AN ACT CONSTITUTING THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC CONSULTATIVE AND ADVISORY COUNCIL

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. — It is the policy of the State to formulate after consultations with appropriate public agencies, the private sector, and local government units socioeconomic development programs in accordance with its constitutional mandate to promote a more equitable distribution of opportunities, income, and wealth; a sustained increase in the amount of goods and services produced by the nation for the benefit of the people; and an expanding productivity as the key to raising the quality of life for all, especially the underprivileged.

The State shall promote industrialization and full employment based on sound agricultural development and agrarian reform, through industries that make full and efficient use of human and natural resources, and which are competitive in both domestic and foreign markets. However, the State shall protect Filipino enter-

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National Economic Consultative and Advisory Council. - Pursuant to the foregoing policy, there is hereby constituted a consultative and advisory body to be known as the National Economic Consultative and Advisory Council, hereinafter referred to as the Council. It shall be composed of twenty (20) members, with the President of the Philippines as Chairman and the following as members: the Vice-President of the Philippines, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, seven (7) Members of the Cabinet to be designated by the President of the Philippines, three (3) Members of the Senate to be designated by the President of the Senate, three (3) Members of the House of Representatives to be designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives at least one (1) of whom shall come from the dominant minority party, and the following to be appointed by the President of the Philippines: a representative of the local government units, a representative of the youth, and a representative of the private sector from any or a combination of the following: business, cooperatives, agriculture, and labor.

Membership in the Council of the Members of Congress shall be considered an extension of their legislative

- 2 Cabinet shall be in an ex officio capacity.
- 3 The Chairman and members of the Council who are
- 4 government officials shall serve without any additional
- 5 emoluments, allowances, or pay.
- 6 SEC. 3. Functions of the Council. The Council
- 7 shall serve as a consultative and advisory body to the
- 2 President as the head of the national economic and planning
- 9 agency for further consultations and advice on certain programs
- 10 and policies essential to the realization of the goals of the national
- 11 economy with the following functions:
- 12 (a) To recommend socioeconomic development
- 13 goals which shall guide in the formulation and implementation of
- 14 continuing, integrated, and coordinated plans and programs for
- 15 national development;
- 16 (b) To facilitate the integration of regional development
- 17 plans and programs into the comprehensive national development
- 18 plan that will be formulated by national government agencies;
- 19 (c) To receive reports on and cause the study of
- 20 measures to improve the implementation of all official
- 2 development assistance from multilateral and bilateral

entities;
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- (d) To review the major economic programs of the Government as well as the relationship of the legislative agenda to the national development plan to facilitate the integration of both; and
- (e) To provide policy advice to the President and to Congress on vital issues affecting the socioeconomic development of the country.
- SEC. 4. Secretariat. The National Economic Consultative and Advisory Council shall have the National Economic and Development Authority Secretariat as the principal secretariat in providing staff support to the Council, assisted by personnel from the Presidential Management Staff and the economic planning staff of both the Senate and the House of Representatives.
- SEC. 5. Meetings of the Council. The Council shall meet at least once every quarter, but may be convened for special meetings as may be deemed necessary upon the call of its Chairman. The Council members shall be duly notified of any meeting in advance. The first meeting of the Council shall take place within one (1) month from the

- effectivity of this Act at a time and place to be designated
 by its Chairman.
- SEC. 6. Priority Concerns. The Council shall give special attention to measures which shall:

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- (a) Involve relevant nongovernment groups and people's organizations in the processes of economic planning by national agencies and by regional, provincial, and other local development councils, as well as in monitoring the implementation of development projects;
- (b) Bring about effective integration of the priority development programs and projects proposed by the regional, provincial, and other local development councils into the national development program within the constraints of the national budget;
- (c) Accelerate the study and formulation of projects and programs which shall answer the priority needs of the people for livelihood and social services, that may be funded from national revenues and/or grants and concessional loans from external sources; and
- (d) Hasten the utilization of grants and concessional loans for priority development projects and programs.

1	SEC. 7. Implementing Rules and Regulations
2	Within sixty (60) days from the approval of this Act, the
3	Council shall promulgate all the necessary rules and regulations for
4	the effective implementation of this Act.
5	SEC. 8. Appropriations The amount of Two mil-
6	lion five hundred thousand pesos (\$\mathbb{P}2,500,000) needed
7	to initially carry out the provisions of this Act shall be
8	charged against the Contingent Fund. Thereafter, such
9	sums as may be necessary for the operation and maintenance of
10	the Council shall be included in the annual General
11	Appropriations Act.
12	SEC. 9. Separability Clause Any provision of this
13	Act which may be declared unconstitutional shall not affect
14	the remaining provisions hereof.
15	SEC. 10. Repealing Clause All laws and executive
16	orders which are inconsistent with the provisions of this
17	Act are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
18	SEC. 11. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect
19	upon its publication in two (2) newspapers of genera
20	circulation.
