# AN ACT DECLARING THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN LEYTE A TOURISM ZONE

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Section 2, Chapter I of Republic Act No. 9593 or *The Tourism Act of 2009*, provides that, "*The State declares tourism as an indispensable element of the national economy and an industry of national interest and importance, which must be harnessed as an engine of socio-economic growth and cultural affirmation to generate investment, foreign exchange, and employment, and to continue to mold an enhanced sense of national pride for all Filipinos."* 

In terms of tourism potential, the Province of Southern Leyte has a lot to exhibit, sell, develop, and enhance. It is home of the tallest bridge in the Philippines, zip lines, wall/column, cable car/lift experiences, as well as world-class dive sites, caves, extreme adventure sites, waterfalls, safaris, river trekking, crater lake trekking, fish feeding, rain forest tramping, scuba diving and whale shark interaction, island escapades, beach fun, and religious journeys. The beautiful tourist destinations such as Taglinao Falls, Bird Sanctuary and Mangrove Site, Crater Lake, Fatima Hills, and Guinsaugon are also situated in the province of Southern Leyte. The historical Limasawa, site of the first Christian Mass and considered the birthplace of Christianity in the Philippines is also located in Southern Leyte. However, economic development has stalled due to lack of infrastructure; the province's road networks should be upgraded.

This bill therefor seeks to declare the Province of Southern Leyte as a Tourism Zone to prioritize further development of the province for tourism. This will not just increase the number of tourists visiting the province, but will also provide livelihood to its constituents.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is respectfully sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** The Province of Southern Leyte is hereby declared a tourism zone. Pursuant thereto, its development as a viable host for the visitor economy shall be prioritized and supported by the Department of Tourism (DOT), subject to the rules and regulations governing the development of tourism zones.

**SEC. 2**. Within one (1) year after the approval of this Act, the provincial government of Southern Leyte shall, in coordination with the DOT, Department of Public Works and Highways, Department of Environment and Natural Resources and concerned agencies of the government, prepare a tourism development plan providing for the development, maintenance, improvement and restoration of tourism sites, where appropriate, in conformity with set standards, including the construction of hotels, resorts, restaurants, recreational facilities and other appropriate facilities and infrastructure to enhance tourism in the area: *Provided*, That said development plan shall ensure the preservation of the ecological balance and natural beauty of the area: *Provided*, *further*, That the implementation of the tourism development plan shall be included in the budget of the provincial government of Southern Leyte.

**SEC. 3.** The DOT shall assist the provincial government of Southern Leyte in the implementation of the tourism development plan by providing technical assistance in tourism capacity building. It shall also include the Province of Southern Leyte in its national and regional promotion programs.

- **SEC. 4.** The funding for the implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual budget of the provincial government of Southern Leyte. The DOT may augment such allocation with internally-generated funds.
- **SEC. 5.** Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the provincial government of Southern Leyte shall, in consultation with the DOT and concerned agencies of the government, promulgate rules and regulations to implement this Act.
- **SEC. 6**. All laws, rules, regulations, executive orders, proclamations, presidential decrees and other issuances inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby deemed repealed or amended accordingly.
- SEC. 7. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
