may be determined by law.  
25

26 (c) The City General Services Officer shall take charge of the Office of General  
27 Services, and shall:

29 (1) Formulate measures for consideration of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and  
30 provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out  
31 measures to ensure the delivery of basic services expertise and technical support  
32 services;

33 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor,  
34 implement these with the general services that are supportive of the welfare of  
35 the inhabitants of the City which the City Mayor is empowered to implement and  
36 which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is empowered to provide;

37 (3) Take custody of and be accountable for all properties, real or personal,  
38 owned by the City, and those granted to it in the form of donation, reparation,  
39 assistance and counterpart of joint projects;

40 (4) With the approval of the City Mayor, assign building or land space to local  
41 officials or other public officials, who by law, are entitled to space;

42 (5) Recommend to the City Mayor reasonable rental rates for local government  
43 properties, whether real or personal, which will be leased to public or private  
44 entities by the local government;

2 services in all local government public buildings and other real property, whether

30 (b) The City Agriculturist shall receive compensation, emoluments and  
31 allowances as may be determined by law.

33 (c) The City Agriculturist shall take charge of the Office for the Agricultural  
34 Services, and shall:

- 35  
36 (1) Formulate measures for the approval of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and  
37 provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor in carrying out  
38 measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and provision of adequate  
39 facilities relative to agricultural services;  
40 (2) Develop plans and strategies and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor,  
41 implement the same, particularly those which have to do with agricultural  
42 programs and projects which the City Mayor is empowered to implement and  
43 which the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* is empowered to provide;  
44 (3) In addition to the foregoing duties and functions, the agriculturist shall:

- 1 (i) Ensure that maximum assistance and access to resources in production,  
2 processing and marketing of agricultural and aqua-cultural and marine  
3 products are extended to farmers, fishermen and local entrepreneurs;  
4 (ii) Conduct or cause to be conducted location-specific agricultural  
5 researches and assist in making available the appropriate technology  
6 arising out of and disseminating information on basic research on crops,  
7 prevention and control of plant diseases and pests, and other agricultural  
8 matters which will maximize productivity;  
9 (iii) Assist the City Mayor in the establishment and extension services of  
10 demonstration farms of aqua-culture marine products;  
11 (iv) Enforce rules and regulations relating to agriculture and aqua-culture;  
12 and  
13 (v) Coordinate with government agencies and non-governmental  
14 organizations in the promotion of agricultural productivity through  
15 appropriate technology compatible with environmental integrity;  
16 (4) Be in the frontline of the delivery of basic agricultural services, particularly  
17 those needed for the survival of the inhabitants during and in the aftermath of  
18 man-made and natural disasters and calamities;  
19 (5) Recommend to the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* and advise the City Mayor on  
20 all matters related to agriculture and aquaculture which will improve the  
21 livelihood and living conditions of the inhabitants; and  
22 (6) Perform such other duties and functions and exercise such other powers as  
23 provided for under the "Local Government Code of 1991", as amended, and  
24 those that are prescribed by law or ordinance.  
25

26  
27 **CHAPTER VIII**  
28 **THE CITY FIRE STATION SERVICE, THE CITY JAIL SERVICE, THE CITY**  
29 **SCHOOL DIVISION AND CITY PROSECUTION SERVICE**  
30

31 **SEC. 46. *The City Fire Station Service.* –**  
32

33 (a) There shall be established in the City at least one (1) fire station with  
34 adequate personnel, firefighting facilities and equipment, subject to the standards,  
35 rules and regulations that may be promulgated by the Department of Interior and Local  
36 Government. The City shall provide the necessary land or site of the station.  
37

38 (b) The City Fire Station Service shall be headed by a City Fire Marshal whose  
39 qualifications shall be as those provided for under Republic Act No. 9263, as amended  
40 otherwise known as the "Bureau of Fire Protection and Bureau of Jail Management and  
41 Penology Professionalization Act of 2004".  
42

43 (c) The City Fire Station shall be responsible for the protection and various  
44 emergency services such as reduce and evacuation of injured people at fire-related

1 incidents and, in general fire prevention and suppression measures to secure the safety  
2 of life and property of the citizenry.

3  
4 **SEC. 47. *The City Jail Service.* –**

5  
6 (a) There shall be established and maintained in the City, a secured, clean,  
7 adequately equipped and sanitary jail for the custody and safekeeping of prisoners, any  
8 fugitive from justice, or person detained awaiting investigation or trial and or transfer  
9 to the national penitentiary, and/or violent mentally ill person who endangers himself  
10 or the safety of others, surly certified as such by the proper medical health officer,  
11 pending the transfer to a mental institution.

12  
13 (b) The City Jail Service shall be headed by a City Jail Warden whose qualifications  
14 shall be as those provided for under the Bureau of Fire Protection and Bureau of Jail  
15 Management and Penology Professionalization Act of 2004. One shall assist in the  
16 immediate rehabilitation of individuals or detention prisoners. The City Jail Warden shall  
17 ensure that great care is exercised at all times so that human rights prisoners are  
18 respected and protected, and their spiritual and physical well-being are properly and  
19 promptly attended to.

20  
21 **SEC. 48. *The City School Division.* –**

22  
23 There shall be established and maintained by the Department of Education (DepEd), a  
24 city schools division of the City of La Trinidad whose area of jurisdiction will cover all  
25 the schools districts within the City.

26  
27 The City School Division shall be headed by a City Schools Division Superintendent who  
28 must possess the necessary qualifications required by the Department of Education.

29  
30 **SEC. 49. *The City Protection Service.* –**

31  
32 There shall be established in the City, a prosecution service to be headed by a  
33 City Prosecutor and be organizationally part of the Department of Justice  
34 (DOJ), and under the supervision and control of the Secretary of Justice and  
35 whose qualifications, manner of appointment, rank, salary, and benefits shall  
36 be governed by existing laws covering prosecutors of DOJ.

37  
38 The City Prosecutor shall handle the criminal prosecution in the municipal trial  
39 courts in the City as well as in the regional trial courts for criminal cases  
40 originating in the territory of the City, and shall render to or for the City such  
41 services as required by law, ordinance or regulation of the DOJ.

42  
43 The Secretary of Justice shall always ensure the adequacy and the quality of  
44 prosecution service in the City and, for this purpose, shall, in the absence, lack or



1 insufficiency in number of assistant city prosecutors as provided herein-above,  
2 designate from among the assistant provincial prosecutors a sufficient number to  
3 perform and discharge the functions of the city prosecution service as provided herein-  
4 above.

5  
6  
7 **CHAPTER IX**  
8 **TRANSITORY AND FINAL PROVISIONS**  
9

10 **SEC. 50.** *Municipal Ordinance Existing at the time of Approval of this Act.* – The  
11 City of La Trinidad shall, unless otherwise provided for by law, continue to be under  
12 the jurisdiction of the Province of Benguet.

13  
14 **SEC. 51.** *Jurisdiction of the Province of Benguet.* – The City of La Trinidad shall,  
15 unless otherwise provided for by law, continue to be under the jurisdiction of the  
16 Province of Benguet.

17  
18 **SEC. 52.** *Suspension of Increase in Rates of Local Taxes.* – No increase in the  
19 rates of local taxes shall be imposed by the City within a period of five (5) years from  
20 its acquisition of corporate existence.

21  
22 **SEC. 53.** *Legislative District.* – Until otherwise provided for by law, the City of La  
23 Trinidad shall continue to be part of the First District of Benguet.

24  
25 **SEC. 54.** *Applicability of Laws.* – The provisions of Republic Act No. 7160,  
26 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended, and such laws  
27 as are applicable to the component cities shall govern the City of La Trinidad in so far  
28 as they are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

29  
30 **SEC. 55.** *Plebiscite.* – The City of La Trinidad shall acquire corporate existence  
31 upon the ratification of its creation by a majority of votes cast by the qualified voters  
32 in a plebiscite to be conducted in the present Municipality of La Trinidad within sixty  
33 (60) days from the approval of this Act. The expenses for such plebiscite shall be borne  
34 by the Municipality of La Trinidad. The Commission on Elections shall conduct and  
35 supervise the plebiscite.

36  
37 **SEC. 56.** *Officials of the City of La Trinidad.* – The present elective officials of the  
38 Municipality of La Trinidad shall continue to exercise their powers functions until such  
39 time that a new election is held and the duly-elected officials shall have already qualified  
40 and assumed their offices. The appointive officials and employees of the Municipality  
41 of La Trinidad shall likewise continue exercising their functions and duties and they  
42 shall be automatically absorbed by the City Government of La Trinidad.  
43

1           **SEC. 57. Election of Provincial Governor and Sangguniang Panlalawigan Members**  
2 *of the Province of Benguet.* – The qualified members of the City of La Trinidad shall  
3 qualify to vote and run for any elective position in the elections for Provincial Governor,  
4 Provincial Vice Governor, Sangguniang Panlalawigan members and other elective  
5 offices for the Province of Benguet.

6  
7           **SEC. 58. Reservation.** – Nothing herein contained shall preclude the  
8 determination by the appropriate agency or forum of boundary disputes or cases  
9 involving questions of territorial jurisdiction between the City of La Trinidad and any of  
10 the adjoining local government units even after the effectivity of this Act.

11  
12           **SEC. 59. Succession Clause.** – The City of La Trinidad shall success to all the  
13 assets, properties, liabilities, and obligations of the Municipality of La Trinidad.

14  
15           **SEC. 60. Separability Clause.** – If, for any reason or reasons, any part of provision  
16 of this Charter shall be held unconstitutional, invalid or inconsistent with the Local  
17 Government Code of 1991, as amended, the other parts or provisions hereof which are  
18 not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

19  
20           **SEC. 61. Repealing Clause.** – All other laws, decrees, rules and regulations or  
21 parts thereof contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby  
22 repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

23  
24           **SEC. 62. Effectivity.** – This Act shall take effect upon its publication in at least  
25 two (2) newspapers of general and local circulation.
